6/9/14: Guest, Debbie Pike visitors services manager with the Las Vegas National Wild Life Refuge. This Refuge gets it's water source by way of a channel directly from Storrie Lake State Park located about ten miles away. When our region is experiencing drought conditions and water levels are low at the State Lake, then the Refuge gets less water flowing into it's ponds and in some years the ponds gave gone dry. When that happens, birds of all types and sizes and breeds can't stop at the Refuge for water and there is also less food in the way of seeds for the birds, The refuge is also a feeding ground for other large animals including deer, bears, elk, fox ETC. the refuge also creates local jobs, offers visitors trail walks, bird watching and activities for the children. 6/12/14: Guest. Dr. Yasmin A. Florez, a visiting Professor of music at New Mexico Highlands University. Promoting upcoming events in the university music department. Mr. Diego Trujillo with the city community development department talked about landscaping projects at the Historic Plaza Park.
