Then, we speak with Deputy Administrator Tristan Brown from the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration. Recent neo-Nazi demonstrations in Georgia have brought new attention to proposed state legislation on anti-Semitism.

Two small groups gathered outside of synagogues in Macon and Cobb County on Friday and Saturday.

Democratic State Representative Esther Panitch of Sandy Springs is the General Assembly's only Jewish member and a cosponsor of House Bill 30.

It would formally define anti-Semitism in state law.
