PROGRAM SUMMARY: The Rogers Police Department released some powerful new information about a police shooting. 5NEWS has obtained police dash cam video of the scene, where police shot and killed a man who threatened suicide outside his home in Rogers. It happened on 26th Street on Monday afternoon. Cpl. Kevin Smith shot and killed 54-year-old Tony Chambers outside his home. Police said Chambers had called 911 twice threatening to kill himself. He also said he would not go down without a fight. Police said they tried knocking on the door and calling Chambers but he did not respond.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: 48 HOURS MYSTERY: "fugitive@hotmail.com" - a report on the three-year international manhunt and eventual capture of Dr. Yazeed "Yaz" Essa, a Cleveland doctor accused of murdering his wife, Rosemarie. In February 2005, Rosemarie, the mother of Essa's two children, was in a minor car accident. She suffered no physical injuries, but she passed out and shortly afterwards died in a Cleveland hospital. Her best friend, Eva McGregor, voiced her own suspicion that Essa had tampered with the calcium supplements that Rosemarie had taken on the morning of her death. Weeks later, tests of the calcium tablets proved that she had died of cyanide poisoning. Police went to charge Essa, but he had fled from the U.S. to Canada and eventually to Beirut, Lebanon, where he hid, knowing that he could not be extradited back to the U.S. In October 2006, he went to Cyprus, a country that does have an extradition treaty with the U.S. Interpol and the FBI alerted the Cyprus police that Essa was traveling under an alias; he was apprehended at the Larnaca airport and brought in for questioning and fingerprinting. His true identity was established, and he was arrested for using a doctored passport and held in a Cyprus prison. He fought extradition for two years but was returned to the U.S. In January 2010 his trial began. His protector in the Middle East and Essa's brother, Firas, both testified that Essa had told them that he had killed his wife by putting cyanide in her calcium pills. He was found guilty of aggravated murder and sentenced to life in prison with the possibility of parole in twenty years. After the trial, the children were told that their father killed their mother. They haven't asked about him since. PROGRAM SUMMARY: Detective Chuck Rexford, of the Washington County Sheriff's Office, confirms a body was found inside a sports utility vehicle that was pulled from Beaver Lake Friday evening. Kelly Denise Lockhart has been missing from the Springdale area since April 2008. The coroner could not confirm if it is Lockhart's body. It was badly decomposed. The body will be taken to the state medical examiner in Little Rock for identification. "They'll probably have to look up medical

records, dental records, broken bones, anything of that nature so the doctors will have something to go by, to make sure we have the right person," said Washington County Coroner Roger Morris.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: 48 HOURS MYSTERY: "The Whole Truth" - a report on the 26-year effort of Bruce Lisker to overturn his conviction for the 1983 murder of his mother. In March 1983, 17-year-old Bruce Lisker hysterically called 911 to tell Los Angeles police that he had found his mother, Dorka Lisker, beaten severely and stabbed in her Sherman Oaks home. Police arrived to find him hysterical and on drugs. They arrested him, and a young detective, Andrew Monsue, proceeded to build a case against Bruce. Bruce's father believed that his son was innocent, and urged police to investigate Bruce's friend Mike Ryan, a 15-year-old with a criminal record, who had gone to the house to see Bruce's mother the day before. But Monsue focused on Bruce, and presented what he maintained was evidence that Bruce was guilty. Bruce was tried as an adult; the jury found him guilty and he was sentenced to 16 years to life. In 1999, Bruce, still in prison, hired ex-cop-turned-private-investigator Paul Ingels to help him overturn his conviction. With the aid of then-Sgt. Jim Gavin of the Los Angeles Police Department, Ingels discovered that the evidence against Bruce had apparently been fabricated. Ingels and Gavin gave their findings to the LA Times, and on May 22, 2005, the newspaper ran an article questioning the evidence that had put Lisker behind bars. Two months later, a federal judge granted a hearing to consider new evidence in the case. Four years passed, and in August 2009 a federal judge ruled that Lisker had been convicted on false evidence and must be retried or set free. On August 17, 2009, he was set free on bail. Six weeks later, he went back to court, at which time the prosecutor said that too much time has passed to retry the case and they had no choice but to dismiss the