Recently, Cleveland's North Coast, the City, and its partners announced a draft of Cleveland's North Coast Master Plan. It aims to end what seems like an elusive solution to lakefront development--creating a blueprint for a vibrant and equitable recreational hub for all to enjoy, connecting people with nature, and the city to its waterfront. The City Club of Cleveland discusses Cleveland's North Coast Master Plan, community involvement in its drafting, and what is next to realize a lakefront accessible to all.

Students and administrators have grappled with the task of managing the COVID-19 pandemic, mental health concerns, and political challenges directed at college faculty and curriculum. At the same moment, college and universities in Cleveland have experienced leadership changes. Each president brings a unique approach and perspective to their role.

4. ENVIRONMENT

Teodoro states "For many Americans, water does not get a second thought after pulling their kitchen tap. Yet, more than 30 million Americans lived in areas where water systems violated safety rules at the beginning of last year. Others simply cannot afford to pay. Add to this, headlining stories exposing injustice in water access, like uranium contamination in the Navajo Nation; or lead-tainted tap water in Flint, Michigan." He also explains that rebuilding confidence in American democracy starts with literally rebuilding the basic infrastructure that sustains life.
