She credits the care and support she received from Wounded Warrior Project programs for her recovery; she's taken part in Warrior Care Network, Project Odyssey, and WWP Talk. Wounded Warrior Project began in 2003 as a grassroots effort by a group of veterans and friends who wanted to give back to the first wounded warriors returning from the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. The group provided backpacks filled with comfort items to those recovering in the hospital. That simple act of kindness evolved into a national non-profit whose mission for the past 20 years has been to honor and empower post-9/11 wounded warriors.
