Daily: Six locally produced newscasts, a minimum of one minute, forty five seconds

Each day WHQT airs 6 locally produced newscasts. They are a minimum of one minute and forty five seconds in duration. The newscasts often include community events and public service announcements. They air Monday through Friday between 6 and 10AM. In addition to news, weather and traffic information are provided every half hour, and more often when conditions warrant.

Daily: Locally produced PSA's are one minute and forty five seconds.

In addition to our newscasts, WHQT also provides extensive community service through locally produced PSAs. A minimum of 3 air each day during AM drive. These local public service interviews are dedicated to continuously keeping the community aware of the various programs, services and free events available in the Miami/Fort Lauderdale market.

Weekly: Locally Produced Public Affairs Program, "What's Hot?" 2 Hours WHQT produces a local two hour public affairs broadcast: "Hot Talk with Chief Jimmie Brown." It airs Sundays at 11PM.

CRIME/NEWSCASTS

- 4/1 Lauderhill police will hold a news conference on progress of the "death investigation" of a woman found dead in a town home at the 2400 block of NW 55th Terrace.
- 4/2 Miami police investigate the death of 4 year old Raquel Carr who was shot and killed Easter Sunday while in a car crowded with children outside her grandparents' home at 120th Street and 20th Avenue.
- 4/2 Lawyers representing an elderly woman who was dragged off a Metro rail train will hold a news conference to discuss the lawsuit they're filing on her behalf. 82 year old Emma Anderson was singing hymns when a security guard dragged her off the train at the Brickell station.
- 4/2 Darius, Johnson, the boyfriend of 20 year old Monica Gooden, is in Broward County Jail facing murder and burglary charges. Johnson told police he 'sacrificed' Gooden, stabbed her to death and fought her 'like a dragon' because he needed to kill someone born under the Taurus zodiac sign. Gooden was born in November.
- 4/3 Investigators return to the scene of a deadly helicopter crash in Kendall where the propeller and other pieces of the chopper are still on the ground at SW 122nd Avenue and 130th Street. The aircraft crashed just after taking off from Tamiami Airport.
- 4/3 Police have learnedthe true identity of the driver responsible for allegedly driving north in the southbound lanes of I-95 and slamming his SUV into a mini-van killing four family members. Willie Dumel's real name is Paoula La-France.
- 4/3 A Miami Dade judge rules the majority of evidence surrounding a deadly police involved shooting during Urban Beach Week two years ago will remain secret until a criminal investigation is complete. Twelve police shot at a motorist, Raymond Herrise, 118 times. He was killed, 3 bystanders on Collins Avenue were injured.
- 4/5 Miami police have set up a perimeter surrounding the 2300 block of NW 8th Avenue. They're searching for up to 5 people suspected of breaking into a motorcycle repair shop and warehouse.

4/5 Miami Beach police are trying to figure out if the burglary at the home of Miami Heat star Chris Bosh 's home was an inside job. Two babysitters and a 13 year old were reportedly home while burglars ransacked the player's closet.

4/8 Florida Keys Deputy Jamie Miranda is now an accused felon. Police say he was in uniform when he bought oxycodone from a police informant Saturday night.

4/9 Miami police say officers were justified in using force to protect a crime scene at NW 3rd Avenue and 22nd Street in Overtown. A murder victim's relative trying to get to the body ran past crime scene tape and a detective knocked him out with a left hook.

4/10 The Tampa couple who kidnapped their 2 young sons and sailed to Cuba arrived back in the US overnight. The Cuban government allowed the feds to bring Joshua and Sharon Haaken back to the States where the boys' grandparents have legal custody.

4/10 The man who scuffled with police at a homicide scene bonded out of jail overnight. Anthony Walker told a judge he needed to be home with his mother because he brother was just murdered. Walker is charged with battery on a police officer and battery with violence.

4/10 A Delray Beach woman, 34 year old Shantel Jackson is free on bond. She's charged with fraud for allegedly using fake pay stubs to take more than 20-thousand dollars' worth of benefits for unemployment and daycare.

4/10 The Broward School bus driver who admitted to wrongdoing will be back on the job after serving a 10 day suspension. Rosanna Lucas formally apologized to the school board yesterday for lying about why she was talking on a cell phone while driving.

