**WHY:** OG&E is partnering with agencies that work directly with those in need to distribute these fans as summer temperatures rise. Air conditioners are still the best way to prevent heat-related illnesses. However, with a fan, you can adjust your thermostat by a few degrees to conserve energy and save money. Using a fan will help with the air circulation to keep you comfortable.

**Background:** Each year the fan donation program helps those who are particularly vulnerable to the summer heat. The fans are distributed by the agencies based on individual agency criteria for serving elderly and low-income residents in Oklahoma and Arkansas.

**Information:** The Salvation Army began distributing fans to serving low-income families and senior citizens 65 and older on Monday June 22nd, 2015. Those needing assistance are encouraged to come to The Salvation Army located at 301 N. 6th in Fort Smith. Applicants must have a photo ID, proof of all members of their household and current proof of address (**the proof must be dated within the last 30 days**). Limit one fan per address. A person/household is eligible for a fan once every 2 years.

The Salvation Army is also accepting donations of new fans which can be dropped off at the main office located @ 301 N. 6th in Fort Smith. Donors will receive a tax receipt for that tax deductible donation as well as a Salvation Army Fan Club Member decal.

Officials noted that residents should pay careful attention to water levels if they are around rivers, streams or lakes; monitor weather conditions and forecasts; and avoid driving through water. "Have your sandbags ready. Have a supply a sand ready to go. Be as prepared as you can be," he warned.

During a conference call Friday morning with county emergency managers and elected officials, ADEM Director David Maxwell encouraged the group to be ready for the worst. The area of most concern is along the Red River in Southwest Arkansas, though the Arkansas River could rise significantly again if the heaviest expected rainfall shifts northward.

"The worst of it will be Sunday afternoon through Sunday evening. That's the worrisome part - when people are already settled into their camping or whatever they are doing. That's why we are trying to push out this information ahead of time," said Tabitha Clarke, senior service hydrologist with the National Weather Service in Little Rock. "Rainfall amounts will likely not be as impressive as other events we've had, but because we are already saturated, that's why the flooding will occur, and when the rainfall gets here, it will likely be very intense in a short amount of time."

Rainfall amounts through Monday could total 3-5 inches in the southwest corner of the state, 2-4 inches across much of the western and central portions and 1-2 inches in the east. Because many lakes and rivers are at or near flood stage already, National Weather Service officials have begun issuing flash flood watches for numerous counties.

## UAFS To Offer Summer Sports Camps

FORT SMITH, Ark. – The UAFS athletics department will offer a variety of sports camps for all ages and interests throughout the upcoming summer months. Sports camps will be offered in volleyball, baseball and basketball.  
The following is a list of this summer's camps, a brief description of each camp and contact information for online registration.

