PROGRAM: *48 Hours Mystery*  
DATE AIRED: 07-03-2007  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Endgame" - a follow-up to 48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Where Is Mrs. March?" Janet Levine March, a wife and mother of two young children, disappeared on August 15, 1996. In December 2004, a grand jury indicted her husband, Perry, for her murder, based on circumstantial evidence. March, while in a Nashville jail waiting trial and fearful of the possible testimony of his wife's parents, Carolyn and Larry Levine, solicited fellow inmate and convicted felon Russell Nathaniel Farris to murder them. Farris played along, but in reality cooperated with the police and secretly recorded his conversations with both March and March's father, Arthur, who also became implicated in the murder plot. In a videotaped deposition played at the trial for Janet March's murder, Arthur March revealed how Perry had killed Janet, and how her body, with his help, was ultimately disposed of.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: MINTON NEWS CONFERENCE - Police have a suspect in the disappearance of Alicia Minton, who's been missing since June.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: DONATION JAR THEFT -Surveillance video showed a man stealing funds from a donation jar for a boy's shelter set up inside a liquor store.

PROGRAM: *48 Hours Mystery*  
DATE AIRED: 07-07-2007  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: "A Knock On The Door" - in 1982, in the town of Olathe, Kansas, a young banker named David Harmon was bludgeoned to death in his bed. His wife Melinda told authorities that two men intent on robbing the bank where David worked had broken into their home and committed the crime. Investigators believed, but could not prove, that Melinda was involved in a secret affair with family friend Mark Mangelsdorf, and that the two were involved in David's murder. Nearly 20 years later, armed with new forensic technology, police zeroed in on the couple. Melinda was tried and found guilty of murder and conspiracy to commit murder. Facing a sentence of life in prison, she offered the prosecutor information about what happened the night of the murder in exchange for a lighter sentence.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Searching For Secrets" - In early September 2005, 17-year-old Taylor Behl, a Virginia Commonwealth University freshman, disappeared from the Richmond campus. A police investigation eventually uncovered her association with Ben Fawley, a 38-year-old man who confessed to having sex with Taylor. After the discovery of Taylor's body, Fawley claimed that Taylor had wanted to have a sexual experience which included bondage and erotic asphyxia--she wanted to pass out during sex--and that she accidentally died during this activity. In a plea bargain at his trial, Fawley was sentenced to 30 years in prison.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: CLUB AT THE CREEKS FOLO - We went back to Club at the Creeks, a Fayetteville apartment complex, where three murders took place in the last year, to talk to residents about the crimes.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: Shooting Tigers - a report on the devastating impact of poachers upon the dwindling number of tigers now remaining wild in the Indian jungles.

His wife Nancy was convicted of his murder and is now serving a life sentence. In 2006, his brother, real estate developer Andrew Kissel, was murdered in his Greenwich, Connecticut home. At the time of his death, Andrew Kissel was facing a federal bank fraud charge and state grand larceny and forgery charges. His murder is still under investigation.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: DIRKSMEYER RECAP - We looked at the week's high points in the trial of 21 year old Kevin Jones who is charged with first degree murder in connection with the beating/stabbing death of his girlfriend, 19 year old Nona Dirksmeyer.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: A Not So Perfect Match - A report on the ethical implications of using familial searching, an FBI technique which scours databases of the DNA of convicted felons, deliberately searching for partial matches that could indicate that a crime was committed by a relative of the person whose DNA presented a partial match.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: CAR BREAK-INS - Three arrests have been made in connection with 16 car break-ins across Fort Smith.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Jeffrey MacDonald: Time For Truth" - a report on the 1970 murders of U.S. Army Doctor Jeffrey MacDonald's pregnant wife and two young daughters at their Fort Bragg

