Lubbock Police are investigating a shooting, around 12:45 this morning, near 26th and Avenue Q. EMS took two people to the hospital, both expected to survive. No arrest have been made.

A car hit a pedestrian Saturday night, near 135th and University. The victim suffered serious injuries. Investigators haven't told us what caused the crash.

The electric retail market for Lubbock opens this Friday. Residents will begin shopping for their new electric provider. The city will host several electric market fairs this weekend at the civic center.

US Navy helicopter crews fired on Houthi rebels in the red sea. The navy says the militants fired at the choppers after attacking a cargo ship. The helicopter sank three boats, killing their crews.

Homeland security says a record 300-thousand migrants crossed America's southern border, in December. Authorities processed 9 to 10-thousand migrants each day, last month.

UMC Children's Hospital welcomed its first baby of the new year. Casey James Muse was born at 2:23 Monday morning. He weighed in at 7 pounds 10 ounces. The hospital tells us both mom and baby are doing well.

The population of the u-s is slightly larger to start the new year. According to the US Census Bureau there were 335-million, 893-thousand, 238 people in the US, at midnight, on New Year's Day. That is more than half-a-percent point increase from new year's day 2023. Between births and migration, there will be a new addition to America's population every 24 seconds. The projected world population starts the new year off with a little more than eight-billion people.

A federal appeals court upheld Texas' ban on emergency abortions. The ruling said doctors are not obligated to perform abortions and federal law does not govern the practice of medicine.

The Biden Administration is reopening several ports of entry at the southern border. ports of entry in Eagle Pass, Texas, San Ysidro, California, Lakeville, Arizona, and Nogales, Arizona, will reopen tomorrow. They were closed because of a record influx of migrants. Monday, customs and border protection encountered fewer than 5-hundred migrants in Texas' Del Rio sector, which includes Eagle Pass. The Biden Administration called it a significant improvement and attributed the drop to increased enforcement from Mexico.

As temperatures start to drop the city of Lubbock is urging residents to help keep streets and sidewalks safe from ice caused by water run-off. It's important to routinely check the direction of your sprinkler heads. Be sure to turn off your sprinkler system if temperatures drop below 35 degrees. And if you notice a property where there is irrigation runoff, the city is asking you to report it because it can lead to unsafe conditions.

A judge sentenced a Shallowater man to 40 years in prison for his role in a deadly robbery, in 2019. Pablo Reyes pleaded guilty to aggravated robbery. He and another man carjacked Michael McCoy and then shot him when he tried to run.

One victim is dead, and five others injured after a shooting, at a high school, in Perry, Iowa. A 17-year-old student. Armed with a shotgun and a pistol killed a 6th grader and injured five more. Police say the shooter also killed himself.

Lubbock County will hold a groundbreaking ceremony tomorrow, at the new medical examiner's office. Voters approved construction of the facility during the November elections. The ceremony is set for 4 tomorrow afternoon at North Holly and East Kent.

Storm systems are causing major problems across the US. Flooding and tornadoes are possible today across the south. Blizzard warnings are in effect in the Texas panhandle, New Mexico, Colorado, and Kansas.

The Texas Tech men's basketball team opened Big 12 conference play with a major win on the road. They defeated Texas, Saturday night, 78-67. 4 red raiders scored double digits, and three pointers proved to be crucial. As the team went 7 of 15 from downtown with the win, head coach Grant McCasland notched the first big 12 victory of his career. Several school districts are delaying the start of class today due to wintery conditions. Lazbuddie and Springlake-Earth will start at 10 am, with buses on pavement only. Plainview ISD canceled classes today.

Be sure to pay attention to road conditions. Much of the northern and northwestern south plains could have snow and ice on the roads this morning. TX-DOT is warning drivers to be careful on areas overpasses, including interstate 27 north of Plainview. Blizzard conditions were also a problem yesterday, in Amarillo. Patchy blowing snow will be possible again this morning. And in eastern New Mexico, the department of transportation there is reporting treacherous driving conditions from clovis to the north. Authorities are asking drivers to stay off the snow packed roads as crews try to clear them.

The investigation continues into an explosion at a hotel, yesterday, in downtown Fort Worth. The blast tore through the bottom two floors, injuring at least 21 people. Authorities say the explosion was most likely caused by a natural gas leak.

US secretary of homeland security Alejandro Mayorkas visited border patrol agents, yesterday, in eagle pass, Texas. He thanked them for their service during a record setting influx of migrants. He also called on congress to pass funding to help frontline workers to do their jobs.

Lubbock County broke ground, yesterday, at the site of the new medical examiner's office, at North Holly and East Kent. Construction is expected to take two years. The new facility is expected to open in the spring of 2026.

