Locally Produced Newscasts, 6 daily, a minimum of one minute, forty five seconds

Each day WHQT airs 6 locally produced newscasts. They are a minimum of one minute and forty five seconds in duration. The newscasts often include community events and public service announcements. These newscasts air Monday through Friday between 6 and 10AM. In addition to news, weather and traffic information are provided every half hour, and more often when conditions warrant.

Locally Produced PSAs are one minute and forty five seconds.

In addition to our newscasts, WHQT also provides extensive community service through locally produced PSAs. A minimum of 3 each day air during AM drive. These local public service interviews are dedicated to continuously keeping the community aware of the various programs, services and free events available in the Miami/Fort Lauderdale market.

Locally Produced Public Affairs Program, "What's Hot?" 2 Hours WHQT produces a local two hour public affairs broadcast: "Hot Talk with Chief Jimmie Brown." It airs Sundays at 11PM.

- 1/5 Fort Lauderdale police are trying to find out who killed a 61 year old home health care nurse. 61 year old Hyacinth Tucker's body was found New Year's Day.
- 1/5 Two passengers on a Royal Caribbean cruise are accused of raping a 15 year old girl during the trip on "Allure of the Seas."
- 1/6 A Miramar High school teen, Kiana Henry, is in serious condition. She was allegedly stabbed by two classmates in a fight near the school.
- 1/6 Miami police are trying to find the suspect who murdered a young woman last night. The victim was in a car with 2 other people in the 5900 block of NE 5th Avenue.
- 1/11 This is sentencing day for suspended Deerfield Beach Commissioner Sylvia Potier her punishment for falsifying city records.
- 1/12 Suspended Deerfield Beach Commissioner Sylvia Potier sentenced to one year on probation, 200 hours of community service and a one thousand dollar fine for falsifying city records.
- 1/25 Miami Dade police investigate shooting of a man pulled from his car in a canal at NW 116th Way and West Ocheechobee. Police are trying to determine if the man was a victim of road rage. He's hospitalized in serious condition.
- 1/25 U.S. Department of Homeland Security is in Miami Dade County holding workshops on countering identity theft. The workshops are to educate law enforcement agencies and business owners about the problem.
- 1/30 Hollywood police are waiting on the Broward Medical Examiner to determined if a skull found near Douglas Road and 56th Ave. is that of a human.
- 1/31 A starving, abused 9 year old found wandering in his neighborhood in the 1400 block of NE 152nd Street is now in the custody of relatives.
- 1/31 Gov. Scott has ordered an investigation into the Sunday traffic accident on I-75 near Gainesville that killed 10 people.

- 1/31 Parent volunteer Janet Gamory, treasurer of the Parent/Teacher/Student Association at Silver Lakes Elementary School is now a criminal defendant accused of stealing more than \$32,000 from the association.
- 2/1 50 year old Natalie Evans, the owner of several halfway houses, has been sentenced to three years in a federal penitentiary for her role in a massive scheme to cheat Medicare.
- 2/3 Police shot and killed a suspect they say tried to stick up a Chevron gas station overnight at U.S. 1 and 312th Street. The clerk was not hurt. Police apparently arrived as the alleged robbery was in progress.
- 2/3 The IRS is warning people about a new scam where suspects are stealing people's identities and filing fraudulent tax returns. Statewide, sixteen people have been arrested.
- 2/7 Former Broward State Senator Mandy Dawson has cut a deal with prosecutors to plead guilty to federal income tax evasion. Dawson is asking the judge for an extra two months to work out the precise details of her plea.
- 2/9 There are still a lot of questions about why a Miami Beach police officer shot and killed a man last night at NW 6th Avenue and 75th Street in Liberty City. Police from several jurisdictions were involved in chasing the suspect, believed to be driving a stolen car. Police say when the car was pulled over the suspect got out and ran.
- 2/9 Miami police are trying to find whoever's been desecrating and robbing graves at Lincoln Park Cemetery.
- 2/9 A West Palm Beach man wanted for sex trafficking a minor was tracked by federal agents and arrested in Houston. 33 year old Rashad Clark, known as "Shag Dogg" and Mandi Bowman allegedly lured a 14 year into a life of prostitution.
- 2/9 This is Day 3 of the so-called "Rip Off Romeo's" grand theft trial in a Broward courtroom. Prosecutors say Paul Francois was wining and dining two women simultaneously. One of the alleged victims testified Francois stole nearly \$300,000 from her.
- 2/9 A Coconut Creek locksmith 50 year old Eric Welch is accused of ripping off safes he was hired to make secure.

