April 6, 2016 6:10am (60 sec) A predatory sex offender disconnected his ankle monitor. Law enforcement throughout the region is now looking for 42-year-old Justin Lampke. He is on post-prison supervision for Sexual Abuse and Attempted Sodomy convictions. Lampke is described as a white male, 5'7", 160 pounds. He has longish brown hair and was last seen wearing dark sweat pants, a blue polo-type shirt and a jacket. Anyone with information on his whereabouts should call 911 immediately.

April 11, 2016 7:10am (60 seconds) Authorities arrested Lampke in Seattle on Sunday. He will be returned to Oregon where he is expected to serve time for violating parole.

April 2016 7:20am (1:30min) Bend City Councilors stopped short of formally rejecting a zoning change for Troy Field, and are expected to make a final decision at its meeting on May fourth. The Bend-La Pine School District owns the downtown property and wants to sell it to pay for needed school projects. The potential buyer from Portland wants to build a hotel on the lot, but a zoning change is needed to allow for construction. There are nostalgic community members that want to keep it as a field.

April 12, 2016 6:35am (2 min 45 sec) Healthy Beginnings Ben and Jerry's FREE CONE DAY noon-8pm. We talked about how we were celebrity scoopers for this fundraising event but no longer participate as a scooping team because Ron got carpal tunnel the last time he scooped ice cream. All donations collected will go to Healthy Beginnings. Healthy Beginnings provides the most comprehensive assessment and referral service in the community, confirming the health and development of young children birth to age five at no cost to the family. The screenings are designed for all families with young children. This program helped my son Chase with hearing and vision issues when he was 3 and 5 years old.

April 14, 2016 7:10am 9:50am (2 1/2 minutes) In Sisters, the Deschutes County Sheriff's Office has received a number of calls in the past week, regarding a man filming citizens. He posts his videos on YouTube under the handle "FedSmoker." He is making people feel uncomfortable and concerned for their safety. Lots of profanity and calls people baby killers. His real name is Conald Peterson. Peterson is a transient. He isn't breaking the law. However, police are asking that you call in if you see any suspicious activity or activity that they believe is criminal in nature or possibly where the public is in danger. He is on his way to bend.

April 14, 2016 7:10am (3 Minutes) Taxes are not due April 15 this year. There's a holiday called Emancipation day that's celebrated in Washington D.C. This year people are going to have a few more days to actually do their tax return and file it by Monday, April 18. Emancipation Day marks the release of 3100 slaves in Washington D.C. by Abraham Lincoln in 1862. Saturday, April 30 – Trial starts at 10am.

May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2016 7:35am (3 minutes) Doctors and caregivers from St Charles health system will gather at the Tower Theatre Thursday evening, for a presentation on patient safety. Author Sorrel King will speak about her book detailing the death of her young daughter, due to a preventable medical error. St Charles CEO Joe Sluka says he hopes the public will attend, and help keep hospitals accountable for the care they provide. Thursday's event is free but requires a ticket. We talked about a recent stat where there are over 250 thousand medical hospital errors every year. May 10, 2016 8:10am (1:30min) The Department of Transportation is updating advisory speed signs on curves. According to ODOT, new technology has provided more accurate readings of how fast people should drive on many of Oregon's roads. Previous systems gave readings 10-15 miles an hour slower. 50 to 75 percent of the states curve warning signs will change over the next three to four years.

May 18, 2016 7:10am 7:20am We talked about drivers using the roundabout at Reed Market Road and 15<sup>th</sup> street getting some help to avoid getting stuck in line behind a train. When a train crosses Reed Market Road now, a signal is sent to electric signs posted for drivers approaching the roundabout from the north, south and east. June 7<sup>th</sup>, 2016 7:20am (2:30 min) 8:10am Another deadly accident on Hwy 97 in Madras has many people concerned about road safety in the area. Lynette Gray has been working on improving this stretch of highway for years and wants to turn Hwy 97 between Madras and Terrebonne into a safety corridor. That would mean drivers could not drive faster than 55 miles per hour. Jefferson County Commissioners and ODOT plan to meet Wednesday at 3:30 to discuss safety issues

at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds. Listeners talked about distracted drivers being the problem more than the speed.

