The following is a listing of some of the topics and interviews covered in Newscasts, public service announcements (PSAs) and in our public affairs show during the 1st Quarter of 2014

CRIME NEWSCASTS

1/6 Miami Beach police are searching for the suspect who shot and killed a 22 year old man at a busy gas station: 5th Street and Jefferson.

1/6 26 year old Jalil Allen arrested, charged with killing 19 year old Nicole Grier last week in Lauderhill.

1/15 Members of the Miami police expected to hold a news conference to announce a man already in custody, Terrence Jefferson, is responsible for a violent rape and robbery last month near NE 9th Avenue and 86th Street.

1/15 Miami police have identified the body found last week on 17th Street and NW 7th Avenue as that of 51 year old Laveeta Anthony. A witness says she was attacked and beaten to death by another homeless person.

1/24 Eric Rivera sentenced to 57 and a half years for killing Washington Redskins star, Sean Taylor in a 2007 burglary that went bad.

1/27 Hollywood police are investigating a possible homicide; a body found on South Federal Highway at Jefferson Street. The victim has been identified as a Canadian tourist.

2/5 North Miami Beach police are looking for the drive by shooter who opened fire on a man at NE 171st and 19th Avenue, yards away from the police department and City Hall.

2/11 Juan Carlos Chavez is expected to be executed for the 1995 murder of Jimmy Ryce at Florida State Prison in Raiford.

2/18 Spring breakers on beaches in Fort Lauderdale and Miami Beach; hundreds of them drunk and violent involved in street fights on or along the beach.

2/18 The FBI says identity theft is so bad in South Florida it's one of the area's leading priorities.

2/19 A worker on a Holland America Cruise ship accused of raping, beating and trying to throw a passenger overboard. Police say he told them he planned the attack to get even with the woman for insulting him.

2/25 A regional Superintendent for Miami Dade Schools, Dr. Alexis Martinez from the South region arrested at the scene of a domestic shooting, accused of tampering with evidence and obstruction of justice.

3/6 A Florida House Committee has approved a bill that calls for a mandatory four year prison sentence for drivers responsible for a deadly hit and run accident.

3/6 A Plantation music teacher, Daniel Gast, indicted for possession of child pornography.

3/19 A freshman at Florida Memorial University, Kameron Moore, says she's afraid to go back to school. Moore says she was beaten by five classmates, on campus, in a dorm room. She alleges the attack was in retaliation after she complained to a dorm mother one of the girls was destroying her dorm room.

3/20 Miami Dade detectives are working a triple shooting. A 17 year old girl, an innocent bystander, critically injured at Soar Park in N.W. Miami Dade.

3/21 Three suspects back a Chevy Impala into a T-Mobile store in Miami Gardens and get away with thousands of dollars worth of cell phones and tablets

3/21 The IRS is warning taxpayers about a phone scam, the biggest the agency has ever seen. Scammers call victims, demand payment by either debit card or wire transfer or else face deportation or the loss of a business or driver's license.

3/24 Christian Nunez, a bouncer at "The Elbo Room" in Fort Lauderdale has died after nearly a year and a half. He never recovered after he was shot in the stomach trying to break up a fight.

3/26 The watch is on for a verdict in a high profile DUI manslaughter trial. Mario Carreaga is accused of DUI manslaughter. Prosecutors say he was driving drunk when he struck and killed a Miami Heat dancer four years ago.

DISCRIMINATION-RACE MATTERS/NEWSCASTS

1/28 Slavery is the focus of a new video game, set in New Orleans. It’s about a young bi-racial woman who gathers intelligence, outsmarts overseers and starts slave uprisings. It’s called, “Assassin’s Creed: Liberation”.

2/5 The jury will be sequestered in Michael Dunn’s murder trial. He’s accused of killing 17 year old Jordan Davis and trying to kill three other teens. Police say he opened fire on the victims’ SUV when they wouldn’t turn down their music.

2/10 Prosecutors begin laying out their case in Michael Dun's murder trial.

2/19 A group of residents from the West Grove continuing their legal fight to keep the city of Coral Gables and a developer from building a trolley garage in their neighborhood. The lawsuit alleges city leaders and the developer intentionally mislead residents when they changed a zoning code and "secretly" signed off on the project.

2/25 In September public high schools will be getting the Oscar nominated film "12 Years a Slave", a book and a study guide. Montel Williams has coordinated the program hoping the film and the book will be used as tools to teach about the horrors of slavery.

2/25 50 years ago today in Miami Beach Muhammad Ali, then known by his Christian name, Cassius Clay won his first title bout, defeating Sonny Liston.

