### I. Issue: Local Poverty

Program Title: Morning Newscast

Type / Description: The morning news announcer discussed a recent report which indicates that state poverty numbers are higher than previously thought. The report states that 22% of residents are poor families, which is equal to eight million Californians living in poverty. In the local areas of Riverside and San Bernardino Counties, (the IE) one in five people live below the poverty line. The median household income in the IE is a little over \$51,000 per year. The poverty line is just under \$24,000 for a family of four. Dates and locations for surplus government food giveaways was given out for anyone in need of food.

New homeowners could also find out about having mortgage payments lowered. Neighborhood Assistance Corporation of America, hosted one of the largest housing expos in the country. Hundreds of counselors were on hand and workshops were held at the Ontario Convention Center. This was a free event.

Program Title: Walk the Way


