PROGRAM/ISUES REPORT NOTIFICATION First Quarter 2015

I, Jennifer Waldherr, as Coordinator, Broadcast and Traffic Operations of WIWN (TV) DTV Channel 68.1, 68.2, 68.3, 68.4, 68.5, and 68.6, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, hereby certify that for the period of October 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015, WIWN (TV) aired local programming addressing community issues and concerns.

Among those addressed were:

1. Milwaukee Bucks Arena, Downtown Gentleman's Club, City Regulations for Local Businesses ("Council Rewind")

This program highlights issues before the Milwaukee Common Council between Sept. 8, 2015 and Sept. 22, 2015. The actions highlighted are the debate on a New Bucks Arena, a hearing on an application for a downtown gentlemen's club and enacting recommendations to streamline city regulations for local businesses.

2. School Bus Safety, City Resident on NML Project Employment, Nationstar Mortgage Contribution ("Council Rewind")

This program highlights issues before the Milwaukee Common Council between Sept. 29, 2015 and Oct. 13, 2015. The segments include school bus safety regulations, the employment of city residents on the NML project and a contribution by Nationstar Mortgage to the City's foreclosure efforts.

- 3. Police Officer Additions, Police Body Cameras, Library Hours ("Council Rewind")
 This is a special city budget edition of Council Rewind. We recap the 2016 city budget process and the issues before the Common Council in that budget. Topics include adding police officers, funding police body-worn cameras and restoring library hours for some branch libraries. This process concluded with the budget adoption by the Council on Tuesday, November 3, 2015.
- 4. Promoting gratitude; Promoting Safe Driving ("Respect-Foundation for a Better Life PSA", "Don't Text and Drive" PSA")

Part of living in a community is about respecting each other and helping one another out. Public Service Announcements between local programming show a gentleman stranded without change to call from a payphone for help, but is given money from two women who see him struggling. He thanks them. Another Public Service Announcement shows Tonnette Walker, wife of Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker, with an important message of the dangers of texting and driving.
