


PROGRAM / ISSUES REPORT NOTIFICATION

Third Quarter 2014

I, Stuart Muck, as Chief Engineer of WIWN (TV) DTV Channel 5.1, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, hereby certify that for the period of July 1, 2014 to July 16, 2014 that WIWN (TV) aired a total of 15 minutes per hour, every hour, of every day, specialized local weather forecasts. These local forecasts were video presentations of the weather forecasts for the Milwaukee designated market area, and, in addition, these forecasts included the current temperatures of the Milwaukee area, the forecasted temperatures, radar imagery, wind speeds, air quality, UV indexes, and 7 day extended forecasts. These occurred on the "fives" of each hour: :05, :15, :25, :35, :45 and :55 (except for the three (3) hours per week when Children's Programming aired). Moreover, any and all weather reports, announcements and warnings for the Milwaukee area from the National Weather Service were broadcast over WIWN to its Milwaukee area viewers (Winter Storm Warnings, Severe Thunderstorm Warnings, Tornado Watches, etc). Also, WIWN, shows local conditions at all times, 24 hours a day, 7 days per week (which takes up approximately the lower 20% of the screen) which broadcast the current and forecasted temperatures, 24 hour outlooks, and 3 day extended forecasts along with all advisories/watches/warnings for Milwaukee and surrounding areas within the Milwaukee DMA. From July 16th, 2014 to August 30th, 2014, Milwaukee Media, LLC began an LMA of WIWN and reduced the program hours of weather to 98 hours per week. Then from August 31st to September 30th, 2014, weather programming hours were reduced to 76 hours per week.
