Weekdays, 5:00-9am Charlotte's Morning News with Bo Thompson – A daily look at the top stories in the Charlotte-Metro region, the nation and world. It features live interviews with elected and public officials, news makers, reporters and others close to a given story. Bo Thompson hosts the show Monday through Friday. Don Russell hosts Saturday and Sunday. Length 4 hours per day.

Weekdays, 9:00-Noon Keith Larson – This talk show airs Monday through Friday and often features interviews with elected and public officials, newsmakers, reporters and others close to a given story. Length 3 hours per day.

Weekdays, 3:00-6:00pm John Hancock – This talk show airs Monday through Friday and often features interviews with elected and public officials, newsmakers, reporters and others close to a given story. Length 3 hours per day.

Weekdays, 6:00-7:00pm Charlotte at Six with Mark Garrison – This talk show airs Monday through Friday and often features interviews with elected and public officials, newsmakers, reporters and others close to a given story. Length 1 hour per day.

Saturday and Sunday, 6:00-8:00am Charlotte's Morning News: Weekend – A daily look at the top stories in the Charlotte-Metro region, the nation and world. It features live interviews with elected and public officials, news makers, reporters and others close to a given story. Don Russell hosts. Length: 2 hours Saturday and Sunday.