### Volleyball

■ **Little Lions Skills Camp (June 8-10):** Campers in kindergarten-seventh grades can refine their skills of the game during this three-day camp. This is a commuter camp for younger players looking to improve their overall volleyball skills. Players will be grouped by talent level and will be given age-appropriate instruction by current UAFS coaches and players. Camp will be held from 9 a.m.-noon each day at the Stubblefield Center, and cost is \$100 and includes a camp t-shirt. ■ **Elite Camp (June 10-12):** This camp is for players in the eighth-12<sup>th</sup> grades looking to develop their skills for their upcoming season. 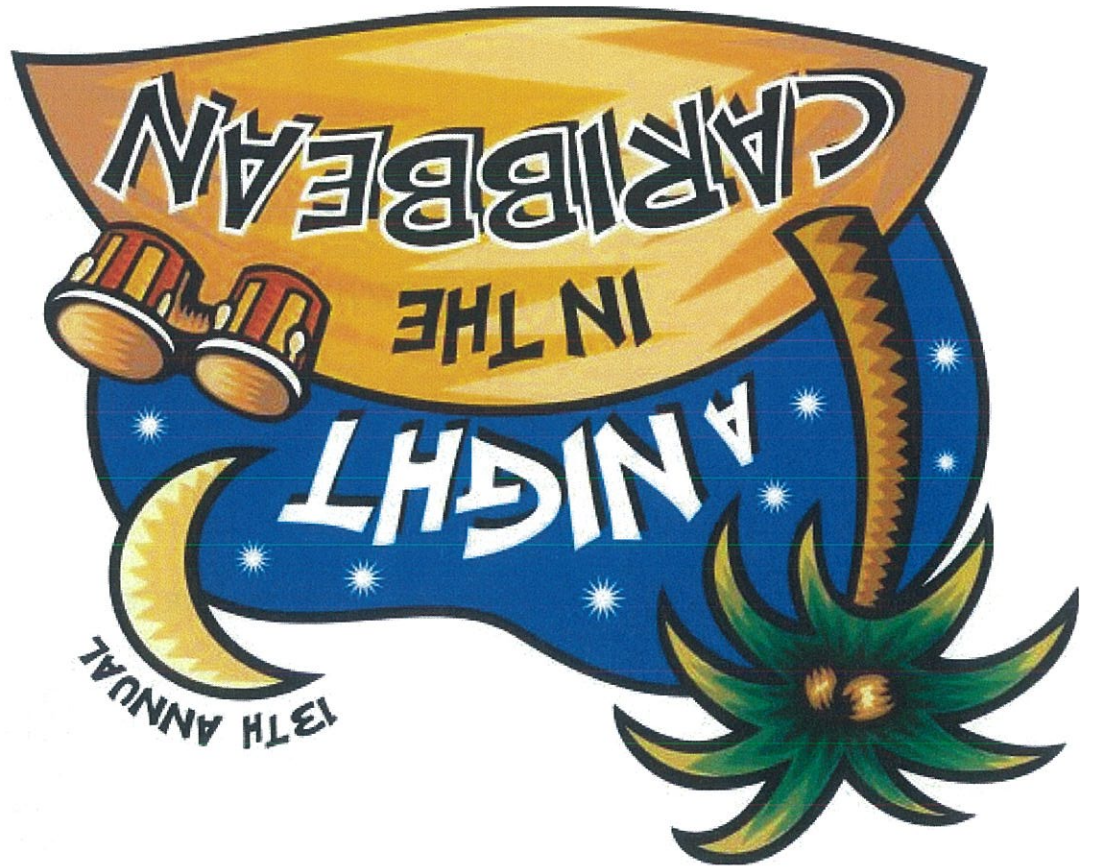

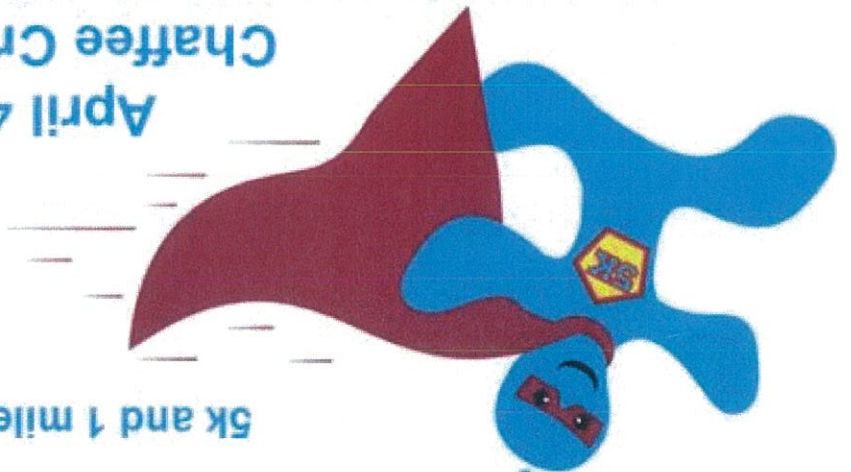
