The following is a listing of some of the topics and interviews covered in Newscasts, public service announcements (PSAs) and in our Public Affairs Broadcasts during the third quarter of 2017.

## **CRIME/ NEWSCASTS**

7/4 A Miami Dade judge ruling Florida's updated Stand Your Ground law is unconstitutional. Judge Milton Hirsh says lawmakers went too far when they changed the law, which put the burden of proof on prosecutors --- and that any changes should be made by the Florida Supreme Court.

7/6 A former Margate employee, the woman in charge of grants, Kim Laikos, arrested on corruption charges. Investigators say, among other things, she misused almost a million dollars in state and federal grants, money intended to help low income people buy and fix up homes.

7/11 A crisis team will be at Miami Carol Senior High today. A summer school student there was shot and killed in a drive by shooting at 107<sup>th</sup> Street and 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

7/12 In Southwest Miami Dade there are more questions than answers about how a Triple AAA service call to fix a battery ended in murder.

7/13 The search is on for whoever dumped two sharks outside an Overtown apartment complex.

7/12 A missing Miami Gardens girl, Sterline Delisca found safe.

7/12 The 16 year old seen on video body slamming a 68 year old woman, then throwing her into a pool at a North Lauderdale apartment complex, Leon Joseph, cut a deal with prosecutors. He'll avoid jail time in exchange for community service and probation. In court, he apologized to the victim. Joseph will also have to undergo a psychological evaluation and he'll be on probation for a year.

7/13 Closing arguments are scheduled to begin today in high profile murder case. The victim, a Miramar woman, Vilet Torrez disappeared. Her body was never found, but prosecutors believe the evidence will prove her husband, Cid Torrez killed her and dumped her body in the Everglades.

7/14 A Miramar teen detained for allegedly shooting a Pitbull puppy. Police say he admitted to killing the puppy but told them he did it to protect a relative. The owner was out of town and the dog was roaming the area. Neighbors say the puppy was not aggressive.

7/25 ATF, BSO and Hallandale Beach police are looking for the suspects who broke into the Bass Pro Shop in Dania Beach. Authorities say they've recovered 16 of the stolen high powered rifles and shotguns.

8/7 Former Miami Heat center, Willie Reed's case could become the first under the NBA's new domestic violence policy. He was arrested over the weekend in Miami, accused of beating up his wife after she asked for a divorce.

8/11 The search is on for a missing four year old boy Jupiter boy, Dominic Caprio. His nanny, Blanca Castro arrested overnight in Miami.

8/11 A Coconut Creek man, Michael Mark, arrested on drug charges. Police say they found more than 11 pounds of pot in his house, along with marijuana oil, gummy bears and lollipops laced with marijuana.

8/14 There is a \$5,000 dollar reward for the right information to find the suspect who ambushed a Palm Beach Sheriff's deputy over the weekend in Lake Worth. The deputy was hit in the face with some kind of blunt object.

8/21 A scare at the Dolphin Mall Saturday night was not a shooting, shoppers at the mall didn't know it at the time though and people ran for their lives screaming and crying. Miami Dade police are still investigating.

8/22 Hialeah police are looking for a forklift and the suspect who used it to steal an ATM from a branch of Bank of America at east 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 9<sup>th</sup> Street.

8/23 Red light cameras are coming back to some intersections in Pembroke Pines. City leaders say they're trying to make the streets safer in the wake of a State Farm study that showed Pembroke Pines is home to the most dangerous intersection in the country: Flamingo and Pines Boulevard.

8/25 Police suspect a Massachusetts murder suspect may be in South Florida. They say 46 year old Cornell Bell has ties to Coral Gables. He allegedly killed his ex-girlfriend earlier this month.

8/28 Miami Beach installing concrete barriers on Lincoln Road at Espanola Way in an effort to prevent any potential terrorist attacks.

8/29 Miami Dade homicide detectives say 8 year old Jada Page's father is not cooperating with their investigation, even though his daughter was killed with a bullet intended for him. He was shot and survived his injuries.

8/30 Miami Dade homicide detectives are looking for answers after a headless body was found in a garbage dump.

8/30 A federal jury in Palm Beach has convicted a self-described White supremacist, Adrian Apodaca for a murder-for-hire plot. He was caught in an FBI sting two years ago, making promises to kill on behalf of the KKK.

9/14 A criminal investigation is underway after 8 patients at a Hollywood nursing home died following days in sweltering heat.

9/27 A safety alert in Pembroke Pines after a suspect attempts to kidnap another child. Police say this time the intended victim was a boy. It's believed the suspect is driving a white, four door, late model Mazda 3.

9/27 The men's basketball program at the University of Miami could be involved in a massive bribery scandal. The program could be implicated in an FBI corruption probe. Among other things some coaches have been accused of taking cash to lure high school players to their programs and promising to deliver those players to certain athletic companies and agents once they turned pro. UM says it is aware of the indictments and will co-operate if asked.

