The Lake Area Educational Broadcasting was granted licenses by the Federal Communications Commission for the following stations on these respective dates: KCVQ and KCVJ on Jan 21<sup>st</sup>, 2005; KCVJ and KCVX on Jan 31<sup>st</sup>, 2005; KCVZ on Feb 4<sup>th</sup>, 2005; KCVK on April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2005; KCVY on June 12<sup>th</sup>, 2006; KCKV on December 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2009; KVSR on February 18<sup>th</sup>, 2010; KCKE on February 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011, and KCKJ on May 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2012. These license were granted by the FCC to the Lake Area Educational Broadcasting Foundation to serve the public interest as a public trustee until Feb 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013. These licenses will expire on Feb 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013. We must file applications for license renewal with the FCC by October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012. When filed, copies of these applications will be available for inspection during regular business hours at our foundation offices in Camdenton, MO. They will contain information concerning the station's performance over the last eight years or for the period of our ownership of these stations.

Individuals who wish to advise the FCC of facts relating to our renewal applications, and to whether these stations have operated in the public interest, should file comments and petitions with the FCC by January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013.
