Federal Fire Policy, ecology and environment, National Drug Policy,	Clear Connections	10/8	600	30	Congressman Greg Walden talks of some of the most important issues affecting southern Oregon. Walden is promoting a major reform of the USFS and BLM's adherence to the so-called "Let It Burn" policy, which he believes lead to this past summer's wildfire and smoke misery. Walden is also promoting a new federal policy to help combat the scourge of opioid addiction.
Truthfulness in Public Discourse, Public communication	Clear Connections	10/15	600	20	Prof. Gleb Tsipursky is the founder of "Pledge of Truth". It's a database of people pledging to fight the trend of "fake news". This movement has been growing by leaps and bounds. A number of prominent public figures have taken the pledge, such

					as globally-known public intellectuals Peter Singer and Steven Pinker , prominent liberal US news personality Ethan Bearman and conservative news personality John B. Wells , Episcopal Bishop Pierre Whalon and prominent atheist activist Aron Ra , and many politicians on the right and left alike (full list here). Altogether, there are over 20 organizations, 40 politicians, and 140 public figures who took the pledge. There are also over 2 thousand ordinary citizens who did so.
Animal welfare	Clear Connections	10/15	620	10	Meagan Flowers from Sanctuary One. Their previously scheduled Casino Night Fundraiser event has been reschedule to October 21 st at Grizzly Peak Winery in Ashland. Tickets are still available at their website. She details the amazing mission they accomplish rescuing farm animals and allowing them to live their lives on their Applegate Valley farm.
Healthcare Reform	Clear Connections	10/22	600	30	President Trump ordered the Treasury to stop Obamacare reimbursement funds from being paid, because Congress had not authorized the payments. We heard from three voices on this issue. 10 minutes with Rick Manning from Americans for Limited Government who said politically it was a winner for the President, saying it might help force reform to the policy. Dr Merrill Matthews, resident scholar at Institute for Policy Innovation, adds that the strain put on the system by the halt in payments will force Congress to address the inequities of the failing healthcare system. Former professor of business law Dr. Dennis Powers adds that in spite of the media criticism, the order from President Trump is constitutionally sound.
Air Infrastructure, local economy, County Government	Clear Connections	10/29	600	20	Airport Director Bern Case discusses his 20+ year career operating the Rogue Valley International Airport. He's proud of the contribution to the local economy, and the massive increases in passenger numbers during his tenure. We also talk over new route announcements, and the potential for additional airlines flying here.
Health and Safety	Clear Connections	10/29	620	10	David Jordan, Regional Ops Director of the SAIF corporation talks of the state's Workman Compensation fund and history, how it helps injured workers. We also discuss SAIF's health and safety initiatives, including healthy results of walking, & pedestrian safety.
Hearing Impaired Services	Clear Connections	11/5	600	10	Representatives from Dogs for the Deaf are promoting that they are now "Dogs For Better Lives". The name change was due to the evolving mission. They train service dogs for many more types of handicaps other than the hearing-impaired.
Waste Disposal, recycling policy	Clear Connections	11/5	610	20	Trent Carpenter General Manager from Southern Oregon Sanitation. There is a building recycling crisis for his customers and other disposal services. China is reducing the amount of recycled materials it accepts, and is raising the "purity" of what it will accept from us. Carpenter says big changes on what they'll accept is most likely in the works for 2018. This, and of course, higher costs.
Personal Health	Clear Connections	11/12	600	20	Dr Robin Miller, local internist, talks about her latest book "Healed". Miller says there are amazing treatments and therapies available these days that have allowed our lifespan to increase. It has fueled her search to step out of the box and find new, innovative ways to help people to heal and be well. Sometimes it requires going back to basics, and other times she ventures into the wild world of new

