Troy Bus Cameras	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	1/4/2018	11:08p.m.	.30	The Troy City School District hopes more cameras will get people to stop driving around buses as they are letting kids on and off. It's going to put exterior cameras on new buses it buys. The cameras will be able to catch drivers and their license plates as they illegally pass a stopped bus. Superintendent of Troy City Schools, "We're just trying to keep our kids safe. I mean we've had some kids up here with some close calls. People are busy in the morning, I understand that. They're busy trying to get to work, got a lot of things going on but sometimes they forget about that kids out there." Some older buses will also get cameras. They will be installed on buses that have a lot of complaints about drivers illegally passing on the route.

MLK Dayton is one of many organizations to honor Dr. King today. It's a cold morning but that hasn't stopped people in the past from marching towards Downtown Dayton to honor the work of Martin Luther King, but before the march you can warm up with a warm breakfast. The Centerville Washington Diversity Council will host its 18th annual Martin Luther King Jr. breakfast here at the Golf Club at Yankee Trace, the breakfast starts at 7:30. Later on in the morning at 10 that's when you can march in honor of Dr. King. The march is organized by MLK Dayton and it begins at the Charles Drew Health Center on West Third, where people make their way downtown. Organizers say the larger goal of today's events is to further Dr. King's message of unity and peace all year long. Each year thousands of dollars are raised to support the march and MLK Dayton events with excess funds donated to feed the hungry in the Miami Valley. Organizers recommend you arrive no later than 9:45 for the march. Organizers here for the breakfast in Centerville will open their doors at 7:00. The celebration breakfast which will feature Rev. Dr. Joan Brown Campbell as speaker who worked with Dr. King.

Shutdown Miami Valley	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	1/22/2018	11:02p.m.	.35	The National Museum of the US Air Force at Wright Patterson Air Force Base will remain closed. Many non-essential employees at Wright Patterson will likely be on furlough and not working today. Employees will report to work today to receive instructions and conduct an orderly shutdown of operations. If this seems familiar it happened in 2013. Just like in 2013, all military personnel will work through a shutdown but thousands of civilian employees will be on furlough. In 2013, 8,700 civilian employees were sent home, 3,200 with functions essential to National Security and Public Safety worked. The main difference between now and 2013; now one party in complete control of Government (President, House, Senate, Supreme Court). Senator Sherrod Brown said he wants a long-term deal to be reached. "Secretary of Air Force I had breakfast with at The Pentagon and she told me every time there is talk of shutdown it costs Airforce therefore tax payer dollars and why should we do that instead of passing a long-term budget?" Members of Congress, short term, 4 week budgets, do not want that.

He and his big brother Jeff were matched exactly 3 years ago yesterday, and since then Giovanni has kept him very busy, whether it's UD Basketball games, sledding, movies, they have done it, his grandmother Roberta says she is grateful to have Jeff teach her grandson life lessons among other things. "Jeff has taken him fishing, I don't do that. Jeff has showed him how to change a tire on a bicycle, I could probably do that but it would take me days. Jeff has taught him how to change the oil in the car." The two are very competitive and have a good sense of humor. Last year Jeff was named Miami Valley Big Brother of the Year., As a mentor you do at least two visits a month with your little brother. St. Luke Missionary Baptist Church hosted the event, inviting anyone who was interested in keeping the hospital open. Democratic Candidate for Governor, Dennis Kucinich, spoke at the event, he said he is willing to help. "Premiere may feel like this is over but the people in this community know it is not over and I'm prepared to help them in any way possible, including help to organize legal help, because this community deserves help, and the community deserves a hospital. This was just one effort from the community to keep the hospital open on Saturday. The NAACP held the meeting at a local church. Residents aired their grievances to Premier Health Board

					Members. Some said the hospital is putting money ahead of the community needs. Premier Health says the decision has been made and they won't change their mind about closing Good Samaritan Hospital. Premier Health is offering Miami Valley Hospital as an alternative to Good Samaritan North.
RTA Changes	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	2/19/2018	11:00p.m.	.47	Changes to the RTA are now being rolled out. Some riders will have their routes changed or eliminated and everyone will see fare adjustments. Riders have mixed feelings, confused, angry, and not understanding, either way these changes are happening starting with eliminations. Five routes will be gone and 4 weekend routes, tokens eliminated (Not sold by RTA but for those who currently have them continue to accept through the end of 2018). No more weekend and family passes, no more transfers, which brings us to fare changes. Get a day pass for \$4, which was \$5, this is the only reduction you will be seeing. Adult pass was \$1.75, now \$2, seniors/disabled was .85 now \$1. children are free. clearly a lot of changes. We spoke with an RTA Worker at the South Hub and he said it will definitely be an adjustment. "It doesn't sound like much but if you add it up, you're a regular rider, that can be quite a bit." "If you're not a regular bus rider that's not too bad but even if you don't ride to everyday \$2 every time you get on the bus, that adds up quick."
Child in River	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	2/26/2018	11:03p.m.	.30	Rescue crews will continue searching for a 6-year-old boy who fell into the Great Miami River. Sidney police say he was playing near the river when he disappeared. Now a recovery effort 12 hours later conditions similar dark, terrain, water current. Mosquito Creek in Shelby County near State Route 29 playing with a friend saw him go in, never came out, ran and got an adult that called 911. Deputies were there within minutes, Fire and EMS personnel were right behind. After 3 hours, the search was called off with no signs of the boy. If there is one thing that is clear, it is that these rivers are not places for children to play. "They're just dangerous. Stay away from them, keep small children away from them. One slip in and you're in the situation we're in here which is unfortunate." Last night searchers in air, on ground, in water can expect the same this morning. Also searching were 30-40 community members.

We are told all four people in the home made it out safely. A fire investigator is now working to figure out how it started.</p>

Now we are getting a look at some ideas of overhauling the issue. According to a recent report, the city spent more than 5.9 million dollars over the last 7 years to repair streets. Still a majority of areas are rated in the fair or poor categories. In general the city is discussing a short-term, mid-term, and long-term approach. One option is fixing as they go only the worst areas getting attention. The problem with that too many areas are in that category. The city can also maintain their current plan which it says will result in more widespread deterioration. Brent Merriman, Xenia City Manager, "It's not just about the roadway surface, it's about curbing issues, it's catch basin issues, it's water mad sewer infrastructure. All these component functions that are affected by the streets or affect the streets. So we are trying to come up with a comprehensive solution for all those things." Another plan on the table includes a potential ballot measure for voters. Some residents accuse the city of mismanaging funds. The city manager says they are 100% transparent and have already been filing requests for people wondering about the city's financial reports. A group will meet again in two weeks with a better idea of what direction to go in.</p>