The state of Texas is asking the US Supreme Court to reject the Biden Administration's request to remove razor wire at the southern border. The white house says the wire is a danger to border agents and migrants. Texas says the supreme court does not need to intervene because the case is already being litigated.

The group is asking that you leave your porch light on through Friday morning in remembrance of Lubbock police officer Nicholas Reyna, Lubbock Fire Lieutenant Eric Hill and firefighter Matt Dawson. Renya and Hill died four years ago after being hit while responding to another crash. Dawson who was critically injured died in November.

The Lady Raiders are heading back home after a loss to Oklahoma State. Texas Tech fell to the cowgirls 71 to 58 last night in Stillwater. Jasmine Shavers led tech with 17 points. Bailey Maupin added 16. The Lady Raiders now 2 & 2 in conference play will take on Oklahoma in Norman Saturday. Tip-off is set for 2.

The Salvation Army is preparing for the extreme cold headed our way Sunday. Two mobile response teams will pass out food, warm drinks, blankets, and cold weather gear for those without shelter. A van will also provide rides to the salvation army shelter.

A man is facing drug possession and evading charges after a police chase in Hockley and Lubbock Counties. Police say Charles Crockett sped off during a traffic stop, in Levelland, and eventually crashed near Woodrow Road and Upland.

Texas authorities are blocking US border patrol agents from accessing several miles of the Rio Grande, near Eagle Pass. They also added razor wire and fenced off an area, beneath an entry bridge, used as a waiting area for migrants.

Former President Trump's civil fraud trial, in New York, is now in the hands of the judge. Trump and his sons are accused of lying on financial documents to get better rates on loans and insurance. New York's attorney general is asking for 370-million dollars in penalties and a ban on Trump doing business in New York. The judge says he hopes to have a verdict by January 31st.

ERCOT is asking Lubbock residents to help conserve energy due to the sub-freezing weather. You are asked to lower your thermostat and use fewer appliances today. The City of Lubbock will open the Civic Center as a warming center, tonight, for those needing to get out of the cold. The salvation army shelter is also open. However, libraries will be closed today in observance of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. day.

And as you try to stay warm this week there are three key things to keep in mind: people, pipes, and pets. The best ways to keep your pipes from freezing. The first thing to do is let your faucets drip because running water will not freeze. You can protect the pipes on the outside of your home by covering them in blankets or Styrofoam. And open your cabinet doors so the heat in your home can reach those pipes inside.

The White House is demanding that Texas immediately stop blocking US border patrol agents from accessing the border, near Eagle Pass. The Biden administration says Texas authorities prevented agents from possibly rescuing a woman and two children from drowning in the Rio Grande, Friday.

ERCOT is asking Lubbock residents to conserve energy between six am and nine am. The power grid agency says most of the state is dealing with extremely cold temperatures, so demand is higher than usual.

Bitter cold and icy conditions are causing problems across much of the US. Wind chills of minus 30 are being felt across the Midwest. Icy conditions are causing flight delays and dangerous driving conditions in the south, including Texas.

Homeland Security sent a 'cease and desist' letter to Texas over its border policies. The state has until tomorrow to stop blocking border patrol access and remove barriers. If Texas does not comply, the matter will be referred to the justice department.

News/Weather: Reminded listeners of the need to conserve energy during extreme cold temperatures. As well as the need to take it slow during their morning commute.

Pfizer is requesting that a lawsuit, filed in Lubbock, be moved to federal court. Texas attorney general Ken Paxton's lawsuit accuses the company of violating the deceptive trade practices act. He said Pfizer made false claims about its covid vaccine.

The US Supreme Court heard a property rights lawsuit against the state of Texas. A rancher sued the state for damages after a new highway caused his land to flood, in 2017. The state says it cannot be sued due to a technicality in the 5th amendment.

An update this morning about a fire that sparked at a southwest Lubbock restaurant yesterday morning. Happened at the Gas Light near 57th and Aberdeen. Crews were able to put out the flames and no injuries have been reported. It's not yet clear what caused the fire. The restaurant posted to social media that damage isn't excessive but will be closed for the next few days.

Zion Perez and a 15 year old boy are now charged with attempted capital murder after police say they tried to carjack an elderly woman, near 55th and Nashville. Investigators say they shot at a bystander, who tried to intervene, and fled the scene.

A 57-year-old man is in custody after police say he stole a Lubbock police car and falsely detained a Texas Tech student. Keith Kalka is charged with unlawful restraint and impersonating a police officer.