4/10 The South Dade nursing home resident accused of killing his 73 year old roommate will appear before a judge to answer murder charges. Police say 41 year old Michael Pool first told them Robert Vesser fell out of his bed, then admitted to beating Vesser to death.

4/11 Miami Dade officers say they were forced to open fire when a man drove through crime scene tape and hit several police cars during a robbery investigation at the 5300 block of 115th Avenue. Unknown if he was hit – two people were dropped off at Kendall Regional Medical Center with gunshot wounds; one died,

- one into surgery overnight not related to police involved shooting but possibly from original robbery.
- 4/12 George Zimmerman's attorneys want a judge to reveal the details of the settlement Trayvon Martin's parents received from the homeowners association in the Sanford community where their son was killed last year. His lawyers say the financial details because it could impact Martin's parents' testimony.
- 4/15 One person killed, two others injured at NW 157th Street and 29th Avenue in Miami Gardens. The violence was reportedly the result of a fight among friends.
- 4/15 Two robbery suspects will make their appearance in a Miami federal courtroom. 38 year old Garrick Hicks and Alfred Walker allegedly dressed in scrubs and robbed the credit union at Mercy Hospital. Police are still looking for third suspect Tavarius Rakeem Smith.
- 4/16 Twenty-five year old Lindsay Graves is charged with murder and aggravated battery in story HOT 105 first told you about yesterday in breaking news. Police say Graves was in a car with James Nelson and two others when they started arguing and Graves turned violent, shooting and killing Nelson and stabbing a second person.
- 4/17 South Miami Dade County investigators are hoping to find out more about a fiery attack on a homeless woman who is in critical condition at Kendall Regional Medical Center. First responders initially thought it was a brush fire at South Dixie Highway and 214th Street it turned out to be the woman on fire.
- 4/19 A former Miami Dade cop is sentenced to two and a half years in a federal prison. Prabhainjana Dwivedi is convicted of criminal behavior pulling women over just so he could talk dirty to them.
- 4/19 Police say they have the man who's been stealing copper wiring from light poles. Troopers say they caught 54 year old Lee Andrew Howard red-handed near I-95 and Stirling Road with wire cutters and wire in his hands.
- 4/19 A Boynton Beach woman is arrested for leaving the scene of a deadly accident she caused late last month. Joseph D'Errico was killed. 31 year old Susan LaRocca turned herself in late yesterday.

- 4/20 George Zimmerman will be back in front of a judge today for what could be a critical pre-trial hearing. Zimmerman who's charged with killing Trayvon Martin may have to decide if he is giving up his right to a so-called "stand your ground" hearing.
- 4/20 A father, Anthony Milhomme, charged with child neglect after his children are carjacked and robbed. He and the suspect Verdin Verdeer are both in the Miami Dade County Jail. Verdeer faces a string of charges including kidnapping and robbery for allegedly taking five dollars from one of the children.
- 4/23 Former Broward County Commissioner Diana Wasserman-Rubin is fighting to keep her nearly \$5,000 per month county pension. Her lawyer believes it'll be easier now that she's beat charges that could have put her in prison for 30 years.
- 4/23 Surveillance cameras could soon be coming to Sistrunk Boulevard. Fort Lauderdale Commissioner Bobby DuBose suggested the cameras and using "Community Redevelopment Money" to pay for them.
- 4/23 A Miami Gardens man who used to work security at Calder Race track is sentenced to 30 years in prison for his role in the 2011 murder of a Brinks guard at Calder. Confessed triggerman 26 year old Vladimir Louissant was sentenced to life in prison earlier this year.
- 4/24 Grief counselors will be available for students and staff today after a deadly accident at Our Lady of Lords Catholic Parish and School in West Kendall. Police say a 73 year old driver lost control of her SUV and pinned 27 year old Catalina Parias against a building killing her instantly.
- 4/24 Two 14 year old boys, students at Feinberg Fisher School on Miami Beach, are hospitalized after overdosing on "Molly" what's believed to be a popular form of the drug "Ecstasy." The boys got sick right before school dismissed complaining of rapid heartbeats.
- 4/25 The Palm Beach multi-millionaire free on house arrest after he was convicted of DUI manslaughter is pushing for a new trial. John Goodman's lawyers allege one of the jurors lied to get on the panel.

