Bennington claims the 3000 dollar or so extra cost is yet another burden on homeowners trying to purchase a home.

Casey, a former White House national space policy advisor, NASA headquarters consultant and space shuttle engineer, tells the truth about ominous changes taking place in the climate and the sun.. Casey's research into the sun's activity, which began almost a decade ago, resulted in the discovery of a solar cycle that is now re-versing from its global warming phase to that of dangerous global cooling for the next thirty years or more. This new cold climate will dramatically impact the world's citizens.

Free Speech, courts, school policy	Clear Connections	12/21	610	20	Constitutional attorney John Whitehead comments on how his organization, The Rutherford Institute, has asked the U.S. Supreme Court to reject a lower court ruling that declared it unsafe for California public school students to wear American flag t-shirts to school. In asking the Supreme Court to hear the case of <i>Dariano v. Morgan Hill</i> , in which several students were ordered by school officials to cover up their American flag t-shirts on May 5, 2010, allegedly because officials feared that other students celebrating the Mexican holiday Cinco de Mayo would be offended, Rutherford Institute attorneys note that the school should have focused on controlling unruly students and not on stifling patriotic speech protected by the First Amendment.