					science, such as the exploding field of genetics and microbiology.
At Risk Youth Services	Clear Connections	11/12	620	10	Kevin Lamson. Executive Director of Hearts with a Mission discussed their goals of a safe space to come hang out in Medford and Grants Pass for children who find themselves living in an abusive or difficult home life.
Environmental policy, fire abatement policy, county government action	Clear Connections	11/19	600	20	Jackson County Board Chair Colleen Roberts – The board of Commissioners just passed a resolution designed to bring back control over the fire policies on our public lands. This past summer was a miserable fire, smoke, and pollution event due to the Chetco Bar and other wildfires.
Genealogy, researching your family tree, local history	Clear Connections	11/19	620	10	Mary Robson from the Rogue Valley Genealogical Society – Open House coming Thanksgiving weekend. Robson details the massive resources that people researching their family background enjoy at the society. Says they are the largest such society outside of Portland. Great growth in the hobby, especially with the growing popularity of Ancestry.com.
Medical and Personal Health	Clear Connections	11/26	600	15	Dr. Chris Cannon from the Providence Health Heart Center breaks down the latest blood pressure recommendations. The standards have been tightened greatly. People who once had a “borderline hypertensive” condition may now be considered in need of medication.
Mental Health, teen mental health issues	Clear Connections	11/26	615	15	Clinical Forensic Psychologist Dr. John Huber, who operates a 501c3 organization – Mainstream Mental Health. Huber’s goal is destigmatizing mental health issues. A main point of our talk is a recent study in Clinical Psychological Science indicating major problems with teenage depression and suicide when the teens engage in over two hours per day of “screen time”, use of cellphones, computers, other electronic devices.
Human Sex Trafficking	Clear Connections	12/3	600	10	Rebecca Bender is a victim of sex trafficking. She’s founder of the Rebecca Bender Institute. We discuss the Communications Decency Act, and how she’s pushing for a modification to the act, and is pressuring Senators Ron Wyden and Jeff Merkley to do so. The CDA protects website owners from being held liable for illegal acts done by its users, but the act has sparked a trend of people creating websites specifically with the intent of trafficking young boys and girls, yet hiding behind the “hold harmless aspect of the Act.
Net Neutrality	Clear Connections	12/3	610	20	President Trump’s FCC proclaims the Obama so-called “Net Neutrality” rule to no longer be in effect. What does this mean? Dr. Rosalyn Layton joins to discuss. She’s a member of Trump Federal Communications Commission Transition Team and visiting fellow at the American Enterprise Institute. She says the net neutrality name was misleading, and that it required more government control and less private innovation
Healthcare taxation, Oregon Health Plan	Clear Connections	12/10	600	15	State Senator Alan DeBoer explains his reasons for favoring Measure 101, which is being voted on January 23 rd , 2018. DeBoer believes it is the best of a whole bunch of bad decisions, not perfect, but needed to stabilize the funding for the Oregon Health Plan.
Computer Safety	Clear Connections	12/10	615	15	Kim Komando, national high-tech expert, talks of cyber safety, including how now to fall prey to phishing schemes, virus attacks, and identity theft. She’ll be joining KMED’s Saturday morning lineup 1/6/18.

State Economy, government regulatory impact	Clear Connections	12/17	600	15	Kathryn Hickok from the Cascade Policy Institute talks about their latest study that the state of Oregon ranks 8 th Worst in Regulatory burden on citizens. Hickok says this hurts Oregon's poor the most, by restricting new business creation and creativity in business startups.
Firearms Rights	Clear Connections	12/17	615	15	Kevin Starret from Oregon Firearms Federation brings up concerns about the federal Concealed Carry Reciprocity act. He thinks that is a good firearm policy, but recently tied to this bill is an amendment termed "Fix NICS". He says the federal NICS background check system is fatally flawed, and throwing more people into NICS will just explode the rate of "False Positives", and lead to people being unjustly denied their firearms rights.
Federal Government taxation	Clear Connections	12/24	600	15	Congressman Greg Walden talks about the big financial news of 2017 – Congress passes a new income tax bill. Walden says the vast majority of Oregonians will pay less in federal income taxes, and the standard deduction has been increased to the point that tax preparation will be greatly simplified for many,
Healthcare Reform	Clear Connections	12/24	615	15	Dr. Miles Schneider, is author of "Restoring Health to Health Care". He's focusing on the severe challenges of healthcare reform. Schneider indicates that early detection of chronic disease and simple lifestyle changes is proven to eliminate 1 to 2/3rds of the major medical issues. He adds this is Fitness and Wellness, besides medical staying well 2/3rds incontrovertible proof of early detection and simple lifestyle choices. 1/3 to 2/3
