

**RADIO QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LISTING** RADIO STATION CALL SIGN: WLAU CALENDAR QUARTER: 3rd YEAR: 2023

**Requirements:** Sections 73.3526(e)(12) and 73.3527(e)(8) of the FCC's rules require that every three months each commercial radio broadcast station prepare a listing of programs that have provided by the station to address and treat the most significant community issues during the preceding three month period. The list for each calendar quarter is to be filed by the tenth (10th) day of the succeeding calendar quarter (e.g., January 10 for the quarter October through December, April 10 for the quarter January through March, etc.).

**List contents:** The list must include a brief narrative describing the issues that were given significant treatment and the programming that provided the treatment. The description of the programs shall include, but shall not be limited to, (1) the time, (2) date, (3) duration, and (4) title of each program in which the issue was treated. (Listing ought to include at least 5-10 discrete issues.)

**Retention requirement:** The lists described in this paragraph shall be retained in the public inspection file until final action has been taken on the station's next license renewal application.