charges. One year later, the state asked the court to return Lisker to prison based on a technicality arguing that Lisker was late filing his petition for release. A judge rejected that motion. PROGRAM SUMMARY: 48 HOURS MYSTERY - "The One Who Got Away" - a report about how serial killer Andrew Urdiales was identified, arrested and convicted, and about the young woman who became the only one of his victims to survive. Between 1986 and 1996, Andrew Urdiales attacked, tortured and killed eight women, first in California and then in Illinois. His first victim was Robbin Brandley of Mission Viejo, California. In 1992, he charmed 19-year-old Jennifer Asbenson, potentially his ninth victim, who accepted a ride from a seemingly kind stranger and was then driven into the California desert, where she was tortured, made to perform sexual acts and strangled, then put in the trunk of his car. Summoning all the strength she had, she escaped and found safety when a passing truck stopped and rescued her. Urdiales disappeared. In 1997, Chicago police were interested when they received a tip from a prostitute that a client had wanted to tie her up, place her in the trunk of his car, and then drive her out to Wolf Lake. Prior to the tip, the bodies of three other women had been discovered in the lake, all killed with the same gun. The client turned out to be Andrew Urdiales and the gun used in the murders belonged to him. Chicago police brought him in for questioning and Urdiales matter-of-factly confessed to eight unsolved murders in Illinois and California, including Robbin Brandley's and the attack on Jennifer Asbenson. Fifteen years after her attack, Jennifer Asbenson faced Urdiales in a Chicago courtroom; a jury convicted Urdiales and sentenced him to death. California authorities must wait until the appeals process is completed in Illinois, before they can begin their proceedings against him. PROGRAM SUMMARY: Two pipe bombs were found in a trash can outside a drug store in Springdale Friday afternoon. And now police are asking for your help in tracking down any information that might lead them to a suspect. The incident occurred at USA Drug on Sunset Avenue. An employee called police after finding a suspicious back pack in a trash can behind the building. An off-duty officer happened to be in the pharmacy at the time. He looked inside the bag and suggested the employee call police. The Bentonville Bomb Squad was called in. They confirmed there were two pipe bombs inside. They sent in a robot to detonate the bombs.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: 48 HOURS MYSTERY: "The Preacher's Wife" - In April 2006, Matt Baker, a pastor from Waco, Texas, returned home to find his wife Kari unconscious, with an empty bottle of Unisom and a suicide note beside her. Paramedics arrived within minutes, but it was too late. Based on the note, the empty bottle of sleeping pills, and the fact that Kari was described as still struggling with the loss of her daughter Kassidy seven years ago, police ruled it a suicide. In a county with no medical examiner, police described the case over the phone to a justice of the peace, who determined that no autopsy was needed. Kari's parents, Jim and Linda Dulin, had no choice but to believe Matt. However, Linda's sisters, Nancy, Kay, and Jennifer, and niece Lindsey believed otherwise. Dubbed "Charlie's Angels", they began their own investigation. After uncovering a possible motive, Linda hired Bill Johnston, a dogged former federal prosecutor, had her daughter's body exhumed and autopsied, and filed a wrongful death suit against Matt. Five months after Kari's death, the justice of the peace declared that her death was no longer classified as a suicide and police subsequently arrested and charged Matt with murder. Believing Matt would be tried in criminal court, Linda dropped her wrongful death suit. After six months, the district attorney still hadn't taken Matt's case to a grand jury -- a requirement under Texas law. Linda eventually re-filed the wrongful death suit, shortly before attorney Guy James Gray filed a successful motion to dismiss Matt's criminal case, as a grand jury indictment had not been returned within 180 days. Matt Baker is no longer charged with any crime, though the district attorney continues to investigate and could re-file criminal charges. There is no statute of limitations for murder. Update for the 06/09/09 rebroadcast: On March 25, 2009, a grand jury indicted Baker for the murder of his wife, after a surprise witness -- Vanessa Bulls, a girlfriend of his -- came forward and testified. He will go on trial in September. Graphic postscript: Baker was released from jail on \$250,000 bond, pending trial. He's again living in Kerrville, Texas, with his parents and daughters.