Among those addressed were:

- 1. Residential Composting; Screens on Windows in Rental Units; 9-1-1 Staffing Shortage: This program highlights issues before the Milwaukee Common Council between November 29, 2016 and December 13, 2016. Topics include a report on a residential composting pilot program, a new ordinance to require screens on windows in rental units and a report on a plan to deal with staffing shortages in the 9-1-1 call center.
- 2. Plaza at New Bucks Arena; Charter Schools Drinking Water; Landlords and Multiple LLC's: This program highlights issues before the Milwaukee Common Council between Jan. 4, 2017 and Jan. 18, 2017. Topics include plans for the plaza at the new Bucks Arena, requirements for city chartered schools to test for lead in drinking water and a discussion on the City's plans to look for ways to hold landlords who use a number of LLC's accountable.
- 3. Council Opposition to Travel Ban; West Wisconsin Ave Improvements; Ban on Coal Tar Sealants in the City:

This program highlights issues before the Milwaukee Common Council between Jan. 24, 2017 and Feb. 7, 2017. Topics include Council opposition to the travel ban, plans for improvements along West Wisconsin Avenue, and a new ban on the use of coal tar sealants in the City of Milwaukee.

4. Caregiver: Bath (Public Service Announcement, Ad Council, PSA Central)
