Crime and Public Safety

10-1-19: 6,11

Arson Arrest - Cal Fire arrested a man on charges of setting several arson fires. They say he set them last year during the Camp Fire state of emergency.

10-1-19: 4.6.11

Murder Trial - A man suspected of murdering and hiding another man's body at a house on Bechelli Lane in Redding is going to trial. The judge ruled there is enough evidence to proceed.

10-2-19: 5.6.11

New Firefighter Laws – Gov. Gavin Newsom signed 22 new laws ranging from preventing wildfires, clean energy and higher fire safety standards for homes.

10-3-19: 5.6.11

Escaped Fugitive Search – two teens from the Shasta County Juvenile hall escaped and two schools went on lockdown. Officers brought out the k9s and helicopters and found the escapees a few hours later.

PG&E Blackouts – The energy utility shut power off to tens of thousands of people because of high wind/fire danger.

High Speed Chase and Arrest – CHP arrested a man who led them on a high speed chase on his motorcycle after tried to pull him over

Double Murder Manhunt – Siskiyou County Deputies are looking for the people who robbed and killed two women.

10-18-19: 5,6



New Emergency Center – Orland wants to build a new building to house both fire and police departments and act as an operations center during emergencies.

Needle Distribution Plan – The Butte County Board of Supervisors is talking about whether to approve a free needle distribution plan. Not an exchange.

Sex Trafficking Sting – The Anderson Police Department set up a sting to catch online teen sex predators. They arrested three people.

11-7-19: 5.6

Special Rescue Training:

Butte County Cal Fire's 20 person team is training on how to rescue people specializing in ropes and urban areas, focusing on confined spaces.

11-7-19: 5,6,11

Phone Cord Murder Hearing – New details showing how Larissa Cole was murdered. Someone strangled her using a phone charger cord. Investigators arrested Jerome Dzwonek who they say took cole on a date.

12-2-19: 5,6,11

Canada Murder Suspect in Butte County – deputies arrested Mark Texeira at a home in on Weedy Way. He was wanted in Canada for a 2017 murder in British Columbia. They also found more than 2 dozen pounds of Heroin.

Tehama County Deputy Shortage: It says it doesn't have enough deputies to keep people safe. They say it's because of a funding deficit that's been building for 5 years. The county is proposing a 1% sales tax to help

12-5-19: 5,6,11

CHP Officer Child Porn Arrest – A former CHP officer living in Redding was arrested for child porn. Prosecutors say he received pictures of children having sex

12-11-19: 6,11

Cold Case Murder Arrest: A man has been arrested and charged in a murder from 6 years ago. The judge ruled there is enough evidence to try Matthew Hartman for killing Charles Sweetwood.

12-26-19: 5.6

Am/Pm attempted robbery. Redding police are looking for a man they say tried to rob a convenience store early Thursday morning.

12-31—19: 5,6,11

Warehouse Fire – Firefighters rushed to a massive fire near downtown Chico. It broke out a warehouse housing thousands of gallons of petroleum and other chemicals. No one was hurt and crews managed to keep the fire from spreading.

Wildfires

PG&E Camp Fire Lawsuit – the deadline for victims to file a claim against the utility is approaching. The deadline actually got extended after this story aired

11-7-19: 5,6,11

Camp Fire Housing:

19,000 people flooded Chico after the Camp Fire. Now the city is dealing with a housing shortage. Experts say we will have record breaking numbers for years.

11-18-19: 5,6,11

Another PG&E Power Shutoff – Will these shutoffs become the new norm to mitigate the utility's responsibility in wildfires. The Camp Fire and the Cascade fire both caused by PG&E's equipment.

Education

10-9-19: 5,6,11

High school turnover - Paradise high school is getting its second new principal in less than a year. The first one left after the Camp Fire.

Politics

10-1-19: 5, 6,11

Chico City Council meeting to talk about bringing a commercial airline back to chico

11-12-19: 5,6,11

Chico Council Recall Ends – the group behind the recall called off its effort saying because of a lawsuit demanding voting districts.

11-18-19: 5,11

Cannabis Committee – City Council talking about legalizing marijuana dispensaries within city limits but not in the downtown area.

12-3-19: 5.11

Kamala Harris withdraws from the presidential race. Her polling numbers were down and she says she didn't have the money to keep going.

12-11-19: 5.6

Paradise Town Council appointed a new mayor and vice mayor. This is an annual change in leadership and not because of a recall or controversy.

12-11-19: 5,6

No Confidence Vote – Tehama County employees signed a no confidence vote against Bill Goodwin. They say it's because of poor money management.

12-17-19: 5,6,11

Impeachment Rallies – both Redding and Chico had Pro and Anti impeachment rallies. Hundreds of people showed up at each rally. For the most part it remained peaceful but a scuffle did break out at the one in Chico

12-24-19: 5,6,11

Chico Districting: The city released 6 proposed maps on how to split the city up into voting districts instead of having every council member running at large. This comes after a Hispanic group filed a lawsuit claiming they were not fairly represented.

Environment



10-1-19: 5,6,

Hazardous Tree Removal - Butte County is removing hazardous trees that burned in the Camp Fire. They're getting \$780,000 from Fema to remove trees are either in on public property or in danger of falling on public property.

10-18-19: 5.6

Reservoir Replacement Grant – Paradise Irrigation District voted to move forward with applying for an USDA grant. The money would go toward two water storage tanks for about \$11M

Health

10-2-19: 5,6,11

Meningitis Scare – At least one person went to the hospital after Urgent Care told them to as a precaution after showing signs of Meningitis.

10-2-19: 5.6.11

Flavored Tobacco Ban – Oroville could soon outlaw flavored tobacco in the city. The ban would apply to all vaping products.

11-9-19: 5,6,11

Needle Distribution Debate – The first weekend of needle distribution took place and it got mixed reviews. People who live near the distribution zone think crime will increase while those participating think it will help with crime.

Think Pink – Redding's annual breast cancer awareness campaign is underway. The group is organizing pub crawls, 5k runs and more to raise money and awareness about breast cancer.

Governor Gavin Newsom signed new laws into effect that would offer more mental health support for police and firefighters
