The following is a listing of some of the topics and interviews covered in: newscasts, public service announcements (PSAs) and in our public affairs show during the 1st quarter of 2016.

CRIME NEWSCASTS

1/30 Esteban Santiago is expected back in a federal court this morning for a federal hearing. He's accused of killing five people earlier this month at Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International Airport.

1/30 Homicide detectives are 48 hours into a double murder case in North Lauderdale and they still have no suspects and no motive. 15 year old Jada Allen and her mother, Temoco Williams were found shot to death Saturday morning.

1/31 Bond denied for 18 year old Gerrell Brownell, one of the 2 suspects arrested for the shootout that left 8 people injured in Northwest Miami Dade at Martin Luther King Park, on the King Holiday. 8 people were injured, including an 11 year old.

2/2 Davie police are looking for the hit and run driver who struck and killed a woman and her dog and injured a second woman. It happened about 7o'clock at SW 18th Street and 86th Street.

2.2 The Florida Supreme Court giving a death row inmate (Gerard Hoyan/Waffle House Triple Murder) a chance at a new sentencing hearing because of constitutional issues with the way he was sentenced for the 2002 murder. Florida now requires a unanimous jury decision for the death penalty.

2/3 The suspect in custody and accused of killing 15 year old Castillo Logan in NW Miami Dade is just 17. Christopher Stewart is charged with second degree murder. Police are trying to figure out a motive.

2/3 Drummer Corey Jones would have turned 33 today. His family and their attorney are remembering him today at Kravis Center in downtown West Palm Beach. Nouman Raja is charged with manslaughter for Jones' death. His trial could get underway this summer.

2/7 No criminal charges are expected to be filed against the three students police say tweeted threats to shoot up Driftwood Middle School in Hollywood.

2/7 A group of Florida lawmakers introducing a bill to change the state's law against texting and driving.

2/14 Two Broward men, Andre Wallace and Robert Barnett arrested of accused of pimping a 17 year old girl.

2/15 Sunrise police say Kevin Nelson may have waited 48 hours before calling 911 to alert authorities he shot and killed Karen Lyle and her 15 year old daughter, Shanice Smith.

2/15 Miami Beach police are investigating a double shooting at Collins Avenue between 71st and 72nd.

2/15 Four students are in trouble after police found a gun in the trunk of car in a student parking lot at Norland High. The school was on lock down while police searched for the weapon. They learned about it as a result of a tip from another student.

2/16 Miami police are still looking for two armed robbers they say bailed out of a car and took off on foot in El Portal near NW 2nd Court and 93rd Street.

2/16 The Republican led U.S. Senate making a move on gun control, changing a rule, making it easier for mentally ill people to get guns. The majority of the Senate felt the rule was unfair, that it stigmatized people with disabilities.

2/16 Double murder suspect, Markeith Lloyd officially charged with the murder of his pregnant ex-girlfriend and an Orlando officer, Debra Clayton, who was trying to arrest him.

2/16 Florida lawmakers fast tracking a measure that would require a unanimous jury decision to hand down the death penalty.

2/17 A murder suspect, Trace Walker, arrested for allegedly killing a man in broad daylight in front of a Lauderhill Fish Market: 1800 block of NW 38th Avenue.

2/20 It is one day to the year since six year old King Carter was killed, caught in the crossfire of a shootout. Three suspects are in custody

2/23 A Miami gym, "Iron Addicts" is shut down indefinitely. One of the owners, Richard Rodriguez and his wife are among 10 people arrested when the DEA raided the gym yesterday. They're accused of running a multi-million dollar steroid ring in the gym.

3/6 When Florida lawmakers convene tomorrow they're expected to look at a proposed change to the state's Stand Your Ground Law. It would make it even easier for a defendant to avoid trial. The change shifts the burden of proof to the prosecution.

3/7 No criminal charges are expected to be filed against the three students police say tweeted threats to shoot up Driftwood Middle School in Hollywood. Police say the three are students at Driftwood.

3/9 The construction worker charged with murdering a co-worker will be in court this morning in a Broward courtroom. Jonathan Schuler is accused of splitting Arcenio Alvarez' head open with a crowbar.

