CRIME NEWSCASTS

1/3 a clerk at the Kwick Pick Convenience store in Lauderhill, Saf Amhad arrested for allegedly shooting a man outside the store with an AK-47 New Year's Eve. Police say the man went to the store to confront the employees for allegedly beating his friend earlier that day.

1/9 Hollywood police are warning people on ATV's and dirt bikes they will not be tolerated on city streets during the upcoming Martin Luther King holiday weekend, or any other time.

1/9 The U.S. Supreme Court will not hear the case of a Broward woman convicted of trying to hire a hitman to kill her husband. She's been through a series of trials for the 2009 crime. She's serving 16 years. Her attorneys were trying to get a new trial arguing a gag order in the last trial was unfair.

1/15 Police all over South Florida are trying to get the jump on the dangerous MLK celebration, 'Bikes Up, Guns Down'. They've already handed out 29 tickets and towed 38 bikes. Riders didn't wait for the holiday, they started riding over the weekend.

1/16 Overnight security beefed up at Mid-Town Towing in Miami out of concern dozens of "Wheels Up, Guns Down" riders who had their vehicles confiscated might try to steal them back.

1/17 9 people facing criminal charges in connection with the apparent hazing death of a Florida State University Student from South Florida: 20 year old Andrew Coffey from Lighthouse Point.

1/17 An off duty Doral police officer, Lt. Gary King, shot in his driveway, his gun taken. Police suspect he may have been followed to his home in Palmetto Bay.

1/18 Miami Dade police believe they have one of the suspects who ambushed and shot an officer outside his Palmetto Bay home earlier this week: 22 year old Kionne Bell. Lt. Gary King is recovering.

1/22 The SWAT team called out to a house in the 200 block of SW 133rd Avenue; a person barricaded inside the house.

2/6 Pembroke Pines police are warning residents in or near the Windmill Lakes complex: near Pines Boulevard and SW 89th Avenue. Police say the latest victim was attacked last night. Police beleive the suspects are responsible for other attacks.

2/5 The Department of Children and Families say the toddler murdered by his mother Sunday was supposed to be staying with relatives: his uncle and grandmother while they investigated the child's living situation. 22-year-old Nathaly Ramos is in custody charged with murder and attempted murder for allegedly trying to kill her boyfriend.

2/7 Activists asking a federal judge to automatically restore voting rights to former felons in Florida who've served their time and have been out of prison for at least five years.

2/7 Miami homicide detectives working through the night trying to find whoever is responsible for killing one person and injuring another. Both victims shot at 1st Street and Miami Avenue.

2/13 The search is on for the inmate authorities say walked away from community release in West Palm Beach: 38 year old Jeremy Young. He's serving a 29 year sentence for a string of crimes including burglary and credit card fraud.

2/14 The search is on for a suspected predator after he allegedly kidnapped a 10 year old girl from a bus t stop about this time yesterday: NW 100th Street and 22nd Avenue.

2/14 Overnight, homicide detectives working a crime scene in Miami Gardens: 176th Street and32nd Avenue, trying to figure out if a burned up car is linked to the murder of a Barry University student, 19 year old Prsicilla Torres.

2/14 Hollywood police say the suspect who scammed his way into a woman's house over the weekend, then robbed her has a history of targeting older victims.

2/20 Student activists from Marjory Stoneman Douglas High are already in Tallahassee ahead of a meeting with legislators. They are pushing for Florida lawmakers to make some changes when it comes to gun control.

2/20 Florida Governor, Rick Scott says he will not take part in a nationally televised Town Hall Meeting tomorrow night with Stoneman Douglas students and their families. President Trump has also declined an invitation to speak.

2/23 A BSO school resource officer, Scott Peterson, has resigned after Sheriff Scott Israel says he 'took up a position' outside Marjory Stoneman Douglas and never went in while students and teachers were being killed.

2/26 About 100 parents whose kids attend Marjory Stoneman Douglas are heading to Tallahassee today. They plan to speak with lawmakers tomorrow, calling on them to enact tougher gun control laws.