- 4/25 The Broward Medical Examiner is in possession of pieces of a human skull and teeth confiscated from two women yesterday at Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International Airport. The women were traveling from Cuba to Baltimore and claimed they didn't realize there were human remains in the pottery they bought.
- 4/29 This is sentencing day for Willie Barney, the 19 year old convicted of robbing and trying to kill a Miami Dade police officer. Officer Wislyn Joseph survived despite being shot in the chest at point blank range.
- 5/1 Miramar police say they were forced to shoot and kill a carjacking suspect. Investigators are at 1400 block of SW 97th Avenue where the victims were allegedly carjacked and at SW 21st Street near Mirabella Apartments where it came to an end.
- 5/1 Police have released the name of a Pompano Beach man who shot a potential would-be burglar or robber. 29 year old Nathan Man was left shaken after he arrived home, found the man and shot him. The suspect died on the scene.
- 5/1 A robber posing as a senior citizen, was actually casing a building in the 300 block of Madera Street. The repeat offender stole \$10,000 worth of jewelry, clothes and luggage from seven apartments in one building.
- 5/1 George Zimmerman back in a Sanford court for a pretrial hearing. He is charged with second degree murder in Trayvon Martin's death.
- 5/1 People evacuated from parts of downtown Miami after a suspicious package was found in the Stephen P. Clark Government Center. Even Metro Rail stopped as bomb squad moved in to detonate the package. Miami Dade police say there were no explosives in the book case.
- 5/2 Another Miami Heat star was the victim of burglars. Broward Sheriff's Office says the master bedroom in Udonis Haslem's house in Southwest Ranches was ransacked. Someone apparently got in through the garage door and tried to pry open a safe inside a closet.
- 5/6 In North Miami, a man shot and killed at a baby shower at the Gwen Margolis Community Center on NE 123rd Street near 16th Avenue. Homicide detectives are trying to figure out if the victim and the shooter knew each other.

- 5/6 A May 13th trial date has been set for the first former FAMU band member to stand trial in the hazing death of drum major Robert Champion. Defendant Rikki Willis, also a drum major, refused a plea deal.
- 5/8 Broward County Commissioners looking at a measure to make it illegal for anyone to breed, transport, train or sell or own dogs or any other animal specifically for the purpose of fighting. A public hearing scheduled for June 11th.
- 5/8 A Fort Lauderdale man is in jail accused of punching his 89 year old mother in the face. 52 year old James Jackson and his legally blind mother Idella Boyd were reportedly arguing about one of his friends when police say he turned violent in her NE 14th Avenue apartment.
- 5/8 A North Miami Beach Senior High student received a letter from the IRS saying someone may have stolen his identity. His parents were notified of a serious breach when student attendance cards were taken from the office.
- 5/10 Opa Locka police are trying to figure out who nearly beat a 76 year old man to death and why. Armando Hernandez' relatives found him hog tied and beaten beyond recognition in his auto repair shot in the 200 block of Ali Baba Avenue.
- 5/10 A Fort Lauderdale man arrested a second time on child pornography charges after police were alerted by a task force tracking people watching kiddie porn on the Internet. A police search of 59 year old Frank Hottentrott's home turned up discs with more than 100 pictures and 30 videos of child molestation.
- 5/13 Jury selection was supposed to start today in the manslaughter trial of former FAMU student and band member Riccki Willis. At the 11th hour Friday, Willis agreed to plead no contest and testify against the 11 other suspects charged in Robert Champion's death.
- 5/13 Miami police are looking for three suspects who shot and nearly killed a man after he gave them the gold chain they demanded. The victim, in his 50's, is in critical condition at Jackson Memorial Hospital.
- 5/13 A Miami police officer is recovering after he was forced to fight a burglary suspect to take him down in Little Haiti at NW 3rd Avenue and 69th Street. Shepard Campbell is charged with five counts of burglary and 7 counts of grand theft.

