Employment Unit continues a mentoring program to train a person, (daughter of the principals of the licensee corporation) for station management including, financial, traffic, and programming. The trainee now oversees all traffic responsibilities for the 8 radio stations and a TV station in this employment group. In addition to overseeing production and transfer of daily logs for each of the 8 radio stations to the appropriate radio stations, trainee audits incoming sales orders for accuracy and compliance with station rates and scheduling policies and traveled to train in operation of the new traffic system in place for the employment group. Under the Training Program, the trainee participates in weekly Management/Operation meetings of department heads and is involved in procedure and policy making decisions. In these meetings the trainee is exposed to staffing, sales, news and broadcast content, technical and engineering issues and how these issues are accommodated. Trainee manages staff that direct and switch camera shots and character generation for a daily live half-hour talk show on TV. The trainee oversees and works with the Business Manager and is instrumental in making management decisions affecting stations financial, programming, operations, and many hiring discussions/decisions. The trainee has traveled to Management meetings involving state radio groups to keep abreast of broadcast management issues involved with local radio operations, thus broadening her exposure to management ideas, techniques, and styles. Trainee has shared primary responsibility in recruiting and hiring and training key accounting staff members responsible for Station Employment Unit accounting functions.

During the past year Trainee has been mentored in both the purchase and sale of broadcast properties, negotiating contracts for broadcast programming and in the selection, purchase and initial implementation of a new Accounts Receivable system for all stations.

Level Position (#8)

Employment Unit continues a mentoring program to train a person, (son of the principals of the licensee corporation) for Management. The trainee now handles various responsibilities for all of the broadcast stations in this employment group. Trainee has been instrumental in investigating feasibility of acquisition (purchase) of and assumption of existing radio stations. Trainee was actively involved in the purchase of and installation of new broadcast equipment including studio digital equipment; interface to new logging system and automation system, transmitter equipment and switching from the previous system to the new system and training other station personnel in its use. Trainee is involved in weekly Sales Management meetings, hiring of new Station Manager for two stations and Sales Manager for three stations. Trainee researched and was responsible for acquiring, installing and implementing at two stations Sales Tracking Business software which allow the Sales department of each station to become more productive. Trainee has conceived and implemented and is developing new non-traditional streams of revenue for the broadcast stations to counteract the recession. Trainee acquired, implemented the stations first websites, and revisions now to include interactive news, sports and weather information on-demand over the internet. The trainee participates in weekly Management/Operation meetings of department heads and is involved in procedure and policy making decisions. In these meetings the trainee is exposed to staffing, sales, news and broadcast content, technical and engineering issues and how these issues are accommodated. In addition, trainee participates in hiring interviews of most new employees.

WSPY takes pride in our commitment to working with local law enforcement and emergency management agencies. Trainee interfaces with local Emergency Management Agency personnel using cutting edge technology to allow listeners to receive information from the proper authorities in times of emergency. Trainee participates in training agency personnel and maintaining the equipment involved and a mock training for nuclear disaster with local, state and Homeland security agencies.

The trainee, a voting member in IBIB, travels to Management meetings involving 100 radio groups who meet twice yearly to discuss and keep abreast of broadcast management issues involved with local radio operations, thus broadening his exposure to management ideas, techniques, and styles.

During the past year Trainee has recruited, interviewed, drafted an employment agreement and participated in the hiring for a new Assistant Station Manager. Trainee has been mentored in both the purchase and sales of broadcast properties including actively negotiating transactions, including rewrites of Asset Purchase Agreements, Escrow Agreements and responsibility for on-site due diligence activities.
