Kaitlyn Falk, Gannon University Wellness Coordinator & Club Fit Program Coach & Damali Donovan: Strong VISTA Coordinator at Strong Vincent Middle School	North Coast Views Sunday, July 07, 2019 6:00am - 30 min	1. CHILD/YOUTH HEALTH/OBESITY - Learned that Cub Fit is an afterschool program for H.S. girls, focusing on fitness / nutrition & connectedness. It was founded by Gannon U's Dr. MaryJean Taylor. – who saw that the statistically we had a higher overweight/obesity rate than the national average. Dr Taylor realized that afterschool sports programs for girls were limited, so she proposed this program to give girls the Knowledge, Motivation and Skills/Opportunities to eat right and get into sports /activities, with the idea that it would help day to day, but possibly also for future scholarships/opportunities. They expanded the program to middle school girls (STRONG). We also learned about some programs over the summer, which is open to boys and girls – with the focus on sports and sportsmanship. EDUCATION - Reviewed how the museum got its start – with women from the community realizing the importance of children learning through play. Talked about the many hands-on exhibits – including regional games and exhibits (which are typical for children's museums) – Learned about their outdoor space, the collaborations they have with many groups and how they have sensory friendly times for those on the autism spectrum and how therapists see marked improvement in some children they bring to the museum. HOMELESS VETERANS - Learned that this program actually started 5yrs ago, when the John Kowalsak, Director of the center visited a friend in Albany, NY who started a center there to assist homeless vets. John decided to start a branch here. They now assist any veteran, military and their families. They do have some criteria to assist them by linking them to services and/or giving them supplies that they need. Heard about a new program they have teamed up with called Good 360 – where they (in this case) get goods from WalMart that they can sell to other non-profits, where they can purchase things for a smaller amount than they would usually have to pay...while getting money to the VMC.