9/29 More than two dozen suspects arrested for allegedly ripping off a Walmart Supercenter: 3200 block of NW 79<sup>th</sup> Street. Police say they stole \$3 million dollars worth of cash and merchandise. They allegedly took, tvs, home theatre systems, kayaks and furniture.

8/6 Symposium, reacting with law enforcement

## **DISCRIMINATION-RACE MATTERS/NEWSCASTS**

7/4 Hollywood Commissioners taking the first steps to start changing the streets named after Confederate generals. Commissioners agreed to two measures: first taking a vote without polling residents. Second the streets would have both names for two years to give residents time to get used to the name change. Commissioner Peter Hernandez, whose district represents a large section of the Black community voted in favor of keeping the streets named after confederate generals.

7/6 Miami Dade County slapped with a lawsuit, a result of Donald Trump's anti-immigration policies. The ACLU and the Immigration Clinic at the University of Miami Law School allege the county illegally detained an 18 year old citizen in a county jail – at the request of ICE.

7/10 There are questions about what's happening to Ronda Vangates, the Black woman at Miami Dade Public Schools in charge of making sure women and minority owned business get their fair share of contracts. There is a move to reassign Vangates to another position, in Urban Affairs.

7/13 A traffic stop in the Orlando area going viral. Police posted the body camera footage on the department's website. There are questions about whether the stop was politically motivated. Officers told State Attorney Aramis Ayala they ran her tag as a matter of routine. She was not ticketed. Ayala is suing Governor Rick Scott after he essentially stripped her of power and removed her from several high profile murder cases. He did so after she refused to seek the death penalty in several cases.

7/26 Civil Rights attorney, Benjamin Crump is opening a national law firm. It will be called Ben Crump Law. Offices will be located in Washington D.C., Los Angeles and Tallahassee.

8/1 The NAACP and Airbnb teaming up to increase the number of people of color who're using their homes to earn extra money. The partnership will include revenue sharing: Airbnb will share 20% of the proceeds from the partnership with the NAACP.

8/1 HBO and Game of Thrones creators are the target of a social media protest for the upcoming series, "Confederate". It will feature an alternate time line where Confederate soldiers win the civil war, leave the union and still own slaves.

8/1 a movie is underway to honor the slave who taught Jack Daniel how to make whiskey. The current owner of the Jack Daniels distillery is also looking at establishing a scholarship fund for Nearis Green's descendants.

8/4 For the first time the majority of the incoming class at Harvard is not white. Blacks, Hispanics, Asians and other minorities make up the majority of the class of 2021. The news comes as the Trump administration is investigating affirmative action policies at Harvard, and other schools for allegedly discriminating against white students.

8/10 A Pompano Beach firefighter recruit has been fired, and three others have resigned after a noose was found on the seat of the only Black recruit at the city's training center.

8/14 The white supremacist at the center of the deadly violence this weekend in Charlottesville, Richard Spencer, could be coming to Gainesville next month, to speak at the University of Florida. UF President, Kent Fuchs has emailed students, parents and faculty letting them know the school's been contacted about renting space for a September 12<sup>th</sup> event that would feature Spencer.

8/16 Attorney General, Jeff Sessions is coming to Miami today. He's scheduled to speak at Port Miami 3 o'clock. He'll praise Miami Dade Mayor, Carlos Gimenez' decision to go along with Donald Trump's demand for local police to hold immigrants wanted by Ice.

8/17 The countdown clock is ticking on the extension granted Haitian immigrants for Temporary Protected Status. It expires in January.

8/18 Norwegian Cruise Lines bowing to pressure and cancelling a cruise for a neo-Nazi conference scheduled to leave out of Miami in November.

8/22 Racial profiling not just limited to this country, an Italian journalist is taking a lot of heat after captioning a picture of Sam Jackson and Magic Johnson in Tuscany as African migrants using Italian government assistance to go on a shopping spree.

8/23 A confederate monument removed from the Woodlawn Cemetery in Palm Beach. The Mayor says it'll be stored at a secure location until the "United Daughters of the Confederacy" make arrangements to get it. The monument is believed to be the only confederate monument in Palm Beach.

8/25 For the first time ever, the state of Florida has executed a white man for killing a Black person, actually two people of color. 53 year old Mark Asay put to death for two murders in Jacksonville in the 1980's.

8/30 Hollywood Commissioners begin discussing options for new names for streets that currently bear the names of confederate generals.

8/31 After a debate that lasted more than 6 hours Hollywood Commissioners voted in favor of changing the names of streets named after Confederate generals. All but one member of the commission, Vice Mayor Traci Callari, voted in favor of the change.

