The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has been outside Temple Beth-Or, since the news broke Saturday. The sheriffs say safety is their top priority. Officers say they will be parked and patrolling around the Synagogue for the next couple of weeks. Assistant Rabbi Ari Balliaban says this mass shooting is making them rethink their current security plan and take it to the next level. This was domestic terrorism against Jews of the United States, and the person who made this attack his goal was to terrorize Jews in the United States. We have always taken our security here very seriously and we are in the process of making sure we are doing everything in the way that we need to do it. Rabbi Ballaban says he is meeting with the sheriff's office later this week to go over their current security plan and make adjustments.

The ad is paid for by the PAC Hardworking Ohioans Incorporated, claiming Commissioner Dan Foley was driving drunk in June, when he was pulled over by a Brookeville Police Officer for speeding. Foley says that the ad is inaccurate and misleading. The Fraternal Order of Police believe the negative ad depicts Brookville Police as a corrupt law enforcement agency. I know they do a great job out there and the chief does a wonderful job out there and there is no sense to this at all. I take issue with the fact to looking at some of the reports in the newspaper that candidates can claim that they had no idea that this was going on, you know what that is total bull. The company filed for bankruptcy earlier this year, announcing dozens of stores to close nationwide. Sears is the second big department store to leave the Dayton Mall following Elder Beerman that closed a couple months ago. The company claims the Miami Townships location was unprofitable but some experts say it is decreasing popularity is because of online shopping. Many customers stopping in for the last time were emotional over the store leaving the area. The Dayton location is a part of 228 stores predicted to close by February, including Beavercreek and Piqua locations. This means the Springfield Sears location will be the only remaining store in the area.
Butler Good Sam	ABC22 News at 11	12/4/2018	11:05p.m.	.45	The fight to save Good Samaritan Hospital is now a bi-partisan effort Republican and Democratic Representatives are coming together. To try to prevent the demolition of Good Samaritan Hospital through new legislation. A new bill is looking to allow cities the first option to buy abandoned health facilities, before the owners can knock them down. If the city doesn't buy it and votes for it not to be demolished, it will then be required to be up for public auction. If the network does not follow any of these steps, their non-profit license can be revoked for 20 years. Lawmakers say, in this instance, Premier, which operated the hospital bought it from Catholic Health Initiatives, for the purpose of shutting it down and prohibiting future competition in the Dayton Area. Premier Health closed Good Samaritan back in July, saying it was necessary, due to the "Changing National and Local Dynamics of Health Care." Following the move, local activists filed a Civil Rights Complaint with the US Department of Health and Human Services. Demolition of Good Samaritan has been set for 2019.

DeWine hired former Mississippi Attorney General Mike Moore to spearhead lawsuit against opioid distributors, claiming they engaged in unsafe distribution practices. Another lawsuit was filed in 2017 accusing opioid manufacturers, of participating in fraudulent marketing practices had close to a billion pain meds prescribed in the state of Ohio. Sixty-Nine per man, woman, and child interstate, and that lies at the feet of the drug companies. DeWine will be sworn in next month as governor.