3/10 Four executives and one of their associates accused of stealing millions of dollars in government money for affordable housing in Miami have cut a deal with federal prosecutors: Louis Wolfson III, Michael Wohl, David Deutch, Mitchell Friedman and Felix Braverman will not be prosecuted and there is no chance they'll spend a day in prison for allegedly stealing close to four million dollars. Prosecutors alleged their construction company, DAXC inflated the cost of building four low income housing projects and

pocketed the extra. The criminal case will be dismissed under a deferred prosecution agreement. The executives will repay nearly four million dollars and a million dollar fine.

3/17 A Miami federal judge giving a babysitter, Jason Barber 60 years in prison for taking pictures of himself sexually abusing a toddler.

3/17 After an investigation that's taken almost five years we're expected to find out today if Miami Dade State Attorney Katherine Fernandez Rundle will file criminal charges against the corrections officers who forced a mentally ill inmate into a scalding hot shower at the Dade Correctional Institution and left him there for two hours. Darren Rainey did not survive.

3/21 Miami homicide detectives investigating an overnight shooting at NW 7th Avenue and 14th Street.

3/22 Miami Dade homicide detectives investigating after a tourist in town for "Jazz in the Gardens" was found dead in a Doral hotel, the "Courtyard Miami Airport West, near NW 79th Street and the Palmetto.

3/27 A task force is scheduled to meet at the Stephen P. Clark Center today. They'll look at ways to fight the opioid epidemic; talking about the dangers and how police can help affected communities.

3/31 Mothers who've lost loved ones to gun violence say they want police to give their cases the same amount of attention given to the search to catch the suspect who shot and injured two undercover Miami Dade police officers.

DISCRIMINATION-RACE MATTERS/NEWSCASTS

2/1 The biggest civil rights groups for Muslims in Florida is suing President Donald Trump and his administration for the executive order he issued that temporarily bans immigrants from seven predominately Muslim countries.

2/2 The biggest Muslim civil rights group in Florida, the Council On American Islamic Relations is suing President Donald Trump and his administration for the executive order he issued, banning immigrants from seven predominately Muslim countries.

2/6 The NCAA has agreed to pay close to \$209 million dollars to settle a class action lawsuit brought by college athletes. Thousands received sports scholarships rather than the new scholarships that cover the entire cost of going to school. The lawsuit must still be approved by a federal judge.

2/9 Rapper, Jason Derulo is accusing American Airlines and Miami Dade police of discrimination after he was thrown off a flight from MIA to Los Angeles.

2/13 Demonstrators are protesting against Miami Dade Mayor, Carlos Gimenez' decision to go along with the President's executive order to hold immigrants wanted by ICE or lose federal funding.

2/15 There are two weeks left to see "Visions of Our 44th President, Barack Obama. It features life sized busts of the President created by 44 contemporary African American Artists from all over the country. The last day is February 28th.

2/17 This morning Miami Dade Commissioners will hold a special meeting on the county's stance on sanctuary for immigrants.

2/20 President Donald Trump is working on a new proposal that would crack down even harder on immigrants. It would allow federal authorities to deport more immigrants immediately

2/20 Friday the majority of Miami Dade Commissioners voted to stand with Trump and Mayor, Carlos Gimenez. They voted in favor of the executive order already in effect. It allows authorities to detain immigrants wanted by ICE.

2/21 Later this week President Trump is expected to roll out his new Executive order on immigration. Among other things it would allow federal agents to immediately return immigrants coming from and through Mexico.

2/21 Uber's CEO has hired former Attorney General, Eric Holder to investigate allegations of discrimination and sexism at the ride sharing service. After repeated requests the CEO now says it will release a diversity report.

2/22 For the first time Wells Fargo has fired executives who played a role in a major scandal, two million accounts opened without customers knowledge.

3/2 Donald Trump's immigration crackdown is at the center of a hearing today. James LaCroix would probably have been released yesterday, but for the new ban. The outcome of his hearing could affect other cases on a federal level.

3/7 The Broward School Board passes resolution declaring schools, safe haven and mandates schools work with parents to create a "Safe Plan" that would protect them in case they or loved ones are targeted for deportation.

3/8 Muhammad Ali Junior and Ali's former wife, Khalilah Ali are launching a religious freedom campaign. They're going to D.C. tomorrow to talk with lawmakers after Ali, Junior was detained for hours at Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International airport. They were returning from a Black History Month celebration in Jamaica.

