11/01/16: Chamber of Commerce chairman Travis Regensburg. Guests included: Ron Doss & Eric, co-owners of Desert Gate and Geneyesus computer company who spoke about the services they offer to their customers and expanded services to outer lying rural areas and their residents. Also the CEO Chris Wolf and staff from our local hospital, Alta Vista Regional Hospital. Mr. Wolf informed the community about hospital services and that the hospital has hired a doctor recruitment company to try to recruit doctors for their OB department. We discussed the important function the hospital plays in the health wealfare of local residents and those of surrounding communities. ETC. Lenght of talk from 9:07 a. m. to 10:15 a. m.

11/02/16: Talk show guests, Board members of Citizens Committee for Historic Preservation, (CCHP). Board Chairman, Rudy Laumbach, Office Manager Jennie McKinley, Martha McGaffery, Geri Madrid informing the community of all the services they provide. Historic Home Tours, Holiday Home Tours, Annual awards Dinner where owners of historic buildings and homes who have improved their property, ETC. Length of talk: from 8:07 a. m. to 8:40 a. m.

Members of Las Vegas First Independant Business Alliance featuring many local business owners promoting their services, products and encouraging the community to keep tax dollars at home by shopping locally. Lenght of show, 8:50 to 9:30 a. m.

Buzz Godwin, introducing a new counseling clinic now serving the community.

11/3/16: Dr. Cathy Stauber with her monthly one hour show discussing many health issues. Title of radio show, "To Your health". Talk from 8:05 a. m. To 9:10 a. m.

Gloria Gonzales Director of Non-Profit Ribera Community Cultural Center, and Patsy Murphey board member. Informing the community of all the services provided at the center. Residents of the rural community of Ribera started five years ago to gather information, lobby the state about the process of applying for federal and state funding to purchase an old historic abandoned school building with plans of creating a much needed community service center. They are currently seeking funding to fix and pave the up hill road leading to the center. Length of talk from 9:11 a. m. to 9:38 a. m.

11/4/16: "Whats Cookin at City Hall", featuring Mayor Tonita Gurule Giron and city manager Richard Trujillo. They informed the community about city business

and many other issues. Reported that they have hired an attorney and a hydrologist to review the proposal submitted by the board members of Storrie Lake Association. The past city administration approved and signed a perpetual agreement to purchase/store water at the lake for city use but this new administration does not like the previous agreement so they are completely reviewing it and could not say how long this process will take. They stated that the new administration is reviewing and updating all city ordinances from each department and making changes they think need to be made. Have hired a second code enforcement employee to help with the overload in that department. They also discussed the recall effort now in place against the mayor that is being pushed by a person they believe is a disgruntled resident and informed the community that this person pushing the recall made demands of the mayor and city and is unhappy because the city did not meet this person's demands. Our state government is currently dealing with a one billion financial shortfall and the state department of finance has advised all community governments to stop providing finances to non-profit groups for now. Length of talk, from 8:30 a. m. to 9:40 a. m.

11/4/16: Karyl Lyne, a member of AAUW university women. She invited the community to a legislative forum to be held Saturday 11/5/16 featuring guest speakers State Senator Pete Campos and State Representative Tomas Salazar. Both will speak about the one billion state financing shortfall, the 2016 and 2017 state budget and what changes they see coming in state government because of the downturn in oil and natural gas downturn. Length of talk from 8:05 a. m. to 8:25.

11/07/16: Guests on our talk show were Yvonne Aragon, the public information officer with state department of transportation and Tec. Supervisor Marc Pacheco. They gave an update on HWY projects 434 and 283. They urged motorists to use caution and observe all traffic signs when traveling on these two roads during the construction work. Project 434 will last through two construction seasons weather permitting. Length of talk from 8:10 a. m. to 8:28 a. m.

Bill Hendrickson director of Las Vegas San Miguel Economic Development Corporation. His guest was Luise Hoogerhuis, director of First Born, a non profit organization working with expecting mothers and their families. She also announced a job opening they have for a part time "home visitor". This is a weekly radio program to announce available local jobs. Length of talk from 8:30 a. m. to 9:07 a. m.

11/09/16: Jenny Arguello, office manager for the Las Vegas-San Miguel Chamber of Commerce and her guest, Brianna Montano, representing LCC Small Business Development Center, informing the community about all the business information and assistance services provided by her agency for anyone starting a new business. Assistance include, consultations regarding the importance of compiling a detailed well thoughtout business plan which becomes an important tool when applying for a business bank loan. Preparing a business plan also helps create a clear picture and strategy for the business owner to better prepare for a successful start up business. A business plan can also alert the business owners to possible pitfalls, help them set up a business operational budget that will carry the business for the first year, ETC. 11/10/16: Medical staff from Alta Vista Regional Hospital. Dr. Nancy Wright, a hospital Pediatrician and Annette Hernandez, Physician Practice Director. The topic of discussion was the importance of getting a Flu Shot which the hospital provides by appointment. Dr. Wright stressed the importance of every one getting a flu shot especially the very young, (over 6 months) the elderly, those with medical complications ETC. Length of talk, from 8:30 a. m. to 9:20 a. m.

11/11/16: City of Las Vegas staff, Alvin Jiron, recycling coordinator, Consuelo Gallegos, KAB (Keep America Beautiful) coordinator. Speaking about the yearly Christmas Parade and stressing all the safety precautions, rules to follow the night of the parade, reminding parade participants with floats to pay extra attention to people and especially children on the parade route and not to throw candy off floats to children. Street lights are turned off for the parade making it difficult to see people lined up along the side of the streets. His agency has contracts for training workers in New Mexico and several othe states.
