The show also features interviews with both global and local world musicians and gives background on the artists and the stories behind the songs. Plus, many of the shows have themes—from celebrating International Women's Day to Hispanic Heritage Month.
Time for the Blues	Arts & Culture	Saturday nights from 9pm- 10pm	Time for the Blues is a retrospective of all blues music and is produced and hosted by John Porter and Henry Cook. The program focuses on specific artists and various themes in the blues, especially featuring major contributors such as: Muddy Waters, B.B. King, Howlin' Wolf, Charlie Musselwhite and John Lee Hooker, among many others. While all time periods are represented, most of the music presented is what we call "post-war" blues (post WWI through the present). Regional blues are also featured, from the Mississippi Delta, Chicago, the West Coast, Memphis, Texas, the Piedmont, as well as British and other blues influences from around the world.
