**OTR-SE807 – Holiday Shopper Safety** Troopers offer advice on how to make driving during the holidays safer and less stressful. Allow extra time for heavy traffic and delays. Even if you're in a hurry, you still need to watch your speed and obey traffic lights and signals. Be alert at intersections and watch out for other drivers who fail to yield the right of way.

**OTR-D0008 – Safety is the Best Gift** PSA includes a holiday song with driver safety tips like, wearing a seat belt and avoiding alcohol before driving.

**OTR-SE815 – New Year's Eve** After midnight is one of the most dangerous times of day to be driving, especially on New Year's Eve. If you're going out and plan to be drinking, make sure and designate a driver in advance. If you don't have a friend to drive you home, take a cab or take advantage of one of the free ride programs.

**OTR-10SE01 – Collegiate Alcohol Awareness Month** October is National Collegiate Alcohol Awareness Month. Texans age 17 to 24 account for about 25 percent of all drinking and driving deaths in the state.<sup>1</sup> And, getting a DWI can cause problems beyond graduation and will affect getting a job.

**OTR-F103R – Smart Drivers Rev.** Many new cars on the road have smart features that tell you when to brake or if you are hydroplaning. But most drivers don't need those features, they just need to be smart drivers. Watch your speed, buckle up and don't drink and drive.

**OTR-JA104R – Safety Seat Inspections Rev.** For a child safety seat to work correctly, it has to be properly installed. You should check both the seat manufacturer's instructions and your vehicle owner's manual when installing the seat. And, once your child is placed in the car seat, you want to be sure that the harnesses fit snugly. There should be no visible slack in the harnesses.

**OTR-OT012R – Safe and Sober Halloween Rev.** This Halloween, make sure you designate a driver in advance. Don't wait until your whole party has begun drinking before you say, "Ok, well you're the least drunk so you drive." It's important the person driving has no alcohol, so make sure that your designated driver has lots of sodas, water or something else to drink.

**OTR-SE906 – Minors and Alcohol** Texas has a "zero tolerance" policy for minors and alcohol. A minor can be fined up to \$500 for driving with any amount of alcohol in their system. They can lose their driver license and may have to take alcohol awareness classes or do community service. Those over age 17 can even spend time in jail.