- 5/14 The Miami Beach father accused of tying his son to a pole has bonded out of jail. 49 year old Adopho Gusman is charged with aggravated child abuse for allegedly leaving the 12 year old tied up for hours.
- 5/14 A hearing set today in the case of a South Florida father accused of an extreme punishment against his son will find out where the young boy will stay. A judge ruled that 49 year old Adolpho Gusman cannot have contact with the 12 year old he tied to a cement laundry pole.
- 5/17 We are following breaking news out of West Park...a hit and run accident in the 2600 block of N. State Road 7. A pedestrian struck and injured.
- 5/17 Thirty-three more people including physicians and owners of chiropractic clinics are facing criminal charges accused of staging car accidents and submitting bogus insurance claims.
- 5/17 Former Hialeah Mayor Julio Robaina and his wife are facing federal criminal charges and they're expected to turn themselves in today. They're accused of tax evasion.
- 5/20 A missing Miami Gardens baby, a 10 month old girl found safe. Her father, 42 year old Dexter Jones, arrested accused of violating a court order and taking his daughter.
- 5/20 Miami police investigating a shooting overnight at a bar and restaurant in Little Havana SW 22^{nd} Avenue and First Street. The owner and two customers exchanged words and gunfire after one of the customers allegedly pulled a gun.
- 5/20 North Miami police are searching for the two suspects who robbed, shot and beat an ATM repairman so badly he may never walk again. Juan Canales was attacked in front of his North Miami condo earlier this month.
- 5/20 The Broward Sheriff's Office is still investigating a deadly bus accident Saturday at Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International Airport.

- 5/21 Two Broward women accused of running a scam on Haitian immigrants pay 35-hundred up front, get to the US have a work visa and a job waiting. Marie Dorval sentenced to two years after admitting she was guilty. Jetta McPhee is pleading not guilty to fraud charges.
- 5/21 George Zimmerman's father says his son is the victim of malicious prosecution. Robert Zimmerman making the comment after a state expert said Trayvon Martin is the voice calling for help heard in the background of a 911 tape.
- 5/23 The former CEO of a non-profit Liberty City Veterans group, Charles Leon Cutler, sentenced to 85 days in jail for stealing grant money intended to help military veterans.
- 5/23 South Miami is in trouble with the feds, accused of cheating investors, allegedly not telling them they weren't exactly getting the tax free bond deal they thought. Furthermore, the Securities and Exchange Commission alleges South Miami's officials skirted other rules.
- 5/23 Hialeah homicide detectives are about 5 hours into a murder investigation: one person dead, another taken into custody. It's believed the deadly violence may have been the result of a landlord tenant dispute at West 57th Street and 10th Avenue.
- 5/29 George Zimmerman's second degree murder trial is set to start as scheduled. Jury selection expected to get underway June 10th. Yesterday the judge denied defense attorneys' attempts to get a delay.
- 5/30 The family of a man shot and killed by Miami Beach cops during Urban Beach week two years ago now want the U.S. Justice Department to get involved. Raymond Herisse; family and their lawyers will hold a news conference at 10am.
- 5/31 Miami Beach police chief says he will make recordings of police transmissions available to the lawyers of the victims shot by police during Urban Beach week two years ago.
- 5/31 Two Miami women, 35 year old Sonia Brown and 23 year old Chloe McQueen, busted at Joe's Crab Shack in Lauderhill: accused of extortion by threatening to sell secret information about a reality tv producer's company.

- 5/31George Zimmerman's attorneys are asking for a six week delay. Defense lawyers are accusing the prosecution of hiding evidence.
- 5/31 The judge in George Zimmerman's second degree murder trial wants four alternate jurors. There are normally two. Jury selection gets started June 10^{th} .
- 5/31 An about face for Miami Beach police. The chief says he will make recordings available to the lawyers for the victims shot by Miami Beach and Hialeah cops during Urban Beach Week two years ago.
- 6/3 Broward Sheriff's homicide detectives are searching for the suspects responsible for a double shooting in the 300 block of NW 40th Court in Oakland Park. Kenny Sewell was killed; his girlfriend was injured.
- 6/11 An armed robbery suspect, hospitalized in critical condition, shot by a Miami Dade police officer. Police say after a short chase, the bad guy jumped out of white Nissan Maxima at NW 58th Street and 15th Avenue and confronted the officer.
- 6/11 In Sanford, Florida, it is expected to take weeks to whittle 500 potential jurors down to six and four alternates who'll decide whether George Zimmerman murdered Trayvon Martin or shot and killed the teen in self-defense. This is day two of jury selection.
- 6/11 Hollywood police are actively searching for two people after a deadly shooting. They're looking for two people, a man and a woman; they say ran from the scene near North Dixie Highway and Coolidge Street about 10 o'clock last night.
- 6/12 We're learning the identity of the man shot and killed in Hollywood Monday night: 25 year old Duran Rivera. Police are still looking for a man and a woman witnesses say ran from the scene.
- 6/13 Fort Lauderdale police are questioning a woman who allegedly struck and killed two people. Witnesses say the woman was turning off Broward Boulevard onto SW 5th Avenue when she struck a homeless man and kept going with the victim stuck under her Porsche.

