Issue: Trooper Joey Watson (Illinois State Police)

Synopsis: The death of an infant is an uncomfortable subject of discussion for all parties involved. Earlier this year, the Illinois State Police began a campaign in the hopes of raising the awareness of the dangers of having infants sleeping in bed with their parents. 81% of infant deaths in the last four years resulted from parents sleeping in bed with their child, according to the Southern Illinois Child Death Investigation Task Force. Watson also mentions that in some cases, SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome) is blamed as the reason for the infant's death, but authorities have measures through which they determine the true cause of death. Watson and Tom Miller discuss a partnership between ISP and River Radio to help raise the awareness of the risk of infant death.