8/31 The Florida Department of Law Enforcement is investigating a police involved shooting in Liberty City, NW 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 65<sup>th</sup> Street.

9/1 A veteran Miami Dade police sergeant, Eduardo Pares says he was forced to shoot and killed Anthony Ford during what started as a routine traffic stop in Liberty City.

9/5 Attorney General Jeff Sessions expected to announce the official end of DACA. Some 800-thousand immigrants, brought here by their parents as children, are protected from deportation under the program.

9/22 Black employees at the steak house in Donald Trump's D.C. hotel suing for discrimination. The lawsuit alleges, among other things, Blacks are rarely given the best positions or shifts and that managers have told employees, "This is white America time. Get used to it and if you don't go work somewhere else. A spokesperson for the Trump hotel denies the allegations.

9/27 Florida Senator Bill Nelson among the South Florida lawmakers asking President Trump to extend the DACA deadline. There is concern the recent string of hurricanes could make it difficult for dreamers to come up with the \$495 dollar application fee.

9/29 Schools in Florida are becoming more segregated and the problem is worst in Miami according to a Florida State University study. Researchers referring to majority black schools as “apartheid schools” with a 99 to 100 percent Black student body. Repeated research has shown that schools with more white students generally have more resources, more experienced teachers and more advanced classes.

## **ECONOMY/NEWSCASTS**

7/6 Florida has agreed to end a lawsuit against the Seminole Tribe in exchange for revenue sharing, \$340 million dollars. In exchange the Seminole Casinos will be the only place in the state where people can play blackjack and other so called banked card games.

7/11 Fort Lauderdale Commissioners expected to decide today if they'll raise their salaries by 50 percent, up from \$30 to \$45,000 dollars a year.

7/26 Soccer fans from 50 countries are expected in South Florida this week for activities leading up to "El Classico Miami". The marquee soccer matchup between Barcelona and Madrid taking place at the Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens. It's part of one of Dolphins' owner, Stephen Ross' latest business ventures, "Relevant Sports", created to promote and grow soccer worldwide.

8/4 The start of the school year is just a little over two weeks away. Tax free shopping days are this weekend to help families get ready. This year some electronics are back on the list including computers, laptops and tablets.

8/16 A group of activists is marching on City Hall tomorrow afternoon in Fort Lauderdale. They want something done about the Mizell Center on Sistrunk Boulevard as well as opportunities for residents in the community.

8/23 Plans are in the works for an African American Museum of Arts and Culture in Miami Gardens. State lawmakers have just approved a half million dollars of the project.

8/24 Fort Lauderdale Commissioners have chosen a firm, Premier Parks, to build a \$60 million dollar project, a water park.

8/25 The price of gas expected to jump as much as 15 cents a gallon, the result of the massive storm, Harvey, that hit Texas.

8/30 Tens of thousands of Disney World employees are trying to get a raise. The union that represents, among others, performers, bus drivers, housekeepers and lifeguards are negotiating for more money. Right now, Disney wants to freeze the starting minimum wage at \$10 dollars an hour.

9/22 South Florida leaders are hoping the fact Amazon founder Jeff Besos graduated from Palmetto Senior High will make him more inclined to choose the area to build Amazon's next major project, an 8 million square foot facility with 50,000 jobs. Leaders in Miami Dade, Broward and Palm Beach are working together on a proposal to encourage Besos to build the facility here.

7/7 Florida’s Secretary of State, Ken Detzner says he will provide part of the requested information to the Donald Trump Commission investigating alleged voter fraud in Florida. The commission wants virtually everything: names, voter registration status, political party affiliation, voting history, social security numbers and driver’s license info. Detzner has said he’ll provide everything allowed by law. Most states have said they will not provide the information.

7/25 A Special Election is scheduled today in Miami Dade County: District 40. It's a primary to replace State Senator, Frank Artiles. He was forced to resign earlier this year after using racist language during a conversation with two Black Florida lawmakers.

8/2 One of 2 key candidates in the Miami Beach Mayoral election, Phillip Levine, dropping out, citing concerns of mudslinging.

8/23 One of the supporters at Donald Trump's campaign rally in Phoenix is making headlines. "Michael the Black Man" is from South Florida. He's a former Yahweh who was acquitted on a murder charge.

9/27 Democrat, Annette Taddeo winning the special election to represent State Senate District 40. She'll replace Frank Artiles. He was forced to resign earlier this year after using racial slurs in front of Black lawmakers.

7/23 Voter Registration continued outreach to register voters (Thurs, July 27<sup>th</sup>)

### **HEALTH/NEWSCASTS**

7/5 The Centers for Disease Control reporting Black women in this country are three and a half times more likely than white women to die during, or shortly after childbirth. Experts aren't exactly sure why but point to a number of factors Black women face; the disparity between race and income and often inferior care many black women receive.

