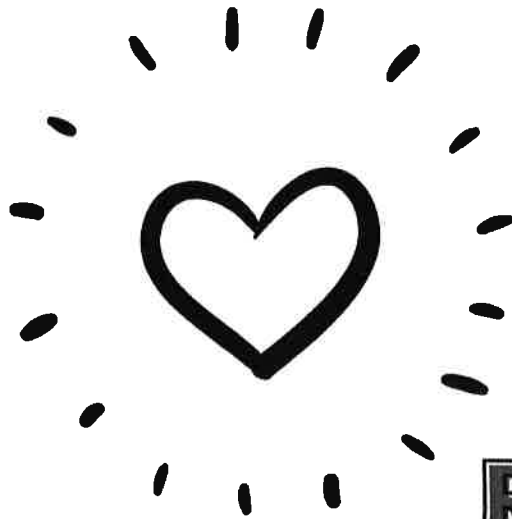

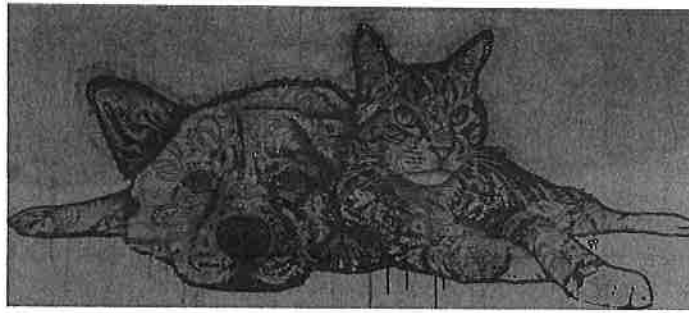

On October 8, 1871, the deadliest wildfire in United States history swept through a large part of northeastern Wisconsin. Though it happened on the same night as the Chicago Fire, the Peshtigo Fire was a far greater natural disaster. Five times as many people died in Wisconsin as in Chicago, and vast areas of forest and farmland were reduced to ashes. This presentation will explore the circumstances of the fire and the stories of some of the families caught up in it.

