Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **WTL News:** This quarter, WTL continued a previous news program and began a new venture as well in the form of a new monthly news program.
- B. **Meet the Need:** This quarter, WTL brought awareness to multiple non-profit organizations through 2 minute news features.
- C. **WTL Involvement:** With eighth grade students beginning the registration process, WTL has taken steps to provide information on the station to this section of the community
- D. **LTHS Football:** The community, as always, asks that WTL provides live play-by-play coverage of LTHS Football and again this Fall/Winter WTL was able to meet this need.

Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below:

A. News Maker Interview

School Leader Interviews– WTL was able to air six (6) live interviews with different school leaders over the course of a couple of weeks in October 2015 to give the community insight into the decisions being made behind the scenes at Lyons Township High School. Interviews were at least 15-minutes in length, broadcast live on 88.1 FM and online at www.wtl.net. Those interviewed included Kris Costopoulos (Assistant Principal); Bill Allan (Director of Television Services); Jason Scales (Journalism/Newspaper Advisor); Ed Tennant (Director of Technology); and Gary Morrill (Director of Student Safety)

Perspective - WTL, under the leadership of Nik Krull '17 and Jamie McMillin '16, began a new news magazine program called *Perspective*. Each month, beginning in September, WTL students put together this one-hour program that focused on a different topic each time. October 2015 was school and community activities. November 2015 was giving. And December 2015 was look back on 2015. These programs combined provided the community with 4 hours of community intensive and focused news.

B. Meet the Need

Meet the Need Programing: Through November 18th- December 11th 2015 for 10 hours WLTl aired Programing to help Meet the Need by bringing awareness to non-profit organizations in the La Grange area. These programs contained information on the non-profit organizations and how the community can help them. C. WLTl Involvement

Future Freshman Night: WLTl always receives an influx of calls and emails from eighth grade students and parents asking how they can get involved in this, their school radio station, when they attend LTHS in 2015-2016. In order to meet this need, WLTl broadcast live from the LTHS Future Freshman Night on Thursday, December 3 from 6:30-9pm at South Campus. While there, students could sign-up to join WLTl (as well as other LTHS clubs).

D. LTHS Football

Live Football Broadcasts: LTHS community members consistently ask that WLTl provide play-by-play coverage for LTHS sports, most notably, football. This Fall, in addition to the games covered during the third broadcast quarter, WLTl was able to provide live coverage of the following games: September 11 vs. Proviso West; October 9 vs. Hinsdale Central (7:30pm); October 16 vs. Oak Park River Forest; October 23 vs. York (7:30pm);

chronically unemployed veterans. There mission is to cut down on the number of veterans who are in unstable conditions after coming home from serving their country.



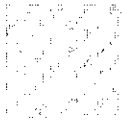
Partners is an organization dedicated to helping keep senior citizens living in our community living

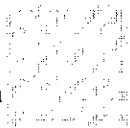
Make-A-Wish is a non profit organization dedicated to granting the wishes of kids with terminal illnesses. Make-A-Wish was founded in 1980 and has grown

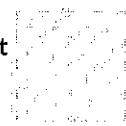

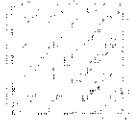

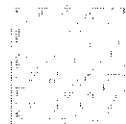
