	6/10-11	Signs that someone is suicidal can vary from person to person, according to Dial Help in Houghton. Assistant Director of Dial Help Krissy Putz says the most important thing is getting that person some help.
	6/8-9	The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and "Getsetup" are partnering to offer classes to improve brain health during June, which is Alzheimer's and brain awareness month.

6/4-6	In 2020 Marquette County law enforcement responded to 46 cardiac emergency calls requesting the use of lifesaving automated external defibrillators. Law enforcement officers are frequently the first to arrive on scene because they are already mobile at the time of the call and have the necessary equipment, including AED's with them on patrol.
5/28-30	The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and the Protect Michigan Commission are launching a new text messaging program to share Covid-19 vaccine information and encourage Michiganders to get vaccinated.
5/28-30	The Michigan region of the American Red Cross is sharing information to create awareness of rip currents and other threats to Great Lakes swimmer safety.
5/27-28	The Marquette County Health Department continues in it's efforts to vaccinate community members and is working to reach out to home bound individuals.
5/27-28	The announcement of a bi-partisan agreement between the Governor and Senate Majority leader Mike Shirkey and Speaker of the House Jason Went worth has lead to Michigan moving forward.
5/24-25	Governor Whitmer has announced that the plan to roll back Covid related restrictions has been stepped up in Michigan. As of June 1, capacity limits will be lifted for outdoor events, while indoor capacity limits will be increased to 50%. On July 1, Michigan will no longer have limits in place for outdoor or indoor gatherings.
5/19-20	I an attempt to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and the Michigan Department of Transportation have expanded the "Travel Points Testing Program" to the Clare, New Buffalo, and Coldwater Welcome Centers.
5/18-19	State Representative Beau LaFave has introduced a bill which is part of a 6 bill bi-partisan package to prohibit the creation, implementation and enforcement of vaccine passports in Michigan. LaFave's bill specifically prohibits businesses from mandating proof of vaccination for customers.
5/14-16	Governor Gretchen Whitmer is lifting the mask mandate for fully vaccinated Michiganders. The new order will take effect on Saturday, May 15 th at 9am.
5/12-13	Governor Whitmer has announced that 55% of Michiganders have received their first dose of the COVID vaccine. With this announcement it marks the first milestone of the "MI Vacc to Normal Plan" which enables in-person work to resume across all employment sectors on May 24 th .