June 7th, 2016 7:10am 8:35am (2:10 min) Whitewater safety is the topic concerning Bend's new whitewater park. There is a local Mom trying to warn others it's not a gentle ride down the Deschutes. Angie Neumaier says several of her kids were tossed out of tubes and kayaks in the class 1 and class 2 rapids. No one was injured, but she's worried there are not enough signs explaining how rough it is. After sharing her story on social media, she says she's heard from other parents with similar experiences. We discussed spending all the money to create the whitewater park and how it's still not working out.

June 7th, 2016 9:20am (1:30 min) Emergency responders throughout the northwest are put to the test as the four day Cascadia Rising Earthquake Drill begins today. The exercise is based on The Big One predicted to hit in the next 50 years. Police, fire and government agencies in Oregon, Washington and Idaho will take part. St Charles Health systems Central Oregon Hospitals expect to participate in Thursdays portion of the drill. Talked about our radio responsibility in the information relay and what our plan would be. I'm more concerned about it that Ron, So disregard ☐

June 8, 2016 7:10am 7:20am (2min) Bend Parks and Recreation is responding to concerns from a number of first time whitewater park visitors who say there are not enough safety signs, especially noting the dangers to small children. The organization is taking all the feedback and may make changes to warning signs at the river. They urge parents and children to know their abilities and consider getting out prior to the rapids. Pool equipment is not safe for use in that part of the river.

June 8, 2016 7:35am (2 min) Speeds on Oregon's Highways increased to 65 miles per hour 3 months ago, but the Oregon Department of Transportation is now lowering them in some areas in Central Oregon. Speeds will be reduced to 55 miles per hour on Hwy 97 between Madras and Terrebonne, near LaPine and on Hwy 20 east from Bend to Dodds Road. The change will last for one year. Then ODOT will decide whether to make it permanent.

June 10th, 2016 7:10am (1:30 min) Fire update. The Akawana Fire southwest of Lake Billy Chinook has charred more than 21 hundred acres and forced residents in the Three Rivers and nearby subdivisions to prepare for possible evacuations. Campfire bans are in effect. More than two thousand lightning strikes in the last couple of days.

June 10<sup>th</sup>, 2016 7:10am (1:30 min) Bend Parks and Rec has closed the passageway channel of it's whitewater park after recent safety complaints. It will remain closed for the summer while they evaluate what can be done to make it safer. The whitewater channel will remain open. It's not family friendly.

June 20, 2016 7:20 (2 min) Friends and coworkers of a Redmond man seriously injured in an off road vehicle accident last weekend are helping with medical bills. Wildhorse Harley Davidsons Kelly Maurizio says, "Ryan Rojas is a friend and coworker. He had a UTV accident on Father's Day and he does have a long road of recovery ahead of him." The 24-year-old is now in a medically induced coma following several surgeries, at St. Charles Medical Center.

There are several fundraising efforts underway, including a Go Fund Me page and a charity motorcycle ride. "A few guys in the shop are setting out on July third, they're going to a 1,000-mile ride in 24 hours. You can sponsor them per mile or do just a flat donation." There is also a Krispy Kreme fundraiser, with delivery planned for Thursday. We chatted and shared on Facebook. Also bought a couple of boxes of dunuts.

June 21, 2016 7:20am (2:20 min) Bend Police says bike thefts are down, thanks to a number of prevention measures implemented over the past year.

After the number of bikes stolen from inside city limits jumped by nearly 50-percent from 2014 to 2015, the department formed the Central Oregon Bike Theft Task Force, with help from other area police agencies. They also used "Bait bike" sting operations to arrest more than a dozen suspected thieves.

Police suggest registering your bike with [BikeIndex.org](http://BikeIndex.org), use a high-quality bike lock, and report bike theft immediately.