2/27 A Fort Lauderdale man, Lenden Pendergrass, arrested on federal drug charges. Authorities say he was also pimping women he had living in his garage, forcing them to turn tricks there and sell drugs.

2/28 Broward Commissioners are planning an independent investigation of the massacre at Stoneman Douglas. Commissioners want someone like the former FBI Direct, Louis Freeh, or former Homeland Security Chief, Tom Ridge to lead the investigation. 2/28 A Pompano Beach teen, 16 year old Christopher McDonald arrested and Baker acted for allegedly threatening to kill students with a pipe bomb.

3/1 Governor Rick Scott will be in Palm Beach, this morning. He's expected to provide more information about a \$500 million dollar school safety program.

3/1 Miami Beach Commissioners have come up with an \$8 million dollar plan to put police cameras on every corner in areas South Beach popular with tourists. The figure includes money for new license plate readers.

3/1 As early as next week a grand jury could hear the murder case against Nicholas Cruz. Authorities say he confessed, but prosecutors must file formal charges. Prosecutors say it is too early to discuss if the death penalty will be taken off the table.

3/2 There are new questions about how BSO handled the mass shooting at Stoneman Douglas High School. The Herald reporting, the first officer to take control of the scene, Captain Jan Jordan, told deputies to form a perimeter, instead of following the training to confront the shooter.

3/5 Arming teachers a step closer to becoming the law in Florida. Over the weekend members of the Republican led, Florida Senate approved a bill to arm teachers and rejected a ban on assault weapons.

3/6 Today Broward prosecutors will start presenting their case against Nicholas Cruz to a grand jury. He's accused of killing 17 people almost three weeks ago at Stoneman Douglas High School. Defense attorneys say he's willing to plead guilty in exchange for life in prison. If prosecutors reject the offer, the case would go to trial.

3/6 The Florida Senate passing a bill that would among other things raise the age to buy a gun from 18 to 21 and allow some school staff to carry guns.

3/9 Overnight authorities releasing an alert for a missing 7 year old girl, Deja Hawkins, last seen in Miami Gardens in the 28-hundred block of 192nd Street. Police say she could be with 32 year old Ashley McCoy.

3/12 A Hialeah woman arrested, charged with murdering her neighbor during a fight over a parking space.

3/14 Accused shooter, Nicholas Cruz will be arraigned today. Prosecutors have said they will seek the death penalty. The defense has offered to have Cruz plead guilty in exchange for life in prison.

3/26 Police say a Delray beach man, Julien Rosenberg shot and killed his wife, and sister-in-law, then killed himself. The couple's four children were home. They're staying with relatives.

3/30 In Miami, an active search is underway for three suspects accused of carjacking a woman and her boyfriend, at gunpoint, at SW 33nd Avenue and 27th Avenue.

3/20 A victim of gun violence undergoing surgery overnight after getting shot at Reeves Park in Overtown: NW 5th Street, between 7th and 10th Avenues.

1/25 Broward Sheriff Scott Israel Response to Stoneman Douglas Shooting

DISCRIMINATION-RACE MATTERS/NEWSCASTS

1/3 Essence Magazine is once again a Black owned company, bought by the owner of Shea Moisture Hair Car products.

1/9 H&M apologizing after running a racist ad that featured a Black boy modeling a hoodie with the slogan, "Coolest Monkey in the Jungle".

1/15 Hot 105 is celebrating the King Holiday, beginning at 8 o'clock this morning at the 5000 Roloe Models of Excellence Scholarship breakfast. Producer, film-maker and actor, Tyler Perry is the keynote speaker.

1/15 The Parade in Liberty City scheduled to start at 11AM. The route goes across NW 54th Street, between 19th and 32nd Avenues. In Fort Lauderdale, the MLK Holiday Parade and Multicultural Festival starts at Lincoln Park: 600 NW 19th Avenue. There is a free festival at Esplanade Park until 2:30 this afternoon.

1/16 For the first time a Black man will have a key role in management at the "Miami Open", James Blake, a former top five player. Among other things he'll focus on player relations, media and tournament improvements.