home in Fayetteville, N.C. From the day following the murders 35 years ago, MacDonald has maintained that a group of crazed, drug-fueled hippies broke into his apartment and murdered his wife Collette and daughters--five-year-old Kimberly and two-year-old Kristen. It took the U.S. Government nine years to make its case against him, but in 1979, a jury convicted MacDonald of three counts of first-degree murder--a conviction based entirely on circumstantial evidence. Since then, MacDonald and his lawyers have exhausted every avenue of appeal. Married behind bars over two years ago, MacDonald's request for parole was denied. He is hoping that DNA testing being done on hair and blood evidence from the crime scene will confirm that he did not kill his family.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Millionaire Manhunt" - follow-up to 48 HOURS INVESTIGATES: "Journey To Justice". After a review of the circumstances surrounding the 1987 murder of Lita McClinton Sullivan and the subsequent police investigation of her husband, Jim Sullivan, the program follows Sullivan's extradition from Thailand in 2004 and his ensuing Atlanta, Georgia trial and conviction for his wife's murder.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: "The Death of Timothy Souders" - an investigation into the death of a mental patient who died in a Michigan prison, in solitary, of dehydration.

PROGRAM: *48 Hours Mystery*

DATE AIRED: 07-24-2007

PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Dangerous Liaisons" - a report on the July 2003 murder of Sandra Rozzo of Pinellas Park, Florida, including background and surrounding circumstances, and the police investigation that led to the eventual conviction and imprisonment of her ex-lover Timothy 'Tracey' Humphrey and his wife Ashley Laney Humphrey.

PROGRAM: *48 Hours Mystery*

DATE AIRED: 07-28-2007

PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Murder Comes Knocking" - In July 2004, 27-year-old Jarrod Davidson was shot to death outside his apartment in Santa Barbara, California. Estranged from his ex-wife, Kelee, Jarrod had been scheduled to go to court to try to get full custody of his daughter Malia. Jarrod had opened his front door to retrieve the delivery of a potted plant. DNA, found on the plant's card holder, was tested and matched that of his former mother-in-law, Mindy Jones. Neighbors had reported seeing two suspicious looking people quickly leaving Jarrod's apartment complex. After further investigation, Kelee's parents, Philip and Mindy Jones, were arrested for the murder of Jarrod Davidson. Philip confessed to the killing, but only securing an agreement from prosecutors that his daughter Kelee would not be tried for the murder. Philip Jones claimed that he murdered Jarrod because Jarrod was molesting Malia. This claim was disproved. Philip was sentenced to life in prison with no parole. Mindy Jones claimed amnesia, but was also found guilty of murder and received the same sentence as Philip. Kelee was allowed to plead guilty to three lesser charges: accessory to murder and two counts of perjury. She was sentenced to four years in prison. Malia is being raised by her paternal grandparents, Richard and Susan Davidson. Kelee Davidson is expected to be released from prison in July 2007.

DATE AIRED: 07-29-2007

PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Prisoner 05A4820" - an interview with former Tyco CEO Dennis Kozlowski. Convicted of stealing more than \$100 million from Tyco, he is now serving an 8-to-25-year

sentence. He maintains he is not guilty of the charges.

DATE AIRED: 07-30-2007  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: BIKER STABBINGS - A motorcycle rally in Eureka Springs ended in violence when members of the Hell's Angels got into a knife fight with members of the Banditos.

PROGRAM: *48 Hours Mystery*  
DATE AIRED: 07-31-2007  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: "The Puppet Master" - A report on the marriage of Heather and Ron Samuels, who, even after divorcing, were involved in a bitter custody battle. In October 1997, newlyweds Heather and John Grossman were shot at while driving. John survived the shooting but a bullet severed Heather's spinal cord, leaving her a quadriplegic. Heather was immediately certain that ex-husband Ron was involved in the crime, as he had once threatened to make her pay for leaving him. Investigators were able to track down three men who they believed were involved in the assault: Hugh Estess, the car owner; Eddie Stafford, the driver, and Roger Runyon, the shooter. Also implicated was Geoff Pollock, who was present at meetings when the crime was discussed. Ron Samuels was named as the man behind the crime--the puppet master. In exchange for complete immunity, police got the co-conspirators to acknowledge Samuels' lead role in the crime. Before Samuels could be arrested, he fled to Mexico. He ran afoul of the law there when police found six kilos of cocaine in his car. He was imprisoned and, five years later, still proclaiming his innocence, he was extradited to the U.S. to stand trial for the attempted murders. He was found guilty of all charges and sentenced to life in prison for the attempted murders, plus an additional 120 years for the other charges. The court ordered Samuels to pay Heather restitution, but he claims that he's broke. Investigators are tracking any remaining assets.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: MAN IN COMA - Keith Watkins was hit by an SUV and left for dead in Madison County. Police are looking for the driver who did this.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: KIDS IN UHAUL - A Benton County man is in trouble with the law after a deputy pulled him over and discovered two children locked inside his Uhaul.

