The following is a listing of some of the topics and interviews covered in: newscasts, public service announcements (PSAs) and in our public affairs show during the 4th quarter of 2015.

CRIME NEWSCASTS

10/5 The principal at the North Miami Adult Education Center, Jean Riodore arrested on corruption charges.

10/6 A Sunrise man, Luis Cardona convicted of raping his then-girlfriend's 6 year old daughter.

10/7 Broward Commissioners moving forward with a proposal to give police officers the leeway to ticket people busted with a small amount of marijuana instead of arresting them.

10/8 Broward Circuit Judge Lyn Rosenthal is resigning. Her resignation comes ahead of a disciplinary hearing for a DUI arrest last year.

10/9 An escaped prisoner is being processed into the federal detention center in Miami. He was captured near Bayside last night after he escaped from Homeland Security Agents.

10/12/ Miami police are investigating after a triple shooting in Liberty City, a pregnant woman and a teenaged boy among the injured.

10/14 A repo man, Serge Lossard, is in stable condition after he was in shot in NW Miami Dade: 2300 block of NW 95th Terrace.

10/19 An August trial date has been set for the former CEO of the Carlisle Group. Lloyd Boggio is facing a string of charges for his alleged role in a \$36 million dollar fraud case.

10/21 The family of a church drummer, Corey Jones asking for justice after he was shot and killed by a Palm Beach Gardens cop, Nouman Raja.

10/22 We are learning the Palm Beach Gardens cop, Nouman Raja who shot and killed Corey Jones was not in uniform and in an unmarked unit.

10/29 Once again thieves target a "Park and Ride" lot at a Tri Rail station, this time in Dania Beach. The Sheridan Street and Fort Lauderdale stations were targeted in June.

10/28 A veteran Miami Dade cop, Sergeant Emil Van Lugo has cut a deal with prosecutors. Authorities say he stole gas from a county facility on more than 55 occasions.

11/2 Two robbery suspects are in custody, caught police say after they carjacked a taxi driver in Little Havana.

12/4 A suspended South Miami police detective, Joe Mendez is scheduled to stand trial next month on child pornography charges. He allegedly convinced the cadets to expose their breasts and drink wine with him.

12/7 An investigation is underway after Miami Beach police shot and killed a man, they say was armed with a razor. He's been identified as 51 year old David Weinsett

12/22 The search is still on for the suspect who shot a Miami teen, Jamal Pieze.: NW 39th Street and 17th Avenue.

12/22 A North Miami woman, 45 year old Selena Miller charged with second degree murder for allegedly killing her husband.

12/22 BSO Deputies turning out in big numbers to support one of their own, Peter Paranza, during a hearing in a Broward courtroom. Paranza is charged with manslaughter for Jermaine McBean's death two years ago.

12/23 Former Miami Gardens police chief, Stephen Johnson pleads no contest to soliciting a prostitute.

12/31 A Miami Dade corrections officer, Sharlise Daniels-Wadley forced to resign after pleading guilty to burning an inmate, Joshua Wiggins with scalding water.

DISCRIMINATION-RACE MATTERS/NEWSCASTS

10/5 A group of South Floridians heading to D.C. this weekend to mark the 20th anniversary of the million man march.

10/14 The New York Times reporting driving while black is a problem. Reporters found police were more likely to stop Blacks for no apparent reason and more likely to use force on Black drivers.

10/19 United Teachers of Dade President Fedrick Ingram is the first African American elected to one of the top positions in the statewide teacher's union. Ingram elected Vice President of the Florida Education Association Union.

10/20/15 The Florida Senate voting to remove the Confederate flag from the Senate Seal. Separate legislation has been proposed to remove the confederate flag from all state properties and buildings.

10/21 Miami Dade Commission Chair, Jean Monestime calling for the U.S. Attorney General to investigate "Interim Healthcare" for running a discriminatory help wanted ad for a nursing position. It was specific, no Haitians need apply.

10/22 The Palm Beach State Attorney saying no to a coalition of Black state leaders asking for an independent investigation into Corey Jones' death.

10/22 United Teachers of Dade President, Fedric Ingraham just elected Vice President of the statewide teacher's union: The Florida Education Association. He's the first African American elected to one of the top posts in that union.

11/2 Hundreds of mourners packed Payne Chapel AME Church in West Palm Beach Saturday to pay their final respects to Corey Jones. The Reverend Al Sharpton delivered the eulogy. He was shot and killed by a Palm Beach Gardens cop.

11/3 The Mayor of Ocala, Florida denies allegations he is a member of the Ku Klux Klan. His name one of the early ones released by a group of hackers.

11/6 A landmark black owned Liberty City business, Rasool's celebrates its 30th anniversary.

12/7 Homestead leaders will consider a request from a developer, Wayne Rosen. He is asking for \$3.5 million dollars in Community Redevelopment money intended for blighted communities. Rosen wants to use the money to renovate Homestead's Golf and Country Club.

12/11 The Florida teachers union is suing the Florida Department of Education for discrimination. The lawsuit alleges the department's \$44 million dollar bonus program discriminates against teachers based on age and race.