8/2 The Florida Department of Health confirming the first sexually transmitted case of Zika in Florida this year. The patient's partner recently travelled to Florida. More than 100 cases of Zika have been confirmed in Florida this year, most travel related.

8/4 Health insurance providers all over the country, including Florida want to raise rates for coverage provided under Obamacare. The cost in the sunshine state could go up by double digits. Insurers say they need the increase because they're concerned about losing government subsidies that help cover the cost.

8/4 Miami Dade County has fixed a sewage leak a lot of people think should have been repaired a year ago. It's near Virginia Key and about a mile off Fisher Island. The county says it is looking to hire a company to inspect and repair all sewage pipes if needed.

8/30 Senator Bill Nelson is pushing for the federal government to protect more than 13,000 special needs children in Florida. They were taken out of a state program called, "Children's Medical Services". It provides specialized care.

8/31 The FDA is recalling close to half a million pacemakers made by a company called, "St. Jude Medical". They could be hacked. They need a software update.

8/31 Senator Bill Nelson pushing for the federal government to protect more than 13,000 special needs children in Florida. They were taken out of a program called, "Children's Medical Services".

9/14 Nursing homes across the state are getting more attention after the deaths of 8 elderly people who spent days in the sweltering heat following Hurricane Irma.

9/22 A Nursing Home Summit is happening today in Tallahassee. Among other things, industry leaders and lawmakers will be talking about the level of care required during a natural disaster. They'll also talk about the governor's mandate requiring nursing homes to install generators within 90 days.

9/26 Governor Rick Scott is expected to hold a news conference this afternoon in Palm Beach. He's expected to make a major announcement about the opioid crisis. He will almost certainly be asked questions about voice mails that were deleted from his cell phone. Those voice messages reportedly left 36 hours before the first patient at a Hollywood nursing home died in stifling conditions after Hurricane Irma.

9/29 A Boil Water order issued in Hollywood after a water main break. Until further notice residents are urged to boil water for one minute. It's safe for bathing and taking a shower. Water should be boiled for everything else, drinking, cooking, brushing teeth and making ice.

7/10 A Lauderdale Lakes swimming instructor affected by a lightning strike.

7/26 A heat advisory is in effect for Miami Dade County. The hot temperatures and high humidity are potentially dangerous. If you don’t drink enough water and get some cool air or at least shade, you’re at risk for everything from heat exhaustion to passing out to a heat stroke.

7/31 Tropical Depression #6, off the coast of Tampa, but expected to cause a lot of rain in South Florida.

8/22 A Tropical Wave expected to dump a lot of rain on South Florida for the next few days. The Mayor of Miami Beach says residents may experience flooding.

8/25 A flood watch is expected to be in effect in South Florida, Broward, Miami Dade, Palm Beach and Monroe Counties, for the next several days.

8/28 For the first time in several days South Florida is not under a flood watch.

8/29 Forecasters are keeping an eye on a new tropical system, 93-L. It is thousands of miles away.

9/1 Forecasters are keeping an eye on Hurricane Irma. It is 2,600 miles away from South Florida. It's unclear if the storm will make landfall in the U.S.

9/2 Hurricane Irma now a category 4 storm. Several models show South Florida could be in harm's way.

9/3 Hurricane Irma upgraded to a Category 5 storm. Hurricane Andrew in 1992 was the last Category 5 storm to make landfall in the U.S.

9/15 If you are using a generator in the wake of hurricane Irma, you should be aware it can be potentially life threatening. Four people, two adults and two children in Hialeah rushed to the hospital after apparently breathing carbon monoxide fumes.

9/18 Forecasters are keeping an eye on Hurricane Maria. Right now it's on a track that would impact Puerto Rico and the northern Leeward Island. Forecasters don't believe it will impact South Florida.

9/18 FPL now says South Dade residents impacted by the storm won't have power until at least tomorrow.

9/18 FPL looking to squash the rumor it will pay for food lost during the storm. FPL will not reimburse customers.

9/18 A FEMA team is on the ground in Miami Gardens at the Omega Center registering residents for potential benefits including rent vouchers, home repairs.

9/22 Representatives from FEMA are going door to door today in South Florida. The agency says it has already approved close to \$300 million dollars in aid for close to 140,000 people so far.

9/25 U.S. Northern Command continues Humanitarian Aid to Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands

9/26 A flood advisory is in effect until 8:45AM in several cities including Kendall, the Redlands, Coral Gables, Pinecrest and Country Walk. About two inches of rain has already fallen in these areas so far this morning.

9/26 The Keys are opening to tourists this Sunday, October 1<sup>st</sup>, three weeks ahead of schedule.

9/27 Clean up after Hurricane Irma continues to be a slow process. Two months is the projected amount of time it'll take to finish the job in Miami Dade.