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: 48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Dirty Little Secrets" (10:00-11:00pm) - a follow-up to "The Preacher's Wife" (OAD: 05/10/08; 1st rebroadcast and update on 06/09/09; 2nd rebroadcast on 10/30/10). In April 2006, Matt Baker, a pastor from Waco, Texas, returned home to find his wife Kari unconscious, with an empty bottle of Unisom and a suicide note beside her. Based on the note, the empty bottle of sleeping pills, and the fact that Kari was described as still struggling with the loss of her daughter Kassidy seven years ago, police ruled it a suicide. Linda Dulin, Kari's mother, was convinced she had been murdered and set out to prove it by hiring attorney Bill Johnston and his team of investigators, who had Kari's body exhumed and autopsied. Five months after Kari's death, the justice of the peace declared that her death was no longer classified as a suicide. In September 2007, the police felt they had a homicide on their hands and Matt Baker was arrested and charged with murder. He was released on bond, thanks to attorney Guy James Gray, who took the case pro bono. However, six months later, assistant district attorney Crawford Long dropped the murder

charges because the evidence was too speculative. Unwilling to give up, Linda Dulin decided to again sue Matt for wrongful death. Bill Johnston, assistant district attorney Long and prosecutor Susan Shafer continued to investigate. Armed with new information and damning testimony provided to the grand jury by Vanessa Bulls, a woman long suspected of having an affair with Matt before Kari's death, prosecutors were able to arrest Matt and charge him with murder. At the trial, it was revealed that Matt told Vanessa how he planned to murder Kari, the reason why, and even the exact date, but Vanessa chose not to notify the authorities. After seven hours of deliberation, the jury found Matt Baker guilty of first-degree murder. He was sentenced to 65 years with the possibility of parole. Matt still insists he did not kill his wife. The Bakers' daughters live with Matt's parents, where they want to stay. Kari's parents are now fighting for custody of the girls. Onscreen graphics: In January a jury will decide who will get custody of Kari Baker's daughters. No charges will be filed against Vanessa Bulls. After testifying, she lost her job as a teacher. Matt Baker is appealing the verdict. PROGRAM SUMMARY: 48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Taken: The Amber Dubois Story" - a report on the February 13, 2009 disappearance of Amber Dubois, just blocks from Escondido High School in Southern California. 48 HOURS examines the permanent impact her disappearance has had on her family, even after the discovery and conviction of the murderer. Initially, with no clues as to her whereabouts, investigators began to look at her mother Carrie McGonigle's live-in boyfriend, Dave Cave as a person of interest. Carrie herself and Amber's father, Moe Dubois, soon began believing that Cave was responsible for Amber's disappearance. Almost a year later, another teenage girl, Chelsea King, went missing. Chelsea had been running just ten miles from where Amber disappeared. Police quickly found Chelsea's underwear with DNA evidence that would lead them to the arrest of convicted sex offender John Gardner, who was out on parole. Gardner was then also identified by another woman, Candice Moncayo, as the man who attacked her on the same jogging trail just two months earlier. Then police found Chelsea's body and Gardner was charged with her murder and the attack against Moncayo. Under interrogation and facing the death penalty for the murder of Chelsea, Gardner agreed to lead police to Amber's body in exchange for avoiding the death penalty. John Gardner was convicted of both Amber's and Chelsea's murders and sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole. In his exclusive interview with 48 HOURS MYSTERY, he recounted the day he murdered Amber and admitted he is the most dangerous type of sexual predator. He said he needs to be locked up forever. PROGRAM SUMMARY: 48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Chasing the Barefoot Bandit" - A report on Colton Harris-Moore, also known as the "Barefoot Bandit," because of his habit of committing crimes barefoot and leaving chalk outlines of his feet; and whose criminal exploits included stealing planes, guns, yachts, and even escaping to foreign countries. His exploits reminded many of legendary outlaws like Jesse James, and as news of his crimes spread beyond the Pacific Northwest, his popularity grew, even spawning Facebook fan pages. Born on Camano Island, Washington, Harris-Moore was an unpopular teen, physically neglected and mentally abused by his mother, Pam Kohler. He wanted to become a pilot, but instead turned to a life of crime at age 10, stealing laptops, cell phones, and jewelry. He was arrested and sent to a halfway house, but escaped custody and continued breaking into vacation homes and leaving his mark. He even ordered a DVD on learning to fly a plane with a stolen credit card. In 2008, he stole his first plane, crashing it 250 miles away from where he stole it, and simply walked away. He then worked in Las Vegas, then went to Canada and stole guns. In

