The following issues are some of the concerns affecting our community and surrounding areas discussed by our guests on our talk show "Over The Back Fence". Over KFUN/AM 1230 & KLVF/FM 100.7

8/1/16: Cindy Collins, director of the Main Street program. Her guest called in from Texas, Dr. Nick Gerlick who will be the featured speaker for an event to be held at the Historic Plaza Hotel. He is a professor at a College in Texas where he has been teaching his students about the life and history of Fred Harvey and will speak about this topic on Friday 8/5/16. There used to be three Fred Harve houses, hotels restaurants in our town. One is now a college, one is the Plaza Hotel and the Castenada Hotel is now under new ownership and will re remodeled and opened up for busiess in about a year. The college is the United World College of the American Southwest, the only one of its king in the entire United States. It is located four miles from our community. Duration of talk: from 8:05 a. m. to 9:15 a. m.

8/2/16: Bill Hendrickson, director of Las Vegas Economic Development Corporation, who's mission is attract and develop new businesses in our town. The EDC has been working on establishing a Community Industrial kitchen where people who want to start their own small business preparing foods and or jams and jellies and salsas can work out of the commercial kitchen at Luna Community College. The EDC will compile a list of potential clients to fit into this program. Bill also announced that a new business is to open in our community and has purchased an existing building to establish a billing service which will work with local doctors, hospitals and medical clinics. This company will also offer several job openings for prople with a medical background. Duration of talk: 9 a. m. to 9:45 a. m.

8/3/16: Kathy Hendrickson, promoting Heritage Week "Places With A Past tours". This is a yearly event on our community which brings many visitors who enjoy learning about our local history. Our city has over nine hundred historic homes and or buildings listed in the National Register. These visitor also spend money in our town which helps our economy. The tour this year will highlight homes and or buildings and locations where movies have been fillmed including movies with Romaine Fielding. Duration of talk from 8:05 a. m. to 8:25 a. m.

8/4/16: Guests on talk show were: Dr. Cathy Stauber, Dr. Eric Seward OBGYN and Annissa Apodaca, recruitment manager with Christus St. Vincent Regional Medical Center. They both were on our radio show to inform the community and surrounding areas that the hospital will be opening an OBGYN Clinic in town. This is in response to the need for this service since our local hospital, Alta Vista shut

their OBGYN services six months ago, as a result there have been two deaths, (a mother and her unborn child) who died on I-25 after returning home from a doctor's prenatal visit in Santa Fe. This has caused serious concerns in our community. Christus will also be bringing two more doctors into our community in September 2016 Duration of talk: from 8:05 a.m. To 8:58 a. m.

8/4/16: Author and writer Marion Amberg, who just published her 2nd book titled, "Shrines & wonders, The Pilgram's Guide to Santa Fe and Northern New Mexico". Her book offers a wealth of local history about old churches, missions, historic sites like "El Santuario de Chimayo, known as "The Lourdes of America". The book also features local artists, wood carvers, santeros and their art works, including information about Spanish Market held every year in Santa Fe, New Mexico which draws thousands of visitors, tourists from around the world to see and purchase the art work and wood carvings of many New Mexico artists. Margarito Mondragon is a wood carver and santero from our community who's art work and carvings is well known world wide. Length of interview: from 9:05 a.m. To 9:45 a. m.

8/4/16: The Las Vegas, San Miguel County Fair will be held this week three miles Northwest of our community. This is a yearly fair which draws many visitors and youth participants. The guests included Mr. Ted Roybal, a county fair board member, and his two granddaughters, Rebecca age 13 and Alana age 8 who both have been showing their animals from age three. They quite often sell their animals after showing and their grandfather says after expenses, they both save their money as a future college fund. The girls learn how to take care of their animals throughout the year as they prepare them for showing at the fair, they learn how to meet and greet visitors and also learn how to work with and get along with other youth participants. Rebecca has also qualified to show her animals at the New Mexico State Fair, which she says is "where you get to compete against the big boys". Patricia Smith, a board member has been involved with the county fair for the past 45 years when her eldest son starting showing his animals at a very young age. Rebecca and Alana were very charming, talkative and outgoing during the talk show. Length of interview: from 9:50 a. m. to 10:13 a. m. Our radio stations have been helping to promote and supporting the County Fair for over 35 years.