Lubbock Power and Light customers have less than a month to choose a new electric provider. Since the shopping window opened on January 5th, about 10 percent of customers have chosen their new provider. If you are struggling to decide here are some tips. You'll see that the new companies' plans are based on kilowatt hours. LP&L customers paid about 17-cents per kilowatt hour in 2022 and about 14-cents this past fiscal year. Many companies offer a fixed rate plan which is what LP&L customers are used to while others have variable rate plans. Check the fact sheets for each plan on power to choose.org. The shopping window closes on February 15th. If you do not pick a new provider by then, the city will randomly assign you to one of three default providers; TXU Energy, Reliant, or Octopus Energy. The justice department report on the Robb Elementary shooting, in Uvalde, says people would have survived if police had acted sooner to stop the shooter. The families of the victims are calling for officers to face charges for the failed response.

We have more answers to your questions about your LP&L bill after the switch to the competitive electric retail market.

Right now, LP&L handles two services: purchasing power and delivering that power to your home or business. Moving forward, LP&L will only handle the delivery service. That will cost ratepayers 6 point 442 cents per kilowatt hour. You will not receive a bill for this from LP&L. Instead, it will be included in your monthly bill from your new electric provider. Remember, you will still receive a separate bill from the city of Lubbock utilities for water and garbage. We want to let you know about a sewer replacement project that will disrupt traffic in downtown Lubbock starting today. It will run from avenue 'F' and Main to the west side of the Buddy Holly Hall. Drivers are asked to avoid the area. The project is expected to take 6 to 7 months.

Lubbock’s City Council accepted a recommendation to not use amortization to address zoning issues that allow industrial businesses near homes. A citizen's task force recommended the city conduct a zoning map analysis to fix problems areas.

Flags across Texas are flying at half-staff to honor US Navy Seal and Texas Tech graduate Nathan Gage. He fell overboard during a mission off the coast of Somalia. Another Seal Chris chambers died while trying to save him.

NBC News is projecting that Donald Trump won the New Hampshire GOP primary. He leads with 54 percent of the vote compared to 43 percent for Nikki Haley. Trump told supporters Haley needs to drop out.

But Haley says she is just getting started. She vowed to carry on and predicted her numbers will continue to rise in the coming primaries. Haley also questioned Trump's mental health and challenged him to a debate.

Haley and Trump will next face off in her home state of South Carolina in that state's February primary.

A 13-year-old girl is facing charges in connection with a school shooting threat, in Tahoka. Police say she left a threatening note at the elementary school prompting the district to cancel classes. Students will return to class today.

Flooding is possible again today across parts of central and southeast Texas. Nearly a foot of rainfall is causing rivers, creeks, and lakes to overflow. Up to four inches of additional rain is possible today.

The global company has 8 million customers with headquarters in the UK and in Houston.

Octopus Energy CEO Michael lee is encouraging customers to sign up soon while energy rates are still low. He also recommends choosing a 12-month contract.

The City of Lubbock says a new ordinance and more awareness is leading to fewer cut gas lines. The ordinance allows the city to fine contractors that hit gas lines. Crews hit 53 gas lines last year, compared to 72 gas lines in 2022.

Police identified the man killed in a shooting, near 15th and avenue U, as 28-year-old Jonathan Villarreal. Investigators say he pulled a gun during an argument with another man and was shot.

Flood warnings remain in effect, this morning, across east and southeast Texas. Runoff from heavy rain will continue to flow downstream, keeping rivers well above flood stage. Flooding is also possible this weekend across the southeast.

The Pentagon identified the soldiers killed in a drone attack on a US military base in Jordan. Those soldiers are 46-year-old sergeant William Rivers, 24-year-old specialist Kennedy Sanders, and 23-year-old specialist Breonna Moffett. They are the first US troops to be killed by Iranian-backed militant groups since the start of the Israel Hamas war October 7th. 'The Islamic resistance in Iraq' claimed responsibility for the attack.

Two people are in custody after a chase through west Lubbock. Investigators say 32-year-old Gerardo Sanchez sped off during a traffic stop and caused a wreck. Deputies arrested Sanchez and a 16-year-old after they tried to run away.

A disabled Lubbock veteran is warning others after receiving a 219-dollar ticket for parking in a handicap space. Bobby prater says he went into a store and came back out to find a ticket for no handicap decal. He says a law passed in 2022 by the Texas legislature made his disabled veterans license plate invalid. The law requires you to have a handicap placard hanging or the "international symbol of access" on your disabled veterans license place. Prater contested his ticket and is now awaiting a decision.

A confessed Lubbock killer will now spend at least the next three decades in prison. A jury sentenced Kaleb Vasquez to life in prison.
