FBI investigating origin of a bomb found in a Waynesville apartment. The price of school lunches is set to increase. Election officials are preparing for run-off elections for school board

July11, 2022

Three Haywood drug traffickers receive major sentences of 360 months total, Request by Haywood County to swap Russ Avenue upgrade for South main Street Renovation

July 12, 2022

Canton has added a canine officer to their staff. Haywood is offering a forty thousand dollar a year salary for starting law officers, Asheville police report the death of a 24 year old Asheville woman was caused by multiple gunshot wounds Sunday Morning

July 13, 2022

The Governor has signed the republican proposed budget for the coming year, 1600 people in Haywood County are late with their power boils and Duke Power announced their electrical service will be shut off this weekend

July 14, 2022

Representative Mike Clampitt has called for a meeting with local elected officials to discuss a proposal to merge city and county fire departments, local officials have announced plans to not attend, Floods in East Tennessee have forced portions of the national park to close

July 15, 2022

Macon County Sherriff Robbie Holland's offices are investigating the death of a woman shot by her estranged wife and holed up at a local motel. TWASA is raising water rates in Jackson County, Haywood County schools are implementing software on school provided lap top computers to detect words associated with bullying

July 18, 2022

A Sylva police officer has resigned after having been shown to have used excessive force in making arrests, A seventy year old man with likely dementia has been found at Surfside Beach with his granddaughter. All are ok. Local Board of Election officials have refused a Republican request to scrutinize signatures on absentee ballots

July 19, 2022

A Haywood county man has been arrested and charges with five counts of statutory rape and is under a two and a half million dollar bond, A truck and two cars burned on Interstate Forty after being involved in a wreck what caused traffic to be blocked for a half of a day

July 20, 2022

A rash of car breaking in has resulted in the Haywood County Sheriff's office to urge people to lock their cars when exiting them in a public place, The President of the North Carolina Community System is stepping down after pressure increased concerning his incompetence

July 21, 2022

A Greenville South Carolina man is facing murder charges after the body of his four and a half year old sister was found in a garbage bag. Mainspring Conservation Trust received the Governor's Conservation Award

July 22, 2022

Buncombe County has reported their first case of monkey pox, the Greenbriar section of the Great Smokies National Park is closed as a result of massive flooding

July 25, 2022

A 25-year-old firefighter from Macon County died in Nantahala as the result of a four wheeler accident, A thirty year old man is in serious condition after a fall while trying to take a selfie at Looking Glass falls

July 26, 2022

A person attempting to steal items from a store in Winston Salem was stopped by employees. When he returned with a weapon and started shooting he was stopped and arrested. The contractor on the Sugar Hill bridge project in I-40 has defaulted and is expected to delay the project's completion for a year

July 27, 2022

The run-off elections in Graham and Jackson Counties split, The Graham county incumbent Sherriff lost and the Jackson County incumbent school board member won against a radical.

July 28, 2022

The canvas roof at the Cherokee Fairgrounds has ripped leading the tribe to create a whole new plan to rebuild the entire facility. The Waynesville Inn Golf Course has been shut down by the state due to sediment entering the creek from the renovation to the course project

July 29, 2022

A Macon County youth was experimenting with a Chemistry set when he mixed two chemicals that exploded and causing him to be burned over more than fifty percent on his body. He is being treated at the August Burn Center. Republicans are pressuring a Federal Judge to reinstate a 20 week ban on abortions in North Carolina till they can pass legislation to shorten the term

August 01, 2022

Volunteers are being sought for the Hands on Jackson project happening in October. Two people died after falling from a local waterfall. A man followed a girls into a restroom in Macon County, there was no harm done, the man said he wandered into the bathroom unknowingly

August 02, 2022

Two persons died in the Nantahala National Forest last week, one in a car wreck the other fell from a waterfall, Macon County has voted to move forward with the construction of a new high school

August 03, 2022

Dr Douglas Gates is the recipient of the Harris Hospital Orchid Award presented to the person for outstanding Service and Leadership

August 04, 2022,

A person died on the Blue Ridge Parkway on Tuesday after losing control of his motorcycle which then crashed into a tree, a drunk student from WCU lost control of his car at a high rate of speed, hit a tree and sailed into the Tuckasegee River. The driver and a passenger were taken to the hospital with minor injuries

August 05, 2022,

Jackson County Schools announced plans for a public school back to school bash with numerous items for school students including the opportunity fir immunizations. Sylva has announced plans to review their ordinance for short term rentals,

August 08, 2022

The body of a Knoxville was found in a remote section of the park after being missing for several days. No foul play is suspected. All Jackson County School Resource officers will be wearing body cameras next school year

August 09, 2022

The Madison County School Board has authorized the installation of a gun safe at six schools to provide military weapons and ammo in case of a school intrusion and threats to students.

August 10, 2022

The state has set aside \$23 million for rural North Carolina for internet providers to increase wifi service into those counties. Jackson County Deputy Shawn Bryson is dead after a long battle with cancer

August 11, 2022

A 26 year old Macon County man will spend life in prison after pleading guilty to the murder of his three month old son. Area COVID 19 numbers are again trending upward. There are cases of Monkey Pox in Haywood and Buncombe counties but none in Jackson County

August 12, 2022

The fire which destroyed High Hampton Inn over the weekend has been turned over to the State Fire Marshall's Office. The investigation continues into the death of a Knoxville man whose body was found in a remote section of the park last week

August 15, 2022

Due to the teacher shortage some individuals are being enlisted to teach even though they do not have a degree. The Eastern Band of the Cherokee Indians has expanded their funding to \$39 million to construct a hotel at Sequoyah Golf Course

August 16, 2022

Haywood County School Superintendent following the resignation of Bill Nolte, indications are that an internal promotion might be used to fill the position. The US Department of Justice has granted the 30th Judicial District a million dollars to train law officers on Youth in Crisis

August 17, 2022

The Great Smoky Mountains National Park Officials announced they will be implementing a parking fee next March for people using parking areas in the park for more than fifteen minutes. The local community is opposed due to the original language in the land for park designation

August 18, 2022

DNA proved the father of a child born last year to an adolescent girl was Shawn Standingdeer who is 26 years old. He fathered the child after impregnating a foster child girl staying at his residence. Sylva has voted to purchase a half round for a skate park in Sylva

August 19, 2022

There has been a 25% increase in COVID cases in Jackson County in the last month. Joshua Le Perkins has been charged with 18 counts of child exploitations and is in prison under \$490,000 bond

August 22, 2022

Four Macon County citizens were injured when their vehicle crashed between a bridge embankment and into the road under the bridge. Cruso residents held a Memorial Service for those who died in the Hurricane Fred disaster last year

August 23, 2022

Haywood County announced that masks will not be required for students when they return to school but will be facing more live and artificial training in case if a school shooter issue. The Haywood County Campground has been declared a flood zone. It can be cleaned up but not rebuilt

August 24, 2022