- 2/10 A hostage standoff that lasted almost 8 hours at the Highland Woods RV Park in Deerfield Beach is over. Three people, including the suspected gunman and a 9 year old boy are dead. Two other people are hospitalized in critical condition.
- 2/10 A Miami Northwestern high school student is hospitalized after a drive-by shooting that left him critically injured. 17 year old Brandon Allen was walking home from school when the gunman opened fire at NW 10th Ave. and 62nd St.
- 2/13 A man accused of raping a new mother in Coral Springs is in custody. The victim called 911 when she heard the suspect breaking in.
- 2/14 A standoff in Pompano Beach coming to a deadly end in the 800 block of SE 22nd Ave. A BSO deputy shot and killed a suspect they say refused to put down his weapon.
- 2/14 Police have named 19 year old Gary Holmes as the suspect who raped a Coral Springs woman while her newborn was in the room.
- 2/17 Life in prison for Lavont Flanders, Jr. and Emersom Callum. The two men were convicted of luring dozens of women to South Florida with the promise of a modeling deal. They drugged the women, raped them, taped the sexual assaults and posted them as porn on the internet.
- 2/17 Convicted sex offender, 29 year old Garry Jorden, is in trouble again, accused of attacking a woman in his neighborhood: 900 block of NW 27th Avenue Washington Park.
- 2/21 Two people were shot and killed in NW Miami Dade: 7th Ave and 146th St. Homicide detectives are trying to figure out who shot them and why.
- 2/22 Broward Sheriff's Deputy Paul Pletcher will be arraigned today on a string of charges including burglary, using racial slurs and stealing a woman's cell phone during a road rage incident.
- 2/23 A SWAT team has been on site at E 53rd and East 6th Ave since 2AM A man is reportedly holed up in a house there.

- 2/27 A driver is behind bars after a fatal hit and run accident that claimed the life of a grandmother. The 75 year old woman was struck and killed while crossing the street.
- 2/27 Police are investigating a shooting at a South Florida barber shop, "Mega Cruz". The gunman was killed and his alleged victim injured.
- 2/27 Police have arrested a man who allegedly robbed two South Florida banks. 49 year old Richard Bystricky faces federal charges for holdups at a TD Bank in Boca Raton and a Bank of America in Fort Lauderdale.
- 2/29 Palm Beach County Commissioners agreed yesterday to work on an action plan to help improve housing, lure jobs, and reduce crime in the Glades region where unemployment rates are as high as 44-percent.
- 3/2 Miami Dade police are searching for whoever shot and killed one man and critically injured another in a drive-by shooting in broad daylight in Northwest Miami Dade: NW 22nd Ave and 108th Street. Call Crimestoppers.
- 3/2 A lieutenant in the Palm Beach Sheriff's Internal Affairs Unit is facing corruption charges. 53 year old Dean Johnson is accused of witness tampering, and confidential information to the media.
- 3/2 A former assistant park superintendent in Miramar, Eric Berry, is free on bond. He's facing a string of corruption charges: accused of fixing bids for private contractors trying to get city contracts.
- 3/2 The so-called 'sweetheart swindler' Paul Francois is sentenced to 10 years in prison for grand theft and organized fraud. He's been ordered to pay the victims back.
- 3/6 Owners of Coach, the luxury designer handbag line, are suing the SWAP Shop and its landlord Preston Henn in federal court for allegedly selling fake Coach designer bags.
- 3/6 Six South Floridians are accused of cheating banks and investors out of nearly 6 million dollars through a mortgage fraud scheme.

- 3/8 Miami Dade police say they were forced to shoot and kill a suspected drug dealer because he started shooting at them while they were trying to serve a search warrant in the 6900 block of Bottle Rush Drive in Miami Lakes.
- 3/8 A suspected drug dealer is dead, shot and killed by police in Miami Lakes.
- 3/12 A 10 year old boy hit by a stray bullet Saturday night in Homestead was blessed and really lucky he was out of the hospital a day later and playing with friends. The suspected shooter is in custody.
- 3/12 There are a lot of questions about the shooting death of a Miami Gardens teen at the hands of a neighborhood watch captain in an Orlando neighborhood. Trayyvon Martin was not armed.
- 3/12 Bond set at a million dollars for a Hallandale Beach man facing hundreds of kiddie porn charges. 26 year old Kenwood Deveaux lives across the street from a park where children play. He's in the country illegally from the Bahamas.
