

QUARTERLY REPORT #2 for 2019

FOR PERIOD COVERING

April 1, 2019 to June 30, 2019 (Filed 7.8.19 by Wendy Osher)

This Quarter, we've gotten several fatal incidents involving visitors to hiking spots and waterfalls. It comes as a two week search was launched for a lost, then found Maui woman, Amanda Eller that drew national attention. Maui Now and Pacific Media Group followed the story from start to end and provided the most comprehensive coverage with a live feed of press conferences and follow up info with videos and interviews posted to our website for listeners who wanted to follow the story closer. We also followed up with Maui Fire officials for tips on how to stay safe while hiking and the do's and don'ts for venturing out on Maui.

There were at least three cockfighting raids conducted on Maui as Maui Police conduct crackdowns in Puunene and Lahiana.

Hawaii also had 16 consecutive days of record heat in June, with only a handful of days that didn't tie or break record temperatures. We provided information to our listeners with a comprehensive rundown of temps.

Hurricane season in Hawaii started on June 1st and continues through the end of November. We're already on our third named storm of the season. Intense tracking and tools are available to our listeners online. We've also activated our hurricane tracker online and have the ability to send out text alerts for severe weather.

On the roads, Maui suffered 11 traffic fatalities so far this year. The most recent involved drunk driving. A 23-year-old Kula woman was driving in the wrong direction when her Subaru collided head-on into a Civic, claiming the life of a 19-year-old Wailuku female. We did interviews with the teen's family and boyfriend who expressed sadness over the cause.

In May, the state department of transportation held a blessing for the new CONRAC facility at Kahului Airport. A blessing was held today for the \$340 million Consolidated Rental Car facility or "ConRAC" facility at Maui's Kahului Airport.

We also participated in the annual Maui Visitor Industry Charity Walk. The Maui Hotel & Lodging Association celebrated 41 years of giving back to the community with its annual Visitor Industry Charity Walk. Our radio stations handed out water during the course and provided on air updates.

We also reported on drought concerns, housing issues (including coverage of the mayor's press conference on affordable housing plans), and an Easter vandalism incident at St Antony Chapel in Wailuku.

We did extensive coverage of the jail riot at MCC and the subsequent escape and capture of inmates there, including community alerts over the radio.

Southwest entered the Hawaii Market in May with the launch of service to Maui and later interisland service. The news was covered extensively with reports on site, and interviews with airline competitors, including the CEO of United Airlines as a follow-up report. This drew widespread interest as customers look for better prices on interisland airfare.

At the beginning of the quarter, there was much controversy surrounding the Mayor's appointment of Patrick Wond as Corp Counsel after his arrest. He has since been replaced by Moana Lutey. We covered a rise up rally held at UHMC in which Mayor Victorino unexpectedly shared details of a sex assault incident when he was a minor.