6/14 Miami Dade police are looking for two thugs who beat and robbed a 91 year old woman and her 63 year old daughter yesterday in their Southwest Miami Dade home. Police say the bad guys posed as deliverymen and forced their way inside.

6/17 The 8 year old girl caught in the crossfire of a drive by shooting is waking up at Jackson Memorial Hospital. She's in stable condition. Police say a man shot in the arm may have been the target but he is not cooperating.

4/15 "42", the movie about Brooklyn Dodger Jackie Robinson who integrated major league baseball more than 60 years ago, coming in number one at the box office this weekend. Last week, baseball commissioner Bud Selig created a task force to look at ways to reverse the trend of a dramatic decrease in the numbers of blacks playing the sport.

4/25 A major victory for Brian Beckman, the Miami Dade Fire Captain demoted after posting what was described as a racist rant on Facebook in the wake of Trayvon Martin's murder. An arbitrator ruled Beckman's rank should be restored and he should get back pay and benefits dating back to his demotion date.

- 4/26 Florida's requirement to take a math and reading test to get unemployment benefits violates civil rights laws. That's the ruling from the U.S. Labor Department.
- 6/6 A Spirit Airlines passenger was arrested when the plane landed on a trip from Baltimore to Fort Lauderdale. Deputies say 40 year old Heather Dykman started running up and down the aisle, cursing and screaming racial slurs after flight attendants refused to serve her any more liquor.
- 6/17 George Zimmerman's father, Robert Zimmerman, is out with a new book. "Florida Versus Zimmerman." In it, among other things, he writes the NBA and the NAACP are the true racists.
- 6/17 Congresswoman Fredericka Wilson is asking the U.S. Justice Department for the results of its investigation into a series of deadly police involved shootings two and a half years ago. Miami police shot and killed seven black men between July of 2010 and February of 2011.
- 6/18 During a pre-trial hearing last week, George Zimmerman's attorneys won a key issue a decision that will keep the prosecutor from mentioning racial profiling, profiling or any variation of the word.

ECONOMY/NEWSCASTS

- 4/8 A new report showing 99 percent of more than a Billion dollars raised to help Haiti after the 2010 earthquake went to companies in the US most of them in the D.C. area.
- 4/11 Florida is number one on the list of states with the most foreclosures in the country. Miami also tops on the list of the most foreclosures of any large city in the nation in the first quarter, more than three times the national average.
- 4/17 American Airlines is apologizing to passengers and promising travel on the carrier will be a lot easier today, although there will still be some delays. Problems with its reservation system yesterday essentially grounded hundreds of flights and stranded thousands of passengers.
- 4/24 Florida lawmakers now have a second bill and an amended bill to consider in the debate of using tax dollars to help pay for renovations to Sun Life Stadium. The legislation needs to be in Governor Scott's hands today in order to go forward with a May 14th vote that will give voters the final say.
- 4/29 Early voting begins today. Miami Dade voters will begin deciding whether millions from what's essentially a tax on tourists should be used to pay for renovations to Sun Life Stadium.
- 4/29 Lawmakers came to a \$74 billion budget deal Sunday night concluding negotiations that included pay raises for state workers and teachers along with increased money for higher education.
- 5/1 Florida teachers could get a pay raise sooner than June of 2014. The House Senate and Senate president have announced they've passed a separate bill that will allow school districts to begin paying \$480 million earmarked for raises.

6/11 President Barack Obama will be in South Florida tomorrow night. He'll be on Miami Beach for a Democratic fundraiser—we're giving you a heads up because traffic will be impacted.

6/19 Kevin Burns, the former mayor of North Miami, has filed an action in Miami Dade circuit court seeking to have newly-elected North Miami Mayor Lucie Tondreau removed from office. The 62 page filing details misrepresentations in the filing papers and her failure to reside in North Miami for the legally-required minimum of year.

- 4/2 A high of 84 degrees predicted plus a fog advisory in effect until 9am. Fog and a brush fire causing major problems in western Broward where visibility is reduced to fifty feet. I-75 is affected and US 72 is closed northbound into Southern Boulevard in Palm Beach County.