1/16 Three Black women take center stage in the latest production at 'The M Ensemble', "Sassy Mamas", older women and their deliberate decision to date younger men.

1/18 The US will no longer grant Haitians so called, "guest worker visas". They were one of the few legal ways Haitians could come to

the U.S. Those visas allow immigrants to do so called, low skilled jobs like housekeeping and waiting tables.

2/5 Miami Dade County reportedly spent 12.5 million dollars of taxpayer's money last year to detain immigrants wanted by immigration. Miami Dade Mayor, Carlos Gimenez agreed to detain immigrants after President Trump threatened to cut off federal funding from cities that refused.

2/7 A lot of white people using DNA tests like "23 and Me" are surprised and upset when they find out they're part Black. When a white supremacist learned DNA tests confirmed he had African ancestors he claimed "23 and Me" was part of a Jewish conspiracy to defame and confuse young whites on a mass level.

2/9 The activist site, Change.org calling on Marvel and Disney Studios to invest 25 percent of their profits from the film Black Panther into the Black community. The petition points out the marketing campaign specifically targets black movie-goers and looked to capitalize on the Black audience by releasing the movie during Black History Month.

2/12 Facial recognition technology is accurate, if you're a white guy. An MIT study found the darker a person's skin color, the more errors. It has consequences. Facial recognition is being used for everything from targeting ads on social media to hiring and lending.

2/13 President Trump choosing 86 potential federal judges, only one is black; Miami Dade Judge Rodney Smith.

2/26 Florida Memorial University in Miami Gardens recognized as one of the best historically black colleges and universities in the United States. The school getting high marks, for among other things, its affordability and the number of students who go on to become teachers.

2//27 A Black woman hired as CEO of the Dallas Mavericks: Mark Cuban hiring Cynthia Marshall, a retired ATT&T executive with a reputation as a fixer. 2/28 Disney donating \$1 million dollars from the Black Panther box office to Boys and Girls Clubs in underserved communities. The money earmarked to create STEM programs.

2/28 After getting shamed and sued, Ebony Magazine has finally agreed to pay close to \$80,000 dollars to freelance writers the magazine has stiffed for years.

3/1 A commissioner in the Tallahassee area, Bill Proctor, from Leon County, expressing major concerns about arming teachers. He says if white teachers are armed, he's concerned they'll essentially act as police and "Black students will turn into target practice for trigger happy teachers".

3/6 Dolphins owner, Stephen Ross now says next season, "all of our players will be standing" during the national anthem. Last year he publicly supported players who chose to kneel to protest the deaths of young black men at the hands of police.

3/9 A teacher in the Jacksonville area, David Swinyar arrested for telling white girls in his class they should not date black boys because they're not worth it. A third grade teacher, also in Duvall County resigned after she was accused of calling, black students "rats that could infest the class" and their race is either dead or in jail

3/12 A marquee for "Black Panther" targeted at a U.S. Marine base in Okinawa Japan. It was defaced with a racist slur.

3/12 We're learning about the Black woman who played a key role in developing GPS technology. Gladys West' story is similar to that of Katherine Johnson, the NASA math wiz whose story was told in Hidden Figures. For 42 years West worked at a naval base in Dahlgren, Virginia. She was part of the team that developed the Global Positioning System.

3/14 David Hogg speaking out about the walkout today to remember the victims killed at their high school and to call for tougher gun laws. Hogg says he realizes the deadly violence in Parkland has gotten a lot of attention because the students live in an affluent community, but he wants all victims of gun violence to be remembered.

3/37 A high profile Black chef with plans to open a restaurant in Overtown is getting sued for racial discrimination; Marcus Samuelsson, owner of the Red Rooster in Harlem. A former bartender alleges the restaurant has few Black female bartenders and even fewer Black males. The lawsuit also alleges employees were cheated out of overtime pay. Samuelsson's attorney denies the allegations.

1/17 By the end of the week, American Airlines will no longer accept cash for anything at Miami International Airport. The policy is already in effect at 50 other airports. What if you only have cash? You can get it converted to a prepaid debit card, five dollar fee.

