Section I - Issues

The stations have identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

<u>A. FACING HOMELESSNESS</u> – The far-reaching and ongoing effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and the, at times, oppressive economy have strained everyone- particularly the lower-middle class. Here in western Kentucky, we have seen uptick in the number of homeless in the area. Our shelters are overwhelmed. They're simply aren't enough beds for the people who need them. This is a population that's routinely dismissed and overlooked. To foster assistance, several area shelters have "recruited" local officials, celebrities and media personalities to survive being homeless for 48 hours. The mission? To spread awareness about what it truly means to be homeless and just how difficult it is to find the necessary resources to break the cycle.

B. ANIMAL CONTROL & RESCUE – As employment (and unemployment) issues and inflation continue to drain bank accounts of families here in Indiana and Kentucky, the Tri-State's Animal Control and non-profit shelters are being inundated with animals that local pet owners can no longer afford to care for. Some local animal lovers, in their desire to "help" are housing many more animals than they should and are creating "hoarding" situations. In the last few months, there have been several instances in the area where these types of situations have been discovered. The startling fact is this. What was supposed to be helping, isn't helping at all. And many of those animals are being rescued and sent to local shelters, which are already overwhelmed with surrendered pets.

<u>C. CHILDREN'S LEARNING</u> – Through regular student testing, primary education systems in Indiana, Kentucky and Illinois are discovering that the "processes" of education don't always result in students actually learning and retaining what they're being taught. There's no question COVID school shutdowns and "viral learning" have disrupted the learning curves for many students. Education professionals in all three states are working to improve the way students are being taught subject matter and how they're retaining it for future use.

D. PAIN MANAGEMENT WITHOUT OPIOIDS – The tristate area, most specifically Kentucky, is consistently rated the home of some of the highest occurrences of drug addiction in the America. Government and medical officials are studying and implementing ways to combat the drug-culture that exists by instituting and approving more facilities that offer alternatives to pain management outside of prescription drugs.

<u>E: YOUR DIET IS SLOWLY KILLING YOU</u> – Although Evansville, Indiana has worked very hard to lose the recentlyassigned moniker of "The Fattest City in America", heavily processed foods are still abundant and readily available for families on the go. Healthcare officials are reminding parents (and their children) that such items continue to be a detriment to public health. In addition to creating awareness about the hazards of a "fatty" diet, health officials have also been promoting the benefits of healthy eating. They're working with local farmers, food markets and restaurants to help put raw and less processed foods into the diets of our citizens.