8/5/16: Guests included: Head nurse Elizabeth Donaldson, FNP, representing the new Walk-In-Clinic which is part of Alta Vista Hospital which is now open and serving our community. Also, Annette Hernandez, physical practice director, and Linda Leyba, business administrative representative. They introduced a new "Walk-In-Clinic" established by our local hospital which will offer this much needed service to citizens in our community and those of surrounding areas. Duration of talk: From 9:05 a. m. to 9:22 a. m.

Matt Hindi, owner of , "Bad Shot Gun Show", to be held in our community on August 27th and 28th to be held at the Serf Activities Center. Mr. Hindi held his first such gun show a year ago which was well attended which is why he is hosting this second gun show. This gun show is supported by the chamber of commerce. Length

of interview: 8:05 a. m. to 8:34 a. m.

Pamela Marrujo, director of the city recreation center. She offered an up date to the planned re-construction of the roof of the swimming pool which was destroyed by high winds two years ago. She advised that a contract agreement has been signed by the city and the general contractor and work should be completed in nine months. I asked if the general contractor will be required to hire some local residents for the job and Pamela said that there will be some local hirings. Length of talk: from 8:38 a. m. to 8:45 a. m.

8/8/16: Mr. Paul Salas representing the VietNam Veterans Administration chapter 1063, Jenny Arguello and Travis Regensburg both representing the Las Vegas San Miguel Chamber of Commerce. They all talked about an up coming Golf Tournament, a fundraiser to benefit the local Veterans Chapter. Travis also reported on future chamber events. Length of talk: From 8:15 a. m. to 8:45 a. m.

Martha Johnsen: speaking about a scheduled Junk Tique event scheduled for Saturday August 13th to be held at Lincoln Park from 8: a. m. to 4: p. m. Proceeds from the booth rental fees will go towards the Lady of Sorrows Church organ fund. This is a very old one of a kind organs originally built for the church dating back to the 1800's. Length of talk: From 8:53 a. m. to 9:05 a. m.

8/9/16: Loretta Baca, Yolanda Cruz with DWI Council, Renee Ciddio Terry Bridges talking about emergency preparedness and an up coming Emergency Expo to be held on August 13/2016 at the local Wal-Mart parking lot. The main purpose for the expo is so that the public can attend and personally meet emergency personnel from all the local emergency response departments. This expo is also meant to help citizens in the community and surrounding areas served by these agencies to meet the people behind the uniforms and understand that these individuals are normal people with families and needs like everyone else. Duration of talk, 8 a. m. 9 a. m.

8/11/16: Martha Johnsen and Barbara Venturi representing the local Elks organization. Martha spoke about a "Junktique" event to be held on 8/13/16 for people to set up booths and sell unwanted items. The money raised from booth rentals will be donated to Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church organ fund. It is one of the oldest church organs in the United States and is in need of many repairs totalling over a million dollars. This is the second such event held for this cause.

Barbara promoted the Elks Family Day as part of Heritage Week which will also be held on the same day and location and will feature many family events for local youth. Duration of talk: 9:05 a. m. to 9:30 a. m.

San Miguel County Summer Youth Program. Wendy Armijo is the director and she brought eleven of the youth working in the program to the radio station to introduce them to the community and to talk about the youth program, the duties they are assigned to and what each individual has learned from working in the program. Duration of talk: 9:35 a. m. to 9:40 a. m.

8/12/16: Terry Bridges, with the Local Emergency Planning committee, promoting the up coming Emergency Expo to be held at Wal-Mart parking lot on 8/13/16 so that the community and citizens from other surrounding areas can come and meet the emergency personnel from all the local emergency agencies. There will be activities for the youth.