2/7 Fort Lauderdale Commissioners voting to continue support for the downtown streetcar system known as "The Wave". It's not a done deal though. A new commission will be in place next month and a majority of the candidates have said they will not support the project. 2/12 Going to Disney is now more expensive, price hikes announced over the weekend, up four dollars to \$19 for adults and \$113 for kids. Prices even high for so called peak visitation days, \$129 for adults, \$123 for children.

1/16 It's Election Day in Fort Lauderdale. Voters will elect a new Mayor and 3 commissioners.

1/17 In Fort Lauderdale, the race for Mayor and two commission seats headed to a run-off in March. Mayoral candidates, Bruce Roberts and Dean Trantalis will go head to head. Voters will also elect commissioners to represent Districts 2 and 4. Commissioner Robert McKinzie was re-elected to represent District 3. 1/29 Florida Congresswoman Fredericka Wilson among the lawmakers who will skip President Trump's State of the Union address tomorrow. Wilson says she can't ignore Trump's racist comments or try to pretend his behavior is normal.

3/6 Tomorrow former University of Miami President, Donna Shalala expected to formally announce she is running for Congress.

3/29 Florida Governor Rick Scott expected to announce on Facebook he intends to run for the Senate, challenging Bill Nelson.

HEALTH/ NEWSCASTS

1/3 Hundreds of Miami Gardens residents turning out for one of the first events of Miami Gardens Mayor Oliver Gilbert's fitness challenge. The program is called "Live Healthy Miami Gardens".

2/7 Encouraging news about Ryan Shazier, the Pittsburgh Steeler from South Florida who suffered a spinal injury during a December game. He is able to take some steps with either a walker or people supporting him. He's reportedly out of the hospital, set to continue rehab as an outpatient.

2/13 Southwest Miami Dade residents with respiratory issues urged to take precautions because of a fire that's burning in a wooded area near Card Sound road: 50 acres destroyed.

2.26 The leading group of pediatricians in the country now recommending all teenagers undergo screening for depression. Along with universal screening the group also recommending families with a depressed teen create a plan to restrict their access to anything that could be deadly.

3/1 Scientists are working on a potential major breakthrough, a single vaccine that would protect against multiple strains of the flu.

1/29 Panera Bread recalling virtually all the cream cheese it sells. 2 and 8 ounce containers recalled because of concerns about listeria.

2/22 Continued blood drive for victims of Stoneman Douglas shooting: Noon to 8PM at the BB&T Center

SEVERE WEATHER/NEWSCASTS

1/5 South Florida experiencing the coldest weather in three years. Morning temperature 40 degrees. Cold weather expected to last through tomorrow.

1/17 A monster storm warning is impacting much of this side of the country. Hard freeze warnings are in effect from Louisiana to the Florida panhandle and some of the cold weather is coming our way. Temperatures here are expected to drop into the forties overnight.

1/31 High winds making it difficult for firefighters to get control of a massive brush fire in Southwest Miami Dade – just a mile north of Dadeland Mall. AT one point it came within 50 feet of several million dollar homes.

2/11 Residents in Southwest Miami Dade impacted by a fire that's been burning in a wooded area just north of Card Sound Road

3/8 Flights in and out of South Florida impacted by the massive winter storm in the Northeast. If you're flying, or expecting someone, call ahead.

3/9 Temperatures to start the day in the low fifties.

SEVERE WEATHER PSA's

1/18 a wind chill advisory is in effect in Broward County until 10AM.

1/18 Cold front moves in, temperatures at 48 degrees this morning, the result of a monster storm flights in South Florida and across the nation are being impacted.

3/12 Forecasters predicting severe thunderstorms this afternoon and everything that comes with them: lightning, potentially damaging winds and possibly hail. The weather system is the result of a cold front expected to arrive tonight – the same one forecast to hit the Northeast.

3/29 A massive brush fire burning near Tamiami Trail and 137th Avenue in far west Miami Dade is not a threat to any potential structures. It's believed winds blowing out of the east will keep the fire from becoming a potential problem in any populated areas.