2009, he stole his second plane, and the legend of Colton Harris-Moore was born. After stealing his third plane, the Department of Homeland Security joined in the hunt; but he still avoided capture. In 2010, he stole an airplane in Bloomington, Indiana and flew it to Abaco Island in the Bahamas, where he continued to commit break-ins. While 48 HOURS was on his trail in the Bahamas, he allegedly stole a yacht and escaped to the nearby Bahamian island of Eleuthera. He was spotted by some local teens who, knowing about the \$10,000 reward offered for his capture, chased him by boat. Police joined in the hunt, and Harris-Moore was finally captured. Deported from the Bahamas, he is was returned to the U.S., where he was indicted on federal charges for stealing two planes, guns, a boat and flying without a license. He faces ten years behind bars. Onscreen graphics: Colton Harris-Moore will be arraigned Thursday in federal court. He faces additional charges in several states. Colton and his mother have not seen each other since his arrest. She's had offers to buy Colton's story and has hired a well-known entertainment lawyer. A police report states workers at the Electric Cowboy threw the off-duty officer out when he got upset because the bartender would not serve him anymore alcohol. According to the police report, Chandler told his girlfriend to go back inside and tell those "wanna be cops" he was going to come back inside and shoot them. Officers say Chandler went inside with a gun behind his back.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: 48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Secrets, Lies and Alibis" - On August 22, 2004, John and Susan Sutton had a family get together in their Coral Gables, Florida home, that included their son Christopher, his girlfriend Juliette Driscoll, and Teddy Montoto, John's law partner and friend. Afterwards, when Teddy had left and John and Juliette had gone to a movie, John and Susan retired to separate bedrooms -- Susan often slept in the second room because John snored. Sometime later in the evening, a gunman entered their bedrooms and shot both of them several times. Susan was killed, but John survived. Nothing was taken from the house -- not money, nor jewelry. There was no doubt that this was a premeditated effort to make sure that they were dead. Police interrogation of Teddy Montoto revealed that he had been having an affair with Susan, but further investigation eliminated him as a suspect. Interviews with some of John's closest friends suggested that the Suttons' son, Christopher, should be investigated as a suspect. He had been sent to a behavioral program, Paradise Cove, on the Polynesian islands of Samoa, when he was 16. He claims he was abused there and tried to tell his parents about it, but they didn't believe him, and he was kept there until he was 19. He became the prime suspect. After checking his cell phone records, authorities noticed more than 300 calls to his friend Garrett Kopp, who had been arrested less than 24 hours after the Suttons shooting for attacking someone else with a gun. That turned out to be the same gun that was used to shoot the Suttons. Kopp told police that he was hired by his friend Christopher Sutton to kill his parents. Christopher's then-fiancée Juliette Driscoll told the police that Christopher had a deep-seated resentment towards his parents for sending him to Samoa. She said he often spoke of how great their lives would be if his parents were dead. Garrett Kopp and Juliette Driscoll testified against Christopher in court. Christopher claimed that Kopp had gone to the Suttons' house to steal marijuana and that Driscoll testified against him because she had been threatened by police. After a day and a half of deliberations, the jury found Christopher Sutton guilty of first-degree

Defense attorney George Parnham believed that her children's desire to gain control of the family fortune drove them to testify against their mother and was able to get Jeremy to reveal that a million dollars Charlene had transferred to him for safekeeping was withdrawn and split with his siblings to pay off debts -- all without his mother's knowledge. The jury deliberated for two days, before the judge declared a mistrial due to the lone juror who believed in Charlene's innocence. In addition to the criminal trial, Charlene also faced a wrongful death lawsuit from Jeremy, Jamie and Danny's mother, Barbara Graham.
