Hi Nancy! I hope you don't mind if I share a couple of thoughts with you--- PGU is in my blood for life I guess :)

Today WPGU showed up in my Facebook news feed, and I was pretty disheartened by what I saw. An album was posted with numerous pictures of Hooters waitresses sitting in the studio--- some photos featured men hanging out outside the fishbowl, the ladies posing with male employees/students, and the ladies sitting with their feet up in the air studio. As a former WPGU Program Director and woman in the broadcast industry, I believe this Hooters feature disrespects the Illini Media legacy.

I should be clear- I do not take issue with anyone who chooses to work at Hooters, or even WPGU taking advertising money from Hooters (to some extent).

What I do take issue with, is the message that this post sends to female members of the Illini Media staff and the Illinois student body as a whole. The University of Illinois is over 50% female, and yet WPGU has never been anywhere close to a 50/50 gender split on staff. Particularly with management positions, PGU has been male dominated. This post was clearly aimed at objectifying these waitresses, and I can't see any place for that in a learning institution.

I'd like to think that PGU could be a place where young women learn broadcast skills alongside the men, possibly management skills, and focus on music and/or news programming content. This place of learning could strive to surpass sexism/objectification (as many legitimate radio stations do), for at least a few hours a day during college. Inevitably, they will get to experience plenty of that objectification out on Green Street any given night and when they enter the real workforce.





I was again forwarded your message regarding our Smashed Cash show. I'm sorry to hear that you were disappointed in the promotion. I will remove your entry from the drawing per your request. But, I do want to have the chance to clear up some of what you've described here.

The Smashed Cash promotion was designed and executed by our promotional staff for <u>the217.com</u>. None of the work was done by radio station staff. Any information you may have received about station staff being involved was simply untrue.

We would certainly hope that our promotional staff told their friends about Smashed Cash. We are really excited about it here and hire student promo staff so that they will likewise get their friends excited about the things we do. The staff that hosted and filmed the cab sessions, however, did not have a choice in who participated. The "pick ups" were in the hands of the taxi driver whose business we were disrupting. Contestants did not have to purchase a cab ride to play. Once they were in the cab, they were told that they had the chance to be filmed and win cash and their ride for free. We did have contestants refuse to be in the video. You would obviously not see these contestants in the edited video.

The editing of the video was done by the production manager of our creative department. This is an adult staffer that I don't believe knows the host, the videographer, or any of the contestants. She chose the clips that fit together, were framed and lit the best, and would make the most funny video. We filmed six hours of video to produce a 3 minute piece. We definitely did cut a lot of what was filmed, and held some back for future episodes. But, I can assure you that the cuts were not made for any of the reasons you've described.

So, a little "behind the scenes" for you. Again, I'm sorrý that you've come away from this with bad feelings.

As I mentioned, I worked at WPGU in '61. Spent way tooooo much time at the station and my grades (or lack therefore of) reflected it. This is when WPGU moved from the huts on what was the parade grounds unit (Hence the call letters - - PGU) to the basement of Weston Hall....and we went from being a closed circuit station, only heard in the dorms and Newman Hall, to FM!!