3/7 The Reverend Al Sharpton and Tom Joyner will join Trayvon Martin and Jordan Davis' parents in Tallahassee Monday for a rally against Florida's Stand Your Ground Law.

3/21 Department of Education Civil Rights Division finds minority students are more than three times as likely as white students to be suspended from school, have fewer opportunities to take advanced math and science classes and to be taught by teachers with less experience on the lower end of the pay scale.

3/24 The U.S. Department of Education is once again investigating the way Florida's Bright Futures Scholarships are awarded. The renewed investigation coming in the wake of revelations the scholarships are mostly awarded to white and affluent students.

1/13 Florida could take a fiscal hit if the Genting deal goes through for a casino with Vegas style slot machines at a proposed Miami hotel. The Seminoles may be able to get out of a billion dollar deal for exclusive rights.

1/17 The Miami Heat negotiating to extend its deal at the American Airlines Arena for 10 years, in exchange the Heat would reportedly make major upgrades to the arena.

1/22 Ikea plans to hire hundreds of employees at a new South Florida location. It'll be near the Dolphin Mall in Sweetwater.

1/24 National Urban League President, Marc Morial speaks in South Florida about next year's National Conference. It is expected to have an 8 million dollar economic impact on Broward County.

1/27 Fort Lauderdale is a step closer to getting a Walmart Supercenter. The retailer and developers are moving forward with plans for a location on Broward Boulevard near I-95. It's part of a development that will be known as Riverbend Marketplace.

3/12 Union representatives for Miami Dade County employees want healthcare providers, including AVMed, the insurer for county employees to lay out costs for everything to get a better handle on precisely how the money is spent.

ELECTIONS/NEWSCASTS

1/17 Governor Scott and the Republican Party raised a little over \$43 million dollars last year. Charlie Crist did not enter the race until November, but has raised \$8.6 million dollars so far.

1/28 November 4th, Florida voters will have a chance to decide if they want to legalize marijuana. Yesterday Florida's Supreme Court approved putting the issue on the ballot.

3/6 A mail-in election scheduled for Miami Gardens residents in April. City leaders are hoping they will approve a 60 million dollar general obligation bond.

3/8 Six Broward cities scheduled for elections including Lauderdale Lakes to decide if the size of its city commission should be reduced.

3/12 Democrat Alex Sink lost to Republican David Jolly in a highly watched Congressional Race. Pundits say Democrats should not panic about the mid-term elections.

3/12 Election results are in from some of the half dozen Broward cities holding elections yesterday. Residents in Lauderdale Lakes voted to downsize its commission from six members to four. In West Park voters elected Brian Johnson to fill the seat left open after the January death of a commissioner.

3/21 The Florida House and Senate have approved versions of a bill that would allow people to fire a warning shot when faced with the threat of bodily harm or worse. The vote that would make it law is scheduled for next week.

HEALTH/NEWSCASTS

1/6 Researchers finding Black women have a harder time losing weight than white women, even when they're on the same program. Scientists are looking at whether Black women may have slower metabolisms.

1/23 The Broward Health Department confirming the deaths of two people as a result of the H1N1 flu.

1/23 Doctors issuing an urgent warning about something called "Sizzurp", a mix of soda, jolly ranchers and prescription cough syrup with codeine. Experts say it is extremely easy to make and extremely addictive.

1/27 The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office has issued a health alert for anyone who may have had sex with a Greenacres police officer, Ervans Saintclair. He's facing charges, "criminal transmission of HIV". Police say he's known he's HIV positive for 7 years, but has continued to have unprotected sex.

1/27 A Royal Caribbean ship is heading back early because so many people have gotten sick. 600 people hit by an outbreak of the Norovirus.

2/5 By the end of the year CVS will no longer sell cigarettes at any of its 7,600 stores. It is the first and largest drug store chain to do so.

2/18 Researchers say the top 10 brands of football helmets may not be effective at preventing concussions.

2/25 Danish researchers cautioning pregnant women about a link between acetaminophen and Attention Deficit Disorder, what they say is a significant risk, as much as 40%.

2/25 First Lady Michelle Obama is expected to come to South Florida today. She'll speak at some parks and recreation centers about ways to get kids involved with healthy activities outside of school. The visit is part of the initiative she started four years ago, "Let's Move".

3/14 Florida supreme Court rules limits on medical malpractice awards unconstitutional

3/18 A team of Cambridge researchers say there is no definitive proof a diet that includes saturated fat, butter and cheese is a clear predictor of who will develop heart disease.

3/26 The Obama administration has extended the deadline to apply for insurance through the Affordable Care Act. Most applicants who have started the process by March 31st will have until mid-April to complete the application.