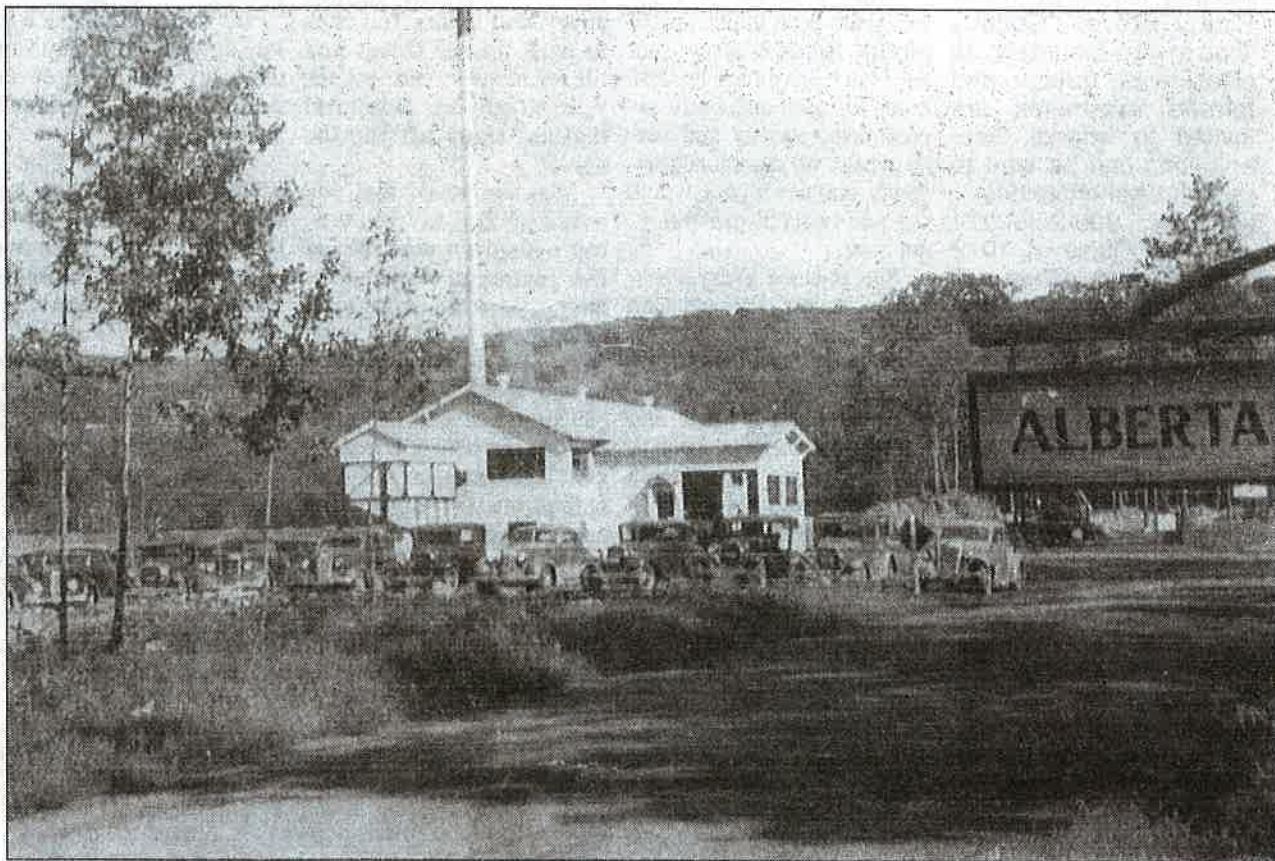
In recent years, Karen has been working on raising her genealogical skills to a higher level, studying at the Genealogical Institute for Federal Records, the Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy, the Genealogical Research Institute of Pittsburgh, and the Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research. Early in 2019, she decided to put her skills to work on the subject of the Great Peshtigo Fire, a lifelong source of fascination. Since that time, she has done intensive research on all aspects of the fire, with particular emphasis on the families and individuals caught up in it. Her book, *The Sky Was Brass; The Earth Was Ashes: The Story of the Great Peshtigo Fire* will be released in 2022.

Presentation set on the Ford Alberta Sawmill

BARAGA — The Ford Alberta Sawmill citizens group, operating as a subcommittee under the non-profit auspices of the Baraga County Historical Society, will sponsor a free event from 4:30 to 6 p.m. Eastern time Wednesday, Sept. 21, at the Whirl-I-Gig, 15850 Whirl-I-Gig Road, L'Anse.

The featured speaker will be L'Anse native Keith E. Whitman. The purpose of the event is to inform the public about efforts to preserve the sawmill and restore its status as an important historical exhibit. Alberta is on

U.S. 41 in Baraga County's L'Anse Township.

Drawing on thousands of hours of interviews and research for his book-in-progress on Henry Ford, Whitman's topic will be "Henry Ford's Northern Michigan Operations: Henry Ford's Playground."

Focusing on historical Ford enterprises and communities in Iron Mountain/Kingsford, Alberta, Pequaming, and Big Bay, Whitman will bring to life the legacy of Henry Ford the man, who loved the Upper Peninsula and its people.

"Keith has an amazing store of knowledge on the Henry Ford heyday in the U.P., when he owned huge timber holdings north of the Straits. Keith's documented stories are based on his recorded interviews with scores of people who worked for Ford or interacted with him, and with members of the Ford family. This is an event for the whole family — a trip down memory lane for many U.P. residents who grew up in Ford mill towns and a local history lesson for our young people," Subcommittee Chair

Mike DesRochers said.

Whitman's anecdotes are humorous, heartwarming, and always informative.

He is the proud owner of the Pequaming fire engine, designed by Henry Ford and used by him to entertain children on his frequent visits.

There is no cost for admission, but freewill donations will be accepted.

Information on the Baraga County Historical Society and the subcommittee will be available. The Whirl-I-Gig will be open for food and beverage service.