Mr. Richard Trujillo, our city manager, and Annette Velarde, City Community Development Director. She reported on the following: 4th of July Fiestas, Motorcycle Rally, Events and Films currently being shot in our community, Dam Authentic Website, northEastern Regional Tourism, City Museus, a meeting on 8/18/16 at 5:30 p. m. with local non-profit organizations in our community to try to identify and reduce or eliminate duplication of events between them. The city manager gave a status report on the contract with the company hired to install a new roof on our recreational center swimming pool area and other work to be done to the building. He also gave a report on the planned agreement with the Storrie Lake Water Association and the city so the dity can enter into a \$12,000,000 contract for water storage at the lake. I told him that the community feels that the new mayor and administration are stalling the signing of the agreement and he confirmed that they are stalling this process while they review all the details of the agreement, hire an attorney and geologist. I asked why hiring these people was necessary since the past administration had already done this work less than a year ago. Length of talk: from 8:25 a. m. to 9:54 a. m.

Tara Trudall, who works with Ameri Corps at New Mexico Highlands University. She announced the "Rising Star Installation" event to be held on Saturday 8/13/16. It is an arts event to celebrate the memory of her father who died a few months ago and to help people learn to honor the memory of a family member who has passed on to help them learn how to cope with their loss. Talk was from: 9:57 a. m. tp 10:27 a. m.

8/13/16: Community Peace Radio, Host is Pat Lehan, Co- ost was Faith Maez. Her guests were Tina Holguin and jae Dennis. They announced the scheduled Free Sapy and Neuter Clinic. Duration of talk: 10:05 a. m. to 11 a. m.

8/15/16: New Mexico Highlands University office of student recruitment and undergraduate admissions. University representatives included: Jessica Jaramillo program director, Lliana Ortiz, student recruiter, Crystal Burch, admissions assistant. They explained how their program works, what services and benefits are available to students, financial assistance guidelines, recruiting procedures, qualification guidelines,ETC. Mr. Manuel Romero, City schools Robertson boys head basketball coach. He spoke about the Cardinals Youth Basketball Camp to be held August 16th & 17th/2016. Cost is \$35 per participant. Length of interview: 9:05 a. m. to 9:28 a. m.

8/17/16: Jenny Marrujo with the chamber of commerce and her guest, page Medina, manager of the local Domino's Pizza store where they are conducting a one day fundraiser for Aliych Esquibel, a 15 month girl suffering from Leukemia. Domino's will donate a certain percentage from their pizza sales for one day to a fund to help the family with medical expenses. Jenny also gave a report on other chamber events.Length of discussion 8:05 a. m. to 8:45 a. m.

8/18/16: Stella Burciaga and DeAnn Barry, co-owners of Buena Vida Physical Therapy. They are the hosts of a show we offer every Thursday titled, "To Your Health". Their topic was Benefits of Meditation, where to begin. Lenght of discussion, from 8:05 a. m. to 9:15 a. m.

8/19/16: Mr. Fred Nathan, founder and director of "Think New Mexico", a group devoted to problem solving in New Mexico government. His topic was, fixing New Mexico's infrastructure and creating jobs. He talked about the fact that the Legislature needs to change the method by which it funds capital outlay projects, the method by which they decide which projects will be funded, projects must be deemed shovel ready and entities must meet all project requirements to get funding. Also, discussion is taking place with in the legislature about calling back funding from communities who have received funding for projects but are not shovel ready, projects have not been started or finished. It has been determined by the state auditor that millions of state funding is tied up in communities for projects that are dormant. Our community could face loosing \$12,000,000 in bond funding for water projects.

Mr. Richard Trujillo, city manager and Pamela Marrujo, cith recreational director. The manager spoke for about fifteen minutes and agreed with with what Fred Nathan had to say about state funding for water and infrastructure projects. He then had to leave for another scheduled meeting. Pamala gave an up date on the latest contract discussions with the contractor hired to fix the city recreational center's roof which was damaged by high winds two years ago. The work should be completed in ning months. Duration of talk: 8:45 a. m. to 9:30 a. m.

8/23/16: Loretta Baca, host of talk show "Our Opinion, Let's Talk About It". Her guests were Renee Ciddio, Yolanda Cruz, (by phone call in), and Anastacio Trujillo, with Nusenda Credit Union. Topic of discussion, Credit Unions VS Banks, Money Management, Debit & Credit. The discussion centered mostly on youth and student loans for a collage education, student loans available, the importance of students paying back those loans, protecting their credit history, borrowing only the amount of money you need and no more, spending wisely.
