Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. Fireworks Safety:** With the 4th of July approaching, WTL took steps to keep listeners safe during the holiday season
- B. New School Year:** WTL once again assisted the school and the Student Activities Department in the promotion and kick-off of the new school year.
- C. Co-Curricular Night:** To help facilitate student involvement and awareness of WTL Radio, we participated in Co-Curricular Night.
- D. LTHS Football:** The community, as always, asks that WTL provides live play-by-play coverage of LTHS Football, and again this Fall WTL was able to meet this need.

Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below:

A. Fireworks Safety:

Public Service Announcements – Broadcast 70 times between June 12 and July 4, WTL helped to promote fireworks safety through a series of announcements. WTL also promoted a free fireworks shows throughout the community in an effort to keep listeners safe and away from illegal fireworks

B. New School Year:

Live Event Broadcasts. – WTL provided two live broadcasts for LTHS students on Wednesday, August 12. The first was from “Freshman Experience Day,” from 7:45am to 3pm. This is a day where LTHS incoming freshman can show up “learn the ropes” of LTHS without any other students present, giving them a feeling of safety and confidence to start off the new school year.

WTL also broadcast later that evening from a dance/celebration for LTHS students in support of the new school year from 6 to 9:30pm

C. WLTl Involvement

Co-Curricular Night: WLTl always receives an influx of calls and emails asking how students can get involved in this, their school radio station and even other LTHS clubs and activities. In order to meet this need, WLTl broadcast live from the LTHS Co-Curricular Night on Wednesday, August 19 from 6:30-9pm at South Campus. While there, students could sign-up to join WLTl (as well as other LTHS clubs).

D. LTHS Student Sports

Live Football Broadcasts: LTHS community members consistently ask that WLTl provide play-by-play coverage for LTHS sports, most notably, football. This fall, WLTl was able to provide live coverage of the following games: August 28 vs. Warren (7:15pm to 9:45pm); September 4 vs. Morton (7:15pm to 10:00pm); September 11 vs Proviso West (7:15pm to 9:50pm); and September 26 vs. Glenbard North (1:15pm to 3:45pm).
