The following is a listing of some of the topics and interviews covered in Newscasts, public service announcements (PSAs) and in our public affairs show during the third quarter of 2015

CRIME NEWSCASTS

7/8 A grand jury ruling Florida's Department of Corrections has some serious issues, but failed to indict any of the officers involved in beating a prisoner to death nearly a year ago at the Charlotte correctional Institution near Fort Myers.

7/14 Police say 23 year old Joshua Gibson accidentally shot and killed himself during a road rage incident in Cutler Bay: SW 212th Street and 103rd Court.

7/15 Miami police officer, Sabine Raymonville under investigation for appearing in sex tapes.

7/21 North Miami Beach police investigating after a teenaged boy was found dead in an alley over the weekend.

7/21 Miami Beach police making their lobby available 24/7 for Craigslist buyers and sellers to conduct transactions.

7/22 A former Miami Dade police detective, Roderick Silva sentenced to 3 years in prison for providing protection for a marijuana trafficking ring.

7/22 BSO investigating after a deputy shot and killed a 24 year old man in Oakland Park: the Floranada Apartments 1300 block of NE 50th Court.

7/23 Former Miami Dade police chief, Robert Parker found dead in his NW Miami Dade home.

7/24 A 13 year old girl shot overnight in SW Miami Dade: 115th Court and 221st Street. Police are looking for the drive by shooter.

7/27 Miami police are searching for whoever murdered 24 year old Miguel Valdes in the wee hours Sunday in the 3500 block of NW 26th Avenue.

7/21 Miami Beach police making their lobby available 24/7 for Craigslist buyers and sellers to conduct transactions.

7/28 An 80 year old Kendall man, Abner Lawton, charged with second degree murder. Police say he fatally stabbed Betty Lawton in their Kendall home, then drove to a nearby Publix and confessed.

7/29 A Key West man, Harlem Suarez accused of planning to bury a remote control bomb on the beach in Key West. The FBI says they started watching him after he posted pro Isis comments on Facebook.

7/31 The Broward Sheriff's Office is investigating after a 14 year old boy was shot to death in a Cooper City house: 10000 block of NW 41st Street. A 14 year old suspect is charged with manslaughter.

8/11 Former Broward Teacher's Union leader, Pat Santeramo is now facing federal charges; mail fraud for allegedly misappropriating more than \$35,000 dollars. He's also accused of taking kickbacks from contractors and stealing more than \$300,000 dollars in union money.

8/17 A Miami Dade man, Kit Darrant is starting a 28 year prison sentence for his mother's 2012 murder. He was 16 when prosecutors say he stabbed his mother more than 100 times then partied for a week while her body was still in the house.

8/18 A Broward Judge, Lyn Rosenthal agreed to a 90 day suspension without pay after a DUI arrest last year.

8/19 An FDLE investigation finds guns, money and files missing from the Sweetwater police department.

8/20 The Broward State Attorney convening a grand jury to find solutions to the county's synthetic drug problem.

8/24 Miami Dade County schools looking at removing out-of-school suspensions. Studies have shown the suspensions have a negative impact on a student's education and disproportionately impacts a students' education.

8/25 A 21 year old man shot and injured by Miami Dade police in NE Miami Dade, after they say he opened fire on them first.

9/1 A high ranking Opa Locka police officer, Peter Cruz, arrested in Aventura, accused of driving while drunk.

9/2 The Florida Department of Juvenile Justice investigating the Miami Dade Juvenile Detention Center after a teen involved in a fight at the facility died.

9/7 Miami Gardens police investigating an overnight shooting at a home near NW 26th Avenue and 156th Street, one person shot in the leg.

9/7 Two of the top executives at the biggest affordable housing development company in Florida expected to plead guilty of conspiring with others to steal more than \$36 million dollars in government money intended to build low income apartment projects in Miami.

9/16 The man suspected of acting out on a freaky fetish, identified and arrested. Police say a registered sex offender, Eddy Juan is the man seen on video crawling under a table in the library on the main FIU campus, smelling a woman's feet.

9/17 The 5 young people accused of killing a classmate at the Homestead Job Corps program could face the death penalty.

9/21 Miami Dade Commissioner, Jose "Pepe" Diaz arrested on DUI charges over the weekend in the Keys.

9/22 A Sunrise man, Fidel Lopez, in custody, accused in the gruesome murder of his ex girlfriend. Police say he confessed and told them he lost it when she screamed her ex husband's name while they had sex.

9/23 A new policy is in place for Miami Beach police when it comes to using Tasers. They're no longer allowed to stun suspects in the chest or those who're handcuffed.

9/29 Miami Dade police continue to investigate a shooting that shut down I-95 Southbound during yesterday's morning rush hour. A taxi driver, Junior Prosper, shot and killed by a Miami Dade cop.

9/30 Miami Dade police searching for the suspect responsible for a deadly overnight shooting: NW 103rd Street and 12th Avenue. One person killed, another injured.

9/30 A veteran South Miami police detective, Joseph Mendez is facing a string of kiddie porn charges. He's also accused of serving alcohol to minors. Mendez suspended without pay pending the results of the investigation.

DISCRIMINATION-RACE MATTERS/NEWSCASTS

7/8 The Obama administration is scheduled to announce what it is calling historic rules to deal with segregation in housing: the most pro-active rules to date. Cities and towns will be required to research and report racial bias, set goals to reduce housing segregation or risk losing billions in HUD federal funding.

7/29 Democratic Presidential hopeful, Hillary Clinton scheduled to speak on race at the National Urban League Convention, Friday in Fort Lauderdale.

7/31 Tomorrow a celebration will take place to mark the 70th anniversary of Virginia Key Beach. When it opened August 1st 1945, the then undesirable section of beach was known as the "colored beach".

8/12 A Black actor cast to play James Bond, David Oyelowo will voice Bond's character in an audio book.

The lawsuit alleges Bank of America, Wells Fargo and Citigroup steered minorities into subprime loans even when their credit was good enough for a regular loan. Wells Fargo denies the allegations.
