RTA Strike Countdown	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	1/4/2017	11:03p.m.	.90	<p>Tonight we know The Union and RTA will meet down to the wire on Sunday before the strike is set to begin Monday. This will impact so many people and city leaders have not spoken up about it until we asked them tonight. Dayton's Mayor told me there is only so much they can do. Tens of thousands of riders depending on hundreds of drivers, now there's just five days until the busses stop. Mayor Nan Whaley, "It's going to have a pretty tough impact on the city of Dayton and the region., a tough and large impact." RTA's footprint reaches three counties. The hub in downtown Dayton would shut down.</p> <p>Tonight the first time we're hearing from city leaders. Mayor Whaley, "We're getting lots of calls at City Hall I'm assuming the county is too. We truly encourage the people at the table to act and behave like the leaders they are." Mayor Whaley said she and other city staff are still hopeful that the Union and the RTA can reach a contract deal in the 11th hour. Even though they have been negotiating for two years.</p> <p>Tonight RTA CEO, Mark Donaghy released a statement saying both sides are scheduled to meet with a state mediator Sunday. He also said RTA was hoping to meet sooner than that, saying, "It concerns us that the union seems to lack a sense of urgency when the community is depending on them." We reached out to Union President Glenn Salyer who said that's not true and that Donaghey and the RTA took a week to get back to the Union on their request to meet again, before Monday's work stoppage strike. Nan Whaley, "Even though we have no authority, we know how important it is to the community and we are actively engaged in it."</p>

This is the first bus rolling out after the drivers and mechanics were able to come up with a tentative agreement with RTA management. Neither side would give any details about the agreement but both sides had to compromise to find an agreement.</p> <p>Glenn Salyer, President of ATU, "I think they're all excited to get back out there and do their jobs and not worry about their next contract or worry about am I going to be out here in the cold another two days or two weeks. Si I think there is a lot of relief." For the rest of the month, all buses are pay what you want. The RTA Board and the ATU are</p>

					scheduled to vote on the new contract next Tuesday. The new contract if ratified lasts until April of 2019.
Victim Update	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	1/23/2017	11:03p.m.	.63	The victim of the shooting, 16-year-old Logan Cole continues to recover tonight. We're told he has been released from the intensive care unit and remains in stable condition. We've also learned a second student was hit by glass from the gunshots. That student had a pellet lodged in his coat but was not injured. The school superintendent is crediting "Alice" training with ending the threat last Friday. Alice stands for alert, lockdown, I informs, counter, and evacuate. Teachers underwent full training two years ago and receive refresher courses on it every year. Another program, run, hide, fight is a similar plan of action with an average of 20 mass shootings every year in the US. Some are now saying a plan is critical. It's simple if a shooter walks into your workplace, you have three options, run, hide, or fight. To fight you can grab anything to disrupt what they're trying to do. Officer John Davis of the Centerville Police Department, "These people don't prepare for people to fight back. So when you fight back, it puts them off their game." Officer Davis also works with the Miami Valley Crime Prevention Association. "It could be a stapler, it could be a pet rock, it could be a paper weight, it could be a chair or a fire extinguisher, it could be anything that you have available." If it is an active shooter and you can't get out of the building use chairs and tables whatever to barricade yourself inside, but always make sure if the shooter gets into the room or tries to there is another way out.
Hawthorne Suite Drug Bust	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	1/30/2017	11:03p.m.	.90	New video just released of suspects ramming undercover police officers during a shootout at Hawthorne Suites Hotel. Tonight Sheriff Phil Plummer says the guys they were going after call themselves the "Mall Boys," and play a bi part in supplying illegal drugs here in the Miami Valley. Critical moments were caught on dash cam, from an officer with the Range Task Force on Thursday afternoon. One suspect sees the officers coming then the suspects in the truck ram the undercover officers who fire back. as he rammed the second vehicle that forced the vehicle back into our detective, Sheriff Phil Plummer says, after going after Darion Stargell. Mr. Stargell is armed and dangerous, he has made statements that he is not going to go out peacefully and he will shoot it out with police. Plummer says, Stargell is a member of the "Mall Boys," drug trafficking gang. The task force has been working to arrest them one by one, hoping to put a dent in the area's drug supply. It's a challenge for us, I mean we're having some

					success but we're making good pops, we're taking down large gangs but our overdoses are increasing. He says it's frustrating they put their lives on the line to catch drug dealers and keep the public safe, shutting down entire highways, during their manhunt, but drug overdoses have doubled in less than a year. Three suspects were arrested after the operation at the hotel, but the sheriff says their main drug trafficking target got away and is still operating armed and dangerous. Darion Stargell is who is still missing. If you know where Darion Stargell is call 911 or the range task force hotline right away.