PROGRAM: *48 Hours Mystery*  
DATE AIRED: 08-04-2007  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: Chamber Of Secrets - in her divorce case, Frieda Hanimov feared that she would lose custody of her children because she suspected that the judge ruling on her case was corrupt. Having gone to authorities with her suspicions, Hanimov agreed to go undercover and, wearing a wire, she went alone into a warehouse to try to prove that New York State Supreme Court Judge Gerald Garson was corrupt. A taped conversation with Nissim Elmann, the judge's confederate, was enough evidence to have the Brooklyn District Attorney grant permission to place a hidden camera in Judge Garson's chambers. Prosecutors caught Judge Garson on videotape taking a gift for legal advice, giving a lawyer advice on how to write a legal memo on a case before him, and accepting a \$1,000 referral fee.

PROGRAM: *48 Hours Mystery*  
DATE AIRED: 08-04-2007  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: The Sweetheart Murders - In December 1980, college sweethearts Sabrina Gonsalves

and John Riggins were brutally murdered in Davis, California. No progress was made towards solving the case until 2002, when Joel Davis, a high school friend of John Riggins, persuaded police to re-examine the semen stains discovered on a blanket found in the victims' abandoned van. Using advanced DNA technology, the police were now able to match those samples to Richard Hirschfeld, a convicted rapist who had been paroled in July 1980 and whose DNA was stored in the FBI database. Police then interviewed Hirschfeld's younger brother, Joe--who committed suicide the day after the police interview. In his suicide note, Joe said that his brother Richard had killed Gonsalves and Riggins, and that he himself had lived with this horror for twenty years. Police assume that Joe helped his brother leave the murder scene. Richard Hirschfeld is now charged in the double murder.

DATE AIRED: 08-05-2007

PROGRAM SUMMARY: The Phantom of Corleone - a report on the ongoing pervasiveness of the mafia in Italian business and government. In April 2006, Bernardo Provenzano, head of the Sicilian mafia and a fugitive for 43 years, was captured near the Sicilian town of Corleone but his capture is expected to do little to curb the ubiquitous influence of the mafia.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: LAWS BURGLARY - A quick thinking employee caught the suspect in a drug store burglary and held him until police arrived.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: Prime Suspect - a report on Marty Tankleff who, as a 17-year-old, was convicted of murdering his adoptive parents Seymour and Arlene Tankleff in their Belle Terre, Long Island home. Tankleff's relatives believe that Marty, now 33, is innocent and hope that a new trial will set him free.

PROGRAM: *48 Hours Mystery*

DATE AIRED: 08-11-2007

PROGRAM SUMMARY: Dangerous Reunion - In 1981, a series of sexual assaults targeting members of the Castleberry High cheerleading team occurred in and around River Oaks, Texas. In January 1982, the body of Retha Stratton, a former Castleberry High cheerleader, was discovered by her roommate--she had been stabbed 38 times with a kitchen knife. Fort Worth Police Detective Dennis Timmons quickly focused his investigation on Wesley Wayne Miller, former captain of the Castleberry High football team. Miller had been suggested as a suspect in the sexual assaults, but was never questioned. This time there was more evidence. Within 48 hours, Wesley Wayne Miller was charged with the murder of Retha Stratton. Initially, Miller denied involvement, but once presented with the evidence, he confessed. Stratton had not been sexually assaulted, but police were able to match Miller's fingerprints to one of the sexual assault crime scenes. The murder trial began in October of 1982 and two weeks later, Miller was found guilty and sentenced to twenty five years in prison. The jury in the murder trial was prohibited from hearing anything concerning the sexual assaults and believed he deserved a second chance. Without DNA testing, prosecutors went forward with the most airtight sexual assault case, but eventually agreed to a plea deal of twenty years, which would be served concurrently with the murder sentence. Rona Stratton, Retha's sister and Lisa Ticknor Gabbert, a close friend of Retha's and one of Miller's victims were devastated to learn just how quickly Miller would become eligible for parole and made it their mission to keep Miller in prison. By 1991, due to a mandatory release law established to ease prison overcrowding, Miller had enough credit for good behavior and qualified for early release. Miller was arrested again for attempted assault and sentenced to five more years.

