Glen Helen Armed	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	7/3/2018	11:02p.m.	.36	Tonight police are looking for the suspects behind several robberies in The Glen Helen Nature Preserve. Several victims were robbed at gunpoint, some had their personal belongings stolen. While everyone is safe police still need your help catching the suspects. Cindy Elson has been coming up to the Glen Helen Nature Preserve for years. Cindy says, "I enjoy it, I always love it, I hike for hours at a time," She was surprised to hear that two people were approached by 5 male teenagers and robbed at gunpoint, in broad daylight. Another victim robbed here behind the fire department. One of the victims was a 19-year-old woman hiking alone the trails, and another woman called 911 after she witnessed one of the teenagers assaulting her. The caller says he took \$20 from the 19-year-old and pulled a gun on her. Police says none of the victims including the one referenced in this 911 call reported injuries. Yellow Springs police are still looking for the suspects. The police say they are currently working leads but ask anyone with information that may help to come forward.
Clark County Drug	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	7/9/2018	11:06p.m.	.15	Two people are facing charges after a drug bust in Clark County. Aaron Marshall and Chelsea Dean are booked on trafficking marijuana. According to the police report, Marshall accepted large drug shipments at a home on Summit Street in Springfield. It was worth around \$165,00.00, there were also nearly 70 individually wrapped joints. Investigators also recovered a loaded firearm.
Brown Opioids Fight	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	7/16/2018	11:07p.m.	.22	The number of people overdosing from opioids is down from a year ago, but that doesn't mean the work gets any easier for first responders. Senator Sherrod Brown joined Dayton Police Chief Richard Biel to outline a bi-partisan bill he is leading. It's purpose is to help officers investigate potentially harmful drugs more safely. By using high-tech devices police could detect and identify drugs like fentanyl. If Brown's bill passes into law it would help local and state police get screening equipment to analyze harmful substances. The Power Act, gives Ohio law enforcement officers access to the same high-tech screening devices that customs and border protection agents get. The bill is co-sponsored by Ohio Republican Senator Rob Portman.

Over the weekend, relatives held a vigil for Kayla Ward, who was last seen in July 2013. Twice a year they gather at the fountains in Springfield and release balloons in her honor. Their hope is someone will eventually come forward with information that would help them find her. At this point they don't think she is alive but they just want closure. New detectives have since taken over the case and are still trying to find Amanda.
Stormy Leaves Miami Valley	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	8/6/2018	11:04p.m.	.20	The porn star at the center of President Trump's scandal, Stormy Daniels, performed at Diamonds Cabaret in Washington Township, Friday and Saturday. We checked with the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office and they said no one was arrested either night. Security measures were increased because of her arrest back I'm July while performing in Columbus. Her opening night was calm, with few attendees. Saturday night was busier with a heavier police presence. Trump supporter, Susan Schindel wasn't happy about Daniels appearance in Dayton, but she says the scandal doesn't change her opinion of the President. Crowd control and an increase in traffic was not a factor I'm this weekend's events at Diamonds Cabaret like police anticipated.
Deadly Fire Springfield	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	8/13/2018	11:02p.m.	.30	It happened early Sunday on Wiley Avenue. Firefighters say a man was found at the bottom of the steps near the front door. A second person, yet to be identified was found hours later. Columbia Gas says a gas leak is not to blame but crews were on scene repairing a valve due to the damage from the fire. Springfield's Police Chief is setting the record straight on their response time after rumors the fire department responded to late. "We were 6 minutes and 46 seconds from the time the dispatch center received the call until the first suppression unit was on scene and that is well within the national standard about a minute and a half faster actually." The fire department is holding a press conference about the fire later. We will be there and will bring you the latest information on air and on line.
Body Pulled From River	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	8/20/2018	11:10p.m.	.32	The coroner's office tells us 13-year-old DeAngelo Casey went underwater around 5:30 and never came up. Two water crews from Dayton Fire began the search. Eventually calling for a third boat from Box 21 Rescue. After an hour, a dive team from Wright Patt was called to assist. Divers found DeAngelo's body feet away from the bank near the pedestrian bridge. The Fire Chief is issuing this warning to the public and families who visit these parks. "Rivers aren't safe to swim in due to all the obstructions. We really have problems when there is swift water and people get swimming and kayaks. Things can go wrong very quickly and there is no backup system. Nobody there to rescue them or to help them. Metro park Police say there are several "No Swimming" signs posted along the banks of the river. Police say they just want to avoid another tragedy.

Sunday kids were able to fish there and learn about the dangers of doing drugs from dozens of law enforcement agencies. Officer Involved Shooting	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	9/4/2018	11:07p.m.	.20	An officer involved shooting takes place at a Mental Health Center. The incident happened at The Samaritan Crisis Care Center. Dayton Police say a 38-year-old white man coming down off methamphetamine, was lashing out at hospital staff. After responding to the scene police tried to calm him down, eventually deploying their stun guns, which they say were ineffective. Investigators say the man then lunged at an officer reaching for his weapon. The man was shot in his hip and is expected to be okay. Both officers involved are now on administrative leave. Which is protocol. Dayton Police plan to release more information and a recording of the hospital security video which captured the incident later today.
Charonda Child's Vigil	FOX45 News at Eleven on ABC	9/15/2018	11:02p.m.	.22	An emotional tribute over the weekend for a mother and her baby who died in a house fire on Thursday. The vigil happening outside the burned home on Tampa Avenue. Twenty-three-year-old Charonda Childs lived here with her baby Cassius and her father. The mother and son were the only one's home when the fire broke out, the father was at the hospital. Emotions were high with the family. Fire officials say the fire started I'm the kitchen but the cause is still under investigation. Ohio Task Force 1 is working around the clock since the storm made landfall. For rescue teams, it seems the worst is yet to come. The task force has already done several rescues evacuating mobile homes and pulling people out of flooded vehicles. Rescue teams preparing for severe flooding as river water levels are expected to rise over thirty feet. Ohio Task Force 1 could be stationed I'm the Carolinas for 14 days but say they are prepared to be there even longer if needed.

Hannah's Treasure Chest held a 5-K run/walk race called "The Great Diaper Dash" They asked all the runners and walkers who took part to bring diapers. All the money raised goes right back to the organization. Organizers say a race like this is essential in order to do what they do. "It's really important that we have that support, we have that funding. Diapers are taxed so that also adds another addition to all of that. It's not seen as a basic necessity, it is seen as a luxury item." Williams says this race continues to grow every year. In fact, this year they were able to raise 208 diapers per child which is the most they have ever raised.