Reverend Carl Ruby is heading to The Statehouse in Columbus tomorrow to show his support. We want to see our country respond in a way that is consistent with what America has been in the past, a place that welcomes people who are in need, and I want to see the church be a part of that. Ruby said people from multiple denominations will be there tomorrow pushing for an answer. More protest on the executive action are being planned in Dayton including one on Friday at Courthouse Square at 5:30p.m..

That's what some driver saw in the northbound lanes around 1:30 this morning. A suspected drunk driver heading southbound hit a car head on before slamming into a wall. An odot cam caught the car going the wrong way, the suspect was taken to the hospital. Fortunately, no one else was hurt. This crash comes the same day Ohio State patrol releases a report showing a 25% jump in 2016 for drugged driving crashes.

Jail records show 22-year-old Andres Berdud is charged with burglary and abduction. UD Officials say Berdud is a student. Campus Police say a naked man broke into three campus houses early Wednesday morning. Right now Berdud is only charged in one case, but police think he's behind all three. Officers say during one incident, he tried to grab a woman and prevent her from leaving the room. but she was able to get away and lock herself in a closet. Police want to remind students to lock all doors and windows.
Hamilton Kid Shooting	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	2/25/2017	11:06p.m.	.35	"Can somebody come and put me in handcuffs? Why? I just shot my dad. What? I just shot my dad." A 14-year-old girl from Hamilton will be in court next week after she called 911 and told dispatchers that she shot her father. Police found the man, 71-year-old James Allen Ponder with a gunshot wound to the face Friday. He later died at the hospital. In the 911 call, the girl said she didn't know why she shot her dad and repeatedly said she was sorry. The girl is charged with aggravated murder and is currently in a Juvenile Detention Facility. Her next

Sidney Heroin Hero	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	3/3/2017	11:02p.m.	.37	Sidney Police are taking a personal approach to try and stop a deadly heroin epidemic. Officer Mike McRill reaches out to every overdose survivor in the city to try and get them into treatment programs. McRill even gets the okay from the families of people who died because of an overdose to go to their funerals and try and find people who need help. He says about 25% of the people he talks with take the help. Officer Mike McRill, Sidney Police Department, "I know those 25% sounds like a low number but each one of them is somebody's mother, father, sister, brother, friend, or loved one and that's worth its weight in gold," McRill is the head of the Sidney Addicts Assistance Team. It's modeled after similar programs in the state.
Wife Shoots Husband	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	3/11/2017	11:03p.m.	.23	A woman is in jail accused of killing her husband. Deputies were called to this home on Township Road, in Logan County late last night. According to a press release from the Sheriff's Office, Deputies found 66-year-old Gary Kennedy dead on the kitchen floor. His wife Rosalie Kennedy was arrested and booked into the Logan County Jail on murder charges. Deputies and Agents from Ohio BCI are handling the investigation.
Montgomery County Jail Committee	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	3/21/2017	11:05p.m.	.41	We are hearing from a civilian board member just tapped to look into complaints at the Montgomery County Jail. Several lawsuits filed against the county and jail because of video like this. Hear you can see Amber Swink pepper sprayed in the face while restrained. In another video an inmate is shown being body slammed. At least 8 lawsuits have now been filed. Rabbi Bernard Barsky and Dr. Gary Leroy will co-chair the committee. We talked to Dr. Leroy earlier tonight. Take an objective look at what currently exists, what their current needs are and what we can do to take it to a better place so the inmates that occupy the jail are treated fairly and decently. Seven others will also serve on the committee and Sheriff Phil Plummer will be a non-voting member. The justice committee will look at a range of issues in the jail including the multiple lawsuits now pending.

The Germantown toddler died from blunt force trauma in November 2013. Today in court, Rylee's mom and aunt gave emotional victim impact statements. Your also spoke out professing his innocence. Rylee died terrified and alone with a man she should have trusted. I feel as if Jesse has ripped out our hearts and stomped on it. York was babysitting Rylee the night she went to the hospital. What took place in this courtroom was not the truth, I did not murder Rylee Sellars, I will never admit to a crime I did not commit. York was dating Rylee's mom when she died.