Released again in 1998 to a county jail, Miller refused to attend sex offender counseling and as a result, was returned to prison. With his twenty five year sentence almost over, Rona and Lisa attempted to have Miller classified as a sexually violent predator under civil commitment--a law which Rona was instrumental in getting passed. Two convictions for sex crimes are required in order to be committed and if successful, Miller would become the first murderer to be classified as such. Chief Prosecutor Joey Robertson argued that Retha's murder was the very definition of a sex crime and was the last barbaric act of a serial rapist. The jury agreed. As a result, upon Miller's release, he will be subject to the same intense monitoring as the worst sex offenders. On March 9, 2007, Wesley Wayne Miller was released from prison. He is housed within 25 miles of Rona and Lisa.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: Stop Snitchin' - a report on how the hip-hop culture's message to shun the police has undermined efforts to solve murders across the country.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: NEOSHO INVESTIGATION - A Neosho, Missouri man is accused of killing three people and wounded five more when he took a gun inside a Neosho church.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: BANK ROBBER ARREST - Police say they've solved a string of bank robberies in the river valley and northwest Arkansas with the arrest of 26 year old Michael Holloway.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: ESCAPEE AFTER WIFE - The ex-wife of a prison escapee is afraid the criminal is coming after her.

DATE AIRED: 08-25-2007  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: Two Wigs, A Gun And A Murder - when Fred Jablin, a Richmond (VA) University professor and devoted father was gunned down in his driveway on Oct. 30, 2004, his ex-wife, Piper was the prime suspect. When the couple divorced after 19 years of marriage, Jablin won custody of their three children, and, at the time of Jablin's murder, Piper owed him about \$7,000 in back child support. Circumstantial evidence, including an airline ticket, two wigs and gas purchased in the Richmond, VA area--all with a credit card in the name of Piper's former boyfriend--indicated that Piper had masqueraded as her older sister Tina in order to kill her husband. It was also found that she had practiced with a 38-caliber revolver at a Houston shooting range four days before the murder. Piper Rountree was arrested, tried, found guilty of first degree murder and sentenced to life in prison. Her sister, Tina, was charged with evidence tampering and will be tried this fall.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: Was It Murder? - an interview with Dr. Anna Pou, a New Orleans physician arrested, along with nurses Cheri Landry and Lori Budo, for the murder of four patients by lethal injection, at Memorial Medical Center, a hospital left isolated and without power in the days after Hurricane Katrina.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: PEREZ SENTENCING - George Perez raped a 10 year old girl outside a Rogers's elementary school and is now waiting to find out his sentence.

PROGRAM: *48 Hours Mystery*  
DATE AIRED: 09-01-2007  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Murder on His Mind" - In April 2005, Stephen Stanko murdered his girlfriend Laura Ling, and then raped and stabbed her daughter. Shortly afterwards, he killed a friend, Henry Turner. Previously, in 1996, Stanko had served an eight year prison term for assaulting his then-girlfriend, Elizabeth McClendon. Stanko claimed he had no memory of these events. At his trial for the murder of Laura Ling, Stanko's lawyer called on medical experts who claimed that PET scan images of Stanko's brain revealed that he was born with a brain defect, a neurological dysfunction that made him psychopathic and, on occasion, temporarily insane. Medical experts for the prosecution contested this claim. A jury found Stanko guilty and recommended the death penalty. He will again face the death penalty when he is tried for the murder of Henry Turner. His lawyer will continue to argue that he has a brain defect.

