PROGRAM: *5News at 5:00pm*  
DATE AIRED: 01-05-2006  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: ELDERLY ABUSE/MURDER CHARGE - This story dealt with new charges against a middle-aged Benton County man whose mother died while in his care. Murder charges were filed because of the dire condition of the elderly mother. She was found stuck to the couch cushions in her son's home, and apparently mal-nourished.

DATE AIRED: 01-08-2006  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Mafia Cops?"- ex-New York detectives Stephen Caracappa and Louis Eppolito are charged with the murders of 10 people, murders committed on the orders of a Mafia boss. In an interview, Caracappa calls the charges ludicrous. Includes a portion of an interview ("The Most Feared Gangster" OAD: 09/20/98) with mob boss Anthony "Gaspip" Casso; and an interview with Ed Hayes, Caracappa's attorney. DATE AIRED: 01-17-2006  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: DIRKSMEYER MURDER - We traveled to Russellville, where an Arkansas Tech University student was murdered on December 15, 2005. It had been over a month since the beauty pageant winner was found beaten to death in her off-campus apartment. After weeks of investigation and over 50 interviews, the police department was set to turn over their file to the prosecuting attorney. While police say they had narrowed their list of suspects to only one, they have yet to make an arrest. We spoke to the prosecutor, who said he was trying a case and it would take him up to a week to go through the extensive investigation file.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: POSED AS PET RESCUE - In this story, we reported the arrest of a couple from Fayetteville, who was arrested after police found over 40 animals in their small apartment. Police said the couple

posed as a pet rescue, but were really taking in pedigreed animals and then reselling them for a higher price. Many of the animals were underfed and unwell. The animals will be adopted out. The couple is charged with animal cruelty.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: FBI RAID - In this story we covered the FBI raid of several Fort Smith businesses in one day. We informed the public of what items were taken and what witnesses saw happen. The story was immediate since raid occurred all day long. We spoke with the businessman under investigation and detailed some of the businesses he owned. We also showed agents swarming his car lot and import business.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Prisoner Of Pain"- a report on Richard Paey, an accident victim who was convicted for drug trafficking and sent to prison for 25 years for his use of massive amounts of painkillers to fight chronic pain. Includes interview with Paey's wife Linda; Scott Andringa, Florida State prosecutor; and Dr. Russell Portnoy, Chairman, department of pain medication at New York's Beth Israel Hospital. PROGRAM SUMMARY: WALMART EXECUTIVE PLEADS GUILTY - Tom Coughlin, former vice chairman of the world's largest retailer was in Federal Court in Fort Smith to plead guilty to wire fraud and filing a false tax return. Coughlin, who was once second in command at Wal-Mart, fell from grace after charges were filed claiming Coughlin used company money to purchase personal items. Coughlin faces three years in prison and a \$100,000 fine.

DATE AIRED: 02-04-2006  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: GAY BAR SLASHER CAUGHT IN ARKANSAS - It was a deadly day in Arkansas after the suspect in an attack in a Massachusetts bar was found in Gassville. When the pursuit ended in Norfolk, two were dead and the suspect, 18 year-old Jacob Robida was taken to the hospital with bullet wounds to his head. Investigators believe Robida went to a gay bar in New Bedford, Massachusetts early Thursday morning with a gun and a hatchet. He injured three, one critically. Robida then picked up a 33 year old woman, whom he had a relationship with, and the pair drove

to Arkansas. In Gassville, an officer stopped Robida's car. Robida reportedly shot and killed that officer. Police chased Robida into Norfolk, where he was finally captured. The woman inside his car had been shot to death.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: "The Prince Of Pot" - Marc Emery, aka "The Prince of Pot," is leader of a marijuana legalization movement in Canada. Emery has been running a thriving mail-order marijuana seed business with little interference FROM Canadian officials. However, officials in the DEA want him extradited to the United States where he can be prosecuted for selling drugs to Americans. Includes interviews with John McKay, U.S. Attorney for the western district of Washington State; and Rodney Benson, DEA Special Agent. (C: Bob Simon - P: Catherine Olian)

DATE AIRED: 03-09-2006  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: POLICE KILL MENTALLY DISABLED MAN - In this story we spoke with an eye witness at the scene just minutes before 21-year-old Erin Hamley was shot and killed by Arkansas State Trooper, Larry Norman. Norman reportedly shot Hamley after receiving a call that Hamley matched the description of a missing 18-year-old prison escapee from Michigan. According to police, Hamley had five officers aiming weapons at him, but refused to raise his hands. Hamley's mother believes Hamley would not have understood what to do. We also profiled the trooper and his record as an officer.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Brutal" - an interview with Kevin Weeks, 49-year-old south Boston native and former right-hand man to James "Whitey" Bulger, once leader of Boston's Irish mob and currently a fugitive FROM justice. Weeks, who has written a book called "Brutal" about his association with Bulger, tells about his reaction to learning that Bulger was an FBI informant, and his own decision to cooperate with authorities. Also includes an interview with Howie Carr, a columnist for the Boston Herald newspaper whose efforts to expose Bulger and his gang almost led to his murder. PROGRAM SUMMARY: "Defending New York" - the New York City police department,

Includes interviews with: Chief Vincent Giordano, chief of a counterterrorism operation called a "surge"; NYPD Commissioner Ray Kelly; intelligence experts David Cohen and Michael Sheehan; and members of a cyber unit drawn FROM New York City policemen with Middle Eastern and South Asian backgrounds. DATE AIRED: 01-05-2006  
PROGRAM SUMMARY: MEDICARE - This was a live report on the problems encountered by Medicare clients trying to purchase drugs after the new drug plans, enacted by Congress, went into effect. We spoke with a pharmacist and Congressman John Boozman. We outlined the problems understanding the options, computer problems and communication complexities. We also informed the viewer what was being done to correct the problems.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: DROUGHT AND HOUSES - We compiled a live report on the effects of the drought on foundations of houses. We showed a house that was shifting due to lack of moisture in the soil and spoke with experts about the problem. We cautioned viewers to be careful if they are using soaker hoses to address the problem of dry foundation, since that can cause other problems if not watched closely.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: THE COST OF SPEEDING - Five News has been following an FBI investigation going on in two Oklahoma towns. Roland and Moffett were taken over by Oklahoma Highway Patrol for a short period of time while FBI agents investigated both police departments. Calls to our station have been flowing in, with tales of cash paid for speeding tickets on the spot, sometime running into hundreds of dollars. In this report, we told consumers what the law allows for these kinds of fines.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: WHAT'S IN YOUR MULCH - The reporter spoke with experts after an email began circulating claiming mulch from New Orleans was infected with termites.
