PUBLIC AFFAIRS RELATED PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Nebraska Workforce – Monday thru Friday 11:15am

A two minute program aimed at helping area citizens learn of employment opportunities across the listening area. The program offers listeners guidance on openings and also local job training events and offers educational opportunities to enhance employment.

Education Update – Monday thru Friday 9:30am

The two minute program updates the public on youth and adult education opportunities throughout the area. From pesticide training, to water issues, county and community events, and meetings for area organizations, this program provides key information to area agricultural producers, community members, and youth.

KKOT Community News – Monday thru Friday 6:20am, 7:20am, 8:20am, 9:20am

KKOT Community News is a 90 second program dedicated to informing the public on the latest issues that affect them personally, affect their community, and affect the state. The program provides updates on issues impacting local and state government, education, healthcare, tourism, charities, organizations and the environment

Government and Politics	July 1st to September 30 th	65	30 seconds per feature	Coverage of Community committee work sessions in Columbus. Coverage of City Council meetings. Coverage of police, fire, and sheriff departments. Coverage of issues affecting counties in the coverage area.
Government and Politics	July 11th to July 13th	15	30 seconds Per feature	Covered Omaha-based Union Pacific railroad reaching a tentative deal with a major union regarding paid sick leave.

These meetings are 4H, Extension & education meetings. From pesticide training, to water issues to different county events and meetings for 4 H members. This program is one minute in length and provides key information to area agricultural producers and youth.

Education and Youth	July 12th to July 15th	20	1 minute Per feature	Covered officials offering tax credits for scholarships to private schools has been a controversial issue in Nebraska. After tax-credit bills failed to pass in 2020 and 2021, this year the Opportunity Scholarships Act was signed into law.
Education and Youth	July 13th to July 16th	20	30 seconds Per feature	Interviewed Melinda Allen with Columbus Community Hospital about what the 2 day Kids Academy in Columbus is all about.
Education and Youth	July 21st to July 24th	30	30 seconds Per feature	Covered the Twin River Public Schools Board of Education calling a school bond election for \$48.5 million to address urgent facility and program needs.

Residents in Columbus are collecting school supplies, along with personal care items and fun toys, to pack in shoeboxes.
Education and Youth	Sept. 15th to Sept. 20th	20	30 seconds per feature	Covered the "Child Care Stabilization" funds in the American Rescue Plan Act and how they make a huge difference for kids.

The latest Mosquito testing data, released Friday in the Vector-Borne Disease Surveillance report, showed a high number of positive West Nile Virus samples detected in Nebraska's mosquito population.
