Saturday Night at the Opera: "Fernando," (1732) by G.F. Handel (1685 – 1759) It's a story of misplaced love, rebellion, treachery and rivalry and strife within families. Fernando, re di Castiglia was never completed, and therefore doesn't appear in the traditional lists of Handel's operas. Originally set in medieval Portugal, Handel went on to rework the music in this political thriller, and renamed it Sosarme, changing the setting, names of characters, and some of the music.