PROGRAM: *48 Hours Mystery*  
DATE AIRED: 09-08-2007  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: "To Catch A Killer" - On December 3, 1997, when several family members didn't show up for a birthday party, Phil and Nicoletta Dosso drove to their business in Bartow, Florida to search for them. There, they made a grisly discovery - the bodies of their daughter, Diane Patisso; her husband, George Patisso; their son, Frank Dosso; and their longtime business partner and friend, George Gonsalves. All four of them had been shot execution style and the killer had been extremely careful - no fingerprints, DNA or murder weapon was found. Special Agent Tommy Ray investigated more than one thousand leads, but all were dead ends except for one - Nelson Serrano. Serrano, a former business partner, had been accused of theft by Dosso and Gonsalves and eventually forced out. But Serrano had an alibi - he claimed to have been in Atlanta, Georgia at the time of the murders. However, hotel lobby video footage from Atlanta, cell phone records, an admission by Serrano's nephew, Alvaro Pennaherrera that he rented a car for his uncle, as well as Serrano's fingerprints on two airport parking tickets from Orlando, Florida further cemented Ray's belief in Serrano's guilt. Four years after the homicides, Serrano was indicted. However, months earlier, Serrano and his wife had returned to their native Ecuador - a country with no extradition treaty with the United States. Special Agent Ray traveled to Ecuador to see if there was a loophole which would allow him to

arrest Serrano. One came after it was revealed that Serrano had given up his Ecuadorian citizenship when he had become a US citizen. With that information, Serrano was arrested and deported back to the United States. Serrano and his family claimed that his Ecuadorian citizenship was reinstated when Ecuador's constitution was changed and that he was denied an attorney. Nine years after the killings, Serrano went on trial. The jury reached a verdict in only six hours - guilty of four counts of first-degree murder. Nelson Serrano is under a suicide watch while he awaits sentencing. Ecuadorian legislators want to investigate Nelson Serrano's deportation to the United States.

McCowen, Worthington's garbage man, was arrested for her murder. McCowen denied knowing Worthington until he was presented with the DNA evidence against him. With that information, McCowen admitted to having had sexual relations with Worthington and that he had beat her, but he blamed her murder on his friend, Jeremy Frazier. However, Frazier's DNA wasn't found anywhere on Worthington's body and he had an alibi. McCowen's attorney, Bob George, believed that McCowen's race, class, drug use, and low IQ made him an easy target and that McCowen and Worthington had been involved in a consensual sexual relationship. George believed that the police had bungled the investigation and that the case was based on the inability to imagine an actual relationship between the two. McCowen never testified. The jury found him guilty of first degree murder and sentenced him to life in prison without the possibility of parole. Attorney Bob George claims he has evidence of racial bias on the jury and has filed a motion for a new trial.

She claimed that he had been abusive and suggested that his disappearance and murder were the result of his gambling problem and that his frequent trips to Atlantic City had put him in contact with shady characters. However, a blanket wrapped around Bill's torso was the same kind of blanket used at the fertility clinic where Melanie worked as a nurse, making her a suspect. After extensive searches, police were unable to find a murder weapon or tool used to cut up Bill's body, and there was no evidence of a crime scene. Soon afterwards, police learned that Melanie had purchased a Taurus .38 special revolver just 48 hours before Bill had disappeared. Melanie, however, claimed that she had purchased that gun for Bill at his own request. She claimed he wanted it for his own protection, but couldn't buy it himself because of a felony conviction. Believing her to be guilty, Prosecutor Patti Prezioso intensified her investigation and had Melanie put under surveillance. This soon revealed two of Melanie's secrets -- she had been carrying on an affair for more than two years with her boss, Dr. Brad Miller, and she had been in Atlantic City the night after she claimed Bill had left her. She later stated that she had gone to Atlantic City in search of Bill, had found his car and moved it out of spite. Thirteen months after the suitcases were found Melanie McGuire was arrested for the murder of her husband. Nine months after her arrest, the trial began. After seven weeks and more than seventy witnesses, Melanie McGuire was found guilty and sentenced to life in prison. She will be eligible for parole in 2073, when she would be 100 years old.
