The first fort was replaced by a second fort which also was not suitable since quarters were dug into the ground, which became mud pits during rainy season and winter time. Eventually a third for was built. Fort Union had a big impact on the local economy of the small rural communities surrounding the Fort. The government purchased much of their food supplies from local farmers, including cattle, sheep, white flower for baking bread and other staples.