June 23, 2016 7:35am (2min) Oregon's Department of Corrections is hosting a unique recruiting event on Saturday, in an effort to hire at least five new correctional officers for Deer Ridge Prison in Madras. Steve Cox, with the DOC, tells KBND News, "The whole purpose of this is to bring prospective applicants in where they can sit down and do their NEOGOV application, take the proficiency testing, have an interview that day and, if selected, sit down with a background investigator by the end of the day. This is the first time we've ever done this as an agency."

Applicants must be U.S. citizens at least 21-years-old with a high school diploma or GED. They also must be able to pass a criminal background check and health screening. There is no experience necessary. Deer Ridge Correctional Institution, Saturday at 9 a.m., and could last as long as 12 hours; lunch and dinner are provided.

June 25<sup>th</sup>, 2016 7:20 am FRIDAY UPDATE: According to Oregon State Police, Richard Clark was apprehended at about 1 p.m., Friday. He is now lodged in the Multnomah County Jail in Portland. No other information has been released.

An inmate from the Deer Ridge Correctional Institution, in Madras, walked away from a work crew near Sisters, Thursday afternoon. Officials say 29-year-old Richard Clark was last seen just before 2 p.m.

He is white, 6', 205-pounds; with brown hair and blue eyes. He was last seen wearing blue jeans and a blue t-shirt with the word "Inmate" and the DOC logo stenciled in orange on the front.

Clark was in prison for attempted robbery out of Washington County, and has been in custody since March 31, 2016. His earliest release date was to be in June of 2019. Anyone with information on his whereabouts is asked to call Oregon State Police at 800-452-7888. Chatted about him having a GREAT smile!

June 27, 2016 7:10am (2 min) Visitors to downtown Bend again have a clean place to "go." The public restrooms in the lobby of the parking garage were closed about a year ago due to a lack of oversight. Downtown Bend Business Association Director Rod Porsche says there were problems with drug use, vandalism and transients camping inside the bathrooms. "The idea that these were closed really put a strain on our downtown businesses. A lot of our retailers are simply not set up – they don't have ADA compliant restrooms. It wasn't a big deal for the restaurants and bars; but, during the day, it really impacted our retailers." The set-up is temporary, for now. The DBBA will re-evaluate in six months and decide whether to continue its oversight of the restrooms.

June 28, 2016 7:20 am (3 min) Matt Bassit from NW Home Loans was in to chat about award winning documentary at the Tower Theater July 2<sup>nd</sup>. Thank You For Your Service - June 30<sup>th</sup> (Thursday) at 6pm. (doors open at 5pm) The screening is a fundraiser for the Save A Warrior Project – a unique program that serves veterans suffering from post traumatic stress. June 28, 2016 8:10am (2min) Gun sales in Oregon have skyrocketed since the mass shooting in Orlando. In the weeks following the attack, they reached nearly 3 times the daily average. State police data shows 573 guns were sold the day of the shooting, but 5 days later, nearly 14 hundred guns were sold in just one day. Fear of gun restrictions contributes to the spike in sales, because of the talk of gun control legislation that often follows a mass shooting.

June 28, 2016 7:10 am (2:20 min) Bend City officials are trying to give fair warning to those likely to be most impacted by the 2 mile sewer project on 27<sup>th</sup> street. Work begins in July and could last up to two years. It's part of the Southeast Interceptor project, designed to increase sewer capacity. A second meeting will be this Thursday at 6 pm at the Desert Streams Church at 27<sup>th</sup> and Bear Creek Road. Listeners shared how this will be a cluster hairball for them.

June 29, 2016 7:35am (1:45 min) Crews will continue to work on a major highway construction project south of Bend, over Fourth of July weekend. The Oregon Department of Transportation shutdown one southbound lane from Romaine Village to Lava Butte, in order to install a new concrete median.

June 30, 2016 7:20am (2 min) A day after notifying drivers that SB Hwy 97 would remain one lane through the busy holiday weekend due to construction, ODOT announces change of plans. Officials now say both north and southbound will be reduced to one lane, with the center lane reserved to serve whichever direction is more congested. The change impacts drivers between Romaine Village and Lava Butte, where crews are installing a new center median.