3/10 The ACLU is launching a grassroots platform, "People Power" Events are taking place in all 50 states to watch the livestream of the resistance training. Organizers will also put local plans in place. Resistance Training: An ACLU Town Hall Meeting is happening at the University of Miami, Watsco Center

3/10 The first National Park to honor an African American woman is now officially open, “The Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad Visitor’s Center. The 22 million dollar project is located on 17 acres in eastern Maryland. President Obama named the site a national monument in 2013.

3/15 Writer, director Jordan Peele now has a place in history; the first black writer/director with a \$100 million dollar movie debut. It cost about \$4.5 million dollars to make “Get Out”. It’s a spoof on an interracial relationship.

3/17 Governor Rick Scott doing something highly unusual, removing a State Attorney from a case. Scott is replacing Aramis Ayala with a special prosecutor after she chose not to seek the death penalty for Markeith Lloyd. He’s accused of killing an Orlando police officer and his ex-girlfriend.

3/22 Grammy winning artist, Wyclef Jean says he was a victim of racial profiling by Los Angeles PD, that cops pulled guns on him, cuffed him, threw him in the back of a police unit and never told him why he was being detained.

3/22 The Black female State Attorney Governor Rick Scott removed from office, Aramis Ayala is fighting Scott’s decision, in court. Critics say his decision is politically motivated.

3/22 The shooting deaths of Black men at the hands of police the focus of a new tv series. It’s titled “Shots Fired” and the first episode airs tonight at 8 on Fox.

ECONOMY/NEWSCASTS

2/8 FPL getting the okay from Florida regulators for another rate hike – almost \$319 million dollars to recover the cost of damage after Hurricane Matthew and to replenish its reserves. It’ll cost the average customer about \$3.50 a month.

2/9 The aviation community in Palm Beach County says Presidential visits to Mar-a-Lago are costing them a lot of money, \$250,000 last weekend alone in everything from lost fuel sales to cancelled sight seeing trips.

3/9 The world’s largest cruise ship, the new Royal Caribbean “Symphony of the Seas” will start sailing from Port Miami, in November of 18. Its arrival will coincide with the opening of the newly expanded Port Miami. It’s expected to generate an average of \$7 to \$8 million dollars a year in rent.

3/9 Miami is the worst place in the country to rent an apartment. That’s according to Forbes Magazine. Miami ranked worst because of low inventory, lack of affordable housing and new construction focused on luxury building.

3/9 The world’s largest cruise ship, the “Royal Caribbean “Symphony of the Seas” will start sailing from Port Miami in November 2018. Its arrival will coincide with the opening of the newly expanded port. It’s expected to generate an average of \$7 to 8 million dollars a year in rent and create thousands of jobs.

HEALTH/ NEWSCASTS

1/31 The Florida Department of Health is urging all Floridians to get flu shots. The CDC warning Americans influenza is at epidemic levels. It is being blamed for the death of 3 infants in Mississippi.

1/31 This is the last day to sign up for Obamacare. The future of the Affordable Care Act is unclear, but experts say you should sign up. Today is the deadline, but there are some special enrollment periods after the deadline that will allow people to make changes to their coverage.

2/8 PF Chang's in Boca Raton is back open. The restaurant on Glades Road was forced to close after health inspectors found a long list of violations: 22 high priority including cleanliness and live roaches.

2/13 Ford has settled a nationwide class action lawsuit with hundreds of owners of Ford Explorers. The suit alleged carbon monoxide was getting into their SUVs through an AC vent. The lawsuit also alleged Ford has known about the problem since 2012. The settlement includes potentially having Ford buy your vehicle back.

2/17 Millions of strollers are being recalled: Britax recalling 700-thousand strollers after getting reports a component can suddenly disengage and the baby can fall out. They were sold online and in stores.

3/6 In Kendall, a rabies alert has been expanded to include a larger area after a second raccoon tested positive. The boundaries are now between SW 72nd Avenue and 128th Street to 87th Avenue and the Turnpike.

3/13 Basketball legend, Magic Johnson is in Tallahassee today, meeting with lawmakers. He is urging them to make sure the state's Medicaid program includes coverage for HIV and AIDS treatment. Johnson represents "Anthem, a medical company operating in Florida.

3/14 The American Heart Association says taking Omega-Fish oil supplements after a heart attack could help keep patients alive and prevent future trips to the hospital. The AHA says there is no proof the supplements provide benefits for the general population

3/14 A renewed call for safety after the death of a 4-year old Pennsylvania girl. She was killed in a house fire started when the battery in a hoverboard overheated. Half a million hoverboards made by 10 companies are being recalled.
